As was usual for wicket-keepers up to the advent of Jim Parks, they did not contribute much with the bat on a regular basis.

294) **J HAIGH** – There are no biographical details available for this player. He played just one game in the Minor Counties Championship against Staffs at Knutton Rd, Wolstanton on 13 & 14 June 1938. He scored 13 and 4\*. He did not bowl but took one catch.

His benefit in 1956 raised £5,357 (equivalent to £134,604.19 in 2020). He moved to Leics for the 1958 season and received his cap from them immediately. He captained his new county from his arrival until 1961.

Watson's early cricket had taken place at Royds Hall GS and Paddock CC in the Huddersfield CL. He scored 1000 runs in 14 of his first-class seasons. He palyed 2|Test Matches for England and in his seventh, at Lord's, he entered the fray with England tottering on 12/3. But he and Trevor "Barnacle" Bailey added 163 for the fifth wicket in a four-hour partnership. Watson made the first (109) of his two test centuries.

Watson was one of the last double internationals as he also won four caps for England, including matches in the 1950 Football World Cup.

300) **J WEATHERELL** – No biographical information is available about this player, who may well be the same as player as the one below. He played just one Minor Counties Championship game against Durham at South Shields on 22 & 23 June 1938.He scored 10 and 6\*. He did not bowl and did not take a catch.

301) **WETHERILL** - No biographical information is available about this player. He played two games in the Minor Counties Championship in 1938. Against Northumberland at Jesmond on 21 & 22 June 1938, he made 11 and 2. He did not bowl and did not take a catch. His other game for the second eleven was the match against Staffs at College Grove, Wakefield on 11-12 July 1938. This game was abandoned after just two overs and Wetherill did not figure with either bat or ball.
