Charles Henry Grimshaw, known as Harry, was an exact contemporary of Charles Oyston, Bobby Peel, Wilfred Rhodes, Arthur Sladen, Walker Wainwright and Fred Ward, all of whom bowled slow left arm and all of whom were vying for the permanent senior berth. Not only that, but he had to contend with, in Wilfred Rhodes, perhaps the greatest exponent of the skill Yorkshire CCC have ever had, and who, of course, became the regular choice.

As can be seen from the statistics above, he was probably relatively more successful in second eleven cricket, especially in the Minor Counties competition. But this promise never translated into consistent first eleven successes. He was another player whose early promise was never really fulfilled.

One of cricket's characters, he first played for the second eleven in 1904 against Staffs at the County Gd, Stoke-on-Trent. But he was ignored by the County Club until, in 1914, he averaged over 70 with the bat. He was aged 35 when he finally got his chance in the first eleven against Warwicks at Edgbaston. He was an ever-present for the next 13 seasons. His age was no impediment to success and his fielding did not let him down either.

Before his county career, he had been a professional at Ramsbottom CC in the Lancashire League. He later played for the Keighley and Pudsey St Lawrence clubs in the Bradford League. He also coached at a school neat Morecambe and, in 1934 at the age of 50, while the professional at Benwell Hill CC in Northumberland, took 115 wickets at 8.1.

He also played for Littleborough CC (Central Lancs CL) and Sunderland CC in the Durham Senior CL.

He was on the first-class umpires' list from 1937 to 1939 and again in 1950 and 1951.

At the end of the war, he helped with the coaching at Headingley and was appointed coach to Leicestershire CCC in 1947.

He was a player who inspired Neville Cardus to write "I imagine that the Lord, one day, gathered together a heap of Yorkshire clay, breathed into it and said "Emmott Robinson, go on and bowl at the pavilion end for Yorkshire"
