During and just after the second world war, Yorkshire cricket chugged along quite successfully, with the old stagers, Brian Sellers, Maurice Leyland, Wilf Barber, Herbert Sutcliffe, Len Hutton and Bill Bowes but all were older and perhaps not all with their pre-war capabilities.

The glory days of lefties like George Hirst, Wilfred Rhodes and the sadly-missed Hedley Verity had passed and the young pretender was awaited. Veteran Horace Fisher twirled manfully away until in crept Arthur Booth. It seemed Yorkshire had to reluctantly use him as he had made his first class debut for them in 1931and was not recalled until his *annus mirabilis* in 1946 at the age of 43. But all the time, the county was searching for a more permanent solution.

Eventually after some impressive performances (and quite a few moderate ones) Yorkshire felt obliged to grant him his cap in 1946 before it became a posthumous one. After years of hard graft, he surely deserved it.

He is also remembered for his appearances at Roundhay Park, in Leeds, in the days when Yorkshire would send strong sides for charity events. One such game involving Booth saw an Arthur Clues XI as the opponents, put together by the former Australian Rugby League player, a stalwart of the Leeds and Hunslet clubs.

Such players as Leyland and Hutton would play, and sides would also include Lancastrians Cyril Washbrook, Joe Hardstaff and Eddie Paynter. AB Sellers would go virtually unnoticed with Arthur Wood keeping wicket.

Booth had been capped in 1935 by Northumberland in the Minor Counties Championship before his recall to Yorkshire. Illness restricted Booth to just four appearances in 1947 and he effectively disappeared as Johnny Wardle and Alan Mason contested the spot. He later served Warwickshire as a talent scout and then was a Committee member for Lancashire until 1970.

He played club cricket for Spen Victoria (Bradford CL) and Littleborough in the Central Lancashire League.

155) John DRAKE – Born 1 Sept 1893 in Tong Park, Baildon, W Yorks Died 22 May 1967 in Meanwood, Leeds, aged 73.
