**21) Walter M BEDFORD** – Born 24 Feb 1879 in Royston, Barnsley  
Died 28 July 1939 in Balby, Doncaster, aged 60.

First-class debut – v Worcs, New Rd, 1903  
Yorkshire career – 1896-1903

He was a RH batsman & a RA fast-medium bowler

His highest first-class score was made against Worcs at New Rd on 25-27 May 1903 (County Championship)

His best first-class figures were achieved against Cambridge Un at Fenner's on 28-30 May 1903 (University match)

His career-best batting performance (29) was against Durham in the Minor Counties Championship at West Hartlepool CC on 12 & 13 July 1901

His career-best bowling performance (6/12) was against the Huddersfield & District CL at Fartown, Huddersfield on 21 & 22 June 1899 (Friendly)

22) **J W COOPER** – Born in 1878 in Barnsley

Died 7 May 1909, also in Barnsley

Yorkshire career – 1910-1903

His one claim to fame is his extraordinary century in 1901 for the second XI against Lancashire at Barnsley CC. Yorks were 194/9 when Cooper joined Walter Bedford (above). The pair added 135 for the final wicket, Cooper's share being 103 from number eleven.

**23) John Emmanuel ELMS** – Born 24 Dec 1874 in Pitsmoor, Sheffield. He was associated with Sheffield Utd CC for 47 years and took over 2000 wickets in the Yorkshire Council.

Died 1 Nov 1951 in Fir Vale, Sheffield, aged 76.

First-class debut – v Derbys, Derby, 1905

Yorkshire career – 1899-1906

He was a RH batsman and bowled both slow and medium-paced styles. A stalwart of second XI cricket, his one first-class appearance occurred in 1905 against Derbyshire at Derby

His highest score (39) was made against Lancs at Ripon CC on 23 & 24 May 1904

His best bowling figures (8/31) were achieved against Yorks at Headingley on 9-11 May 1904.

**24) Charles Willis INGLEBY** – Born 11 Dec 1870 in Sheepscar, Leeds  
Died 15 Nov 1939 in Eccleshill, Bradford, aged 68.

Yorkshire career - 1901

His only first-class appearance came for Lancs against Derbys at Old Trafford on 12-14 June 1899 in the County Championship. He had just one season with Yorks in 1901. His highest score of 95\* was made against Northumberland in the Minor Counties Championship in his first game for Yorks, played at Jesmond on 14 & 15 June 1901. His best bowling return of 1/23 also came against Northumberland, but in the return match at the Circle, Hull, on 18 & 19 July 1901.

His career-best score (92) was made against Northumberland at Thrum Hall, Halifax, on 31 July & 1 Aug 1902

He was a LH batsman and bowled RA fast-medium

His best first-class bowling figs of 9/76 were returned against the Australians at Bradford PA Gd on 5-7 June 1905 (Tourist Match)  
Both performances were also his career-best returns

Died 20 Sept 1930 in Broomhall, Sunningdale, berks, aged 57.

First-class debut – Playing for Worcs v Yorks, at New Rd in 1907

Yorkshire career – 1901-1902

Walker Wainwright's biography begins with John Wainwright, born in Sprotborough, South Yorkshire in 1794. John married twice. His second wife was Mary, born in 1799 in Handsworth, Sheffield. They had eight children between 1828 and 1847. The fifth of these was Alfred (born in Tinsley, Sheffield in 1839 and died in Rotherham in 1923).

In December 1859 in Sheffield, he married Ann Mardsen, who was from Saxilby, Lincolnshire and was aged 20 at the time of her marriage. They had five children between 1864 and 1882. The second of them was Edward (born 8 April 1865 in Tinsley and died on 28 October 1919). He played for Yorkshire and England from 1888 to 1902. He was a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1894.

The last of the children was Walker. He married Eleanor Francis Aldis-Aldridge in Hampstead, Middlesex on 10 November 1917. She died in Winchester, Hampshire in March 1970. They had two children, Alfred James, born in Rotherham on 19 November 1918 in Rotherham, and John Walker, born in March 1925 in Marylebone, London. He died, aged just two years, in Winchester, Hampshire in 1927. His brother had a longer life, dying in 1996, also in Winchester.

Walker's cricket career was much less glorified than his elder brother. He was on the Lords groundstaff and played for Sheffield Collegiate before playing for Yorkshire. His best season in his short career was undoubtedly his first in 1903. After giving up playing, he became a first class umpire. He stood mainly in games at Fenner's, involving Cambridge University. He stood in one Test Match, England v South Africa in Durban in 1923. He also coached at Winchester School in his later years
