Raymond Illingworth began his cricket as a 15 year old in Farsley's first team in the Bradford CL. He returned to Farsley once he had retired from all involvement in the first class and international strata. He acted as groundsman for the club and openly admitted that he wanted to give something back to the club where it had all begun.

He was a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1960 along with Ken Barrington, Donald Carr, Geoff Pullar and Mike Smith.

Among his career highlights were 135 and 14 for 101 for Yorkshire against Kent at Dover on 19-21 Aug 1964. But it was for England as captain where he really made his indelible mark on the game. He took over the position in 1969 when Colin Cowdrey was injured. He took the team to Australia in 1970/71 and regained the Ashes. He took the players off the field in Sydney in the 1970/71 series as crows trouble erupted. He retained the urn in 1972 at home. His batting particularly blossomed as England captained making two centuries from the middle order and always showing an "over my dead body" attitude to the opponents.

He had left Yorkshire in 1969 to accept an offer of captaincy with Leicestershire and he transformed their fortunes.

Once he had finished playing, he returned to Yorkshire in 1979 and had five years at Headingley as cricket manager. He took over the first eleven captaincy in 1982 and the team won the one-day John Player League. But he left the county again in 1984 at the height of the internal squabble s of the time.

He later had a period from 1994 to 1996 as England manager but it did not work out. His son-in-law is Ashley Metcalfe who was a regular opening partner for Martyn Moxon from the early 1980s to the mid 1990s.

Illingworth received his county cap in 1955 and a benefit in 1965 raised £6.604 (or £128,734.54 in 2020). He was awarded the CBE and made an honorary member of MCC. He was President of the County Club in 2010 and 2011.

He is one of only nine players in first class cricket to have scored 20,000 runs and taken 2,000 wickets. The table below shows the others

In his splendid autobiography "Parky", Michael Parkinson recounts how he almost got to write Trueman's biography. Some debate occurred about a possible title for the book. Trueman suggested "Fred; T'definitive volume on T'best fast bowler that ever drew breath" but the book was never written.

Stories abound about F S Trueman. For example, it was said he would go into the opposition dressing room and look around their team. He would then announce he reckoned he had six wickers today and promptly leave.

He is also alleged to have stood at the gate as a new batsman entered the fray and told the steward not to close it as the batsman would not be long.

Other less pleasant stories are said to be the reason why he was not selected so many times for England but many of these later proved to be false. It is estimated he missed some 35 matches because of the whims of the selectors.

His bowling action was a thing of beauty. As he delivered, his head was to the left of his leading arm, meaning that his body was not putting extra strain on itself as so many bowlers do nowadays by having a so-called mixed action, whereby their head is to the right of the leading arm as the moment of delivery. Trueman was also balanced n hs toes as he delivered, something the author tried to replicate in school cricket matched with absolutely no success at all.

He began his cricket career at Roche Abbey CC in Maltby, S Yorkshire and then moved to Sheffield Utd at Bramall Lane. Once Yorkshire had noticed him, he made quick progress and was awarded his county cap in 1951. He led the county in 21 matches and was particularly proud to have been the skipper when Yorkshire beat the Australian tourists at Bramall lane in 1968.

He achieved four hat-tricks during his career, a Yorkshire record.

He was the Cricket Writers' Young Player of the Year in 1952 and a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1953 along with Harold Gimblett, Tom Graveney, David Shepherd and Stuart Surridge.

His benefit in 1962 raised £9331 (or £200,395.26 in 2020). He was awarded an OBE in 1989.
