# NEWCASTLE DISTRICT LEADER: FRIDAY 11 JULY 1890

## NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY v. NORTH AND EAST RIDINGS OF YORKSHIRE.

The cricket on the opening day of this match at Heaton was of a very interesting description, and the game underwent one or two rather startling changes during the afternoon. Winning the toss, the visitors went in on a good wicket, but lost four batsmen for 18. Then the brothers Frank stayed together until the score reached 62, having just doubled the score. The first 20 runs occupied half an hour in compilation, but the next 40 were put on in fifteen minutes. Mr R. W. Frank played very freely, cutting and driving in vigorous style. He made his 71 in about an hour and ten minutes by twenty-four hits, made up of fifteen 4's, two 2's, and seven singles. Apart from this performance the Ridings, who batted two men short in the first innings, only did moderately, and were all out in an hour and twenty-five minutes for 120. Although the weather yesterday was fine the sky was somewhat overcast, and it assumed a deeper tone when Northumberland commenced their innings, although no rain fell. It did not seem a large total to go in against, but in a nasty grey light the home side signally failed, and when the last wicket fell were still 46 runs in arrears. Mr Hansell's prettily compiled 23 was the redeeming feature of the innings, although Messrs Walters and Brutton hit freely. Harrison accomplished a splendid bowling performance, taking seven wickets for but 16 runs. The local men fielded very smartly, the catch made by Mr Brutton for the dismissal of Skilbeck being the finest bit of fielding we have seen for a long time. Mr Crossley arrived during the afternoon, while Bishop, the Kockeliff professional, was telegraphed for to complete the Ridings eleven.

### Details:—

Winning the toss, the Ridings captain elected to bat, and at 1-20 sent in Skilbeck and Mr Usher to the respective bowling of Messrs Walters from the pavilion end and Nicoll from the further wicket. The start was a bad one, for only one run had been scored when Mr Brutton made a splendid running catch near point for the dismissal of Skilbeck—(1-1-1)—while in Mr Walters' second over the amateur was clean bowled. (2-2-1). Harrison had come in first wicket down, and he was now partnered by Mr R. W. Frank. The ex-county bowler made a couple of boundary hits, his partner following with a similar contribution, but at 16 the professional returned one to Mr Walters. (18-3-8). Mr A. Worsley came to score a couple before he was well caught by Mr Simpson at mid-on—(18-4-2)—and Mr W. L. Frank joined his brother, and though the new comer only just escaped being caught off a bad leg hit the pair were together at the luncheon interval (two o'clock), when the score was 31, with "R. W." not out 5, and "W. L." not out 12.

On resuming at a quarter to three Mr R. W. Frank began scoring at a tremendous pace, and hit no fewer than eight 4's in succession. In ten minutes the score reached 62 (exactly double), but then Mr W. M. Scott went on at the pavilion end in place of Mr Walters, who caught the left-hander at mid-off in the new bowler's first series. (62-5-15). Mr Cayley did not stay long, being cleaned bowled by Mr Nicoll after scoring 4. (74-6-4.) When Mr Marsden came in runs still came freely, 100 being telegraphed at 3-20, and of this number Mr Frank had scored 67. Nine runs later Mr Walters resumed bowling in his old place, and off his first ball Mr Marsden gave a hard chance to Mr Nicoll in the slips; but shortly afterwards Mr Frank cut Mr Walters very hard to mid-off, where Mr Thompson made a capital lofty one-handed catch, for which he was heartily applauded. Mr Frank went in, second wicket down, with the total at 2, and in an hour and ten minutes had scored 71 by the aid of fifteen 4's, two 2's, and seven singles, while the partnership had produced 46 runs (120-7-71). Mr W. H. Worsley brought up the rear, two of the side having failed to turn up; but the end came immediately, Mr Marsden being clean bowled by Mr Nicoll. The innings had lasted nearly an hour and a half, and closed at 3-35 for 120.

At ten minutes to four Messrs Walters and Brutton opened the Northumberland innings, being opposed by Harrison from the pavilion wicket and Mr W. L. Frank at the other end. The start was fairly good, the first wicket producing 23 runs, but then a fine catch by Mr Cayley brought about the dismissal of the young Tynemouth cricketer, who had played nicely for 12. (23-1-12.) Mr Scott came in, but with only five added got his leg in front to the left hander. (23-2-4.) Mr Thompson was fourth man, but almost immediately lost Mr Walters, whom he and Mr Hoare followed back to the pavilion at the same total. (39-3-14, 39-4-0, and 39-5-0.) Messrs Hansell and Simpson now became partners, and showed rather more confidence, but at 42 Harrison got the South Northumberland man leg before wicket. (42-6-8.) The home captain joined his fellow club man, who made a fine deep leg hit to the pavilion off Mr Frank who, however, clean bowled Mr Crawford. (49-7-1.) Mr Curry only scored a single before the professional clean bowled him—(59-8-1)—and Mr Fenwick joined Mr Hansell. Play was quiet for a while, but after a pretty boundary cut squares with the wicket by the left hander Mr Fenwick was smartly caught at the wicket by Mr R. W. Frank. (60-9-2.) Mr Nicoll was whippet-in, but the end soon came, for he was clean bowled

by Harrison after adding 3 to the total. The innings had lasted an hour and a half, and closed at 5-20 for 74, or 46 in arrears. Mr Hansell was not out 23, for which he had played excellent cricket and hit three 4's, three 3's, and one 2.

The second innings of the Ridings commenced at 5-50. Mr Usher and Skilbeck again facing the deliveries of the Messrs Walters and Nicoll. Skilbeck was bowled by Nicoll. Usher and A. Worsley played with freedom, but a rather loose ball from Mr Walters was cut by Mr Worsley, and was easily held by Mr Scott. Messrs Marsden and Frank played carefully, and with the score at 40, Mr Simpson bowled vice Mr Nicoll. Mr Frank was clean bowled by him for a neat 13, and Mr Crossley, who was absent during the first innings, joined Mr Marsden. After playing steadily he put one back to Mr Simpson—(64-5-3)—and play was then adjourned until eleven o'clock to-day. Present score and bowling analysis:—

**NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY v. NORTH AND EAST RIDINGS OF YORKSHIRE.**

Some very interesting cricket was witnessed at Heaton yesterday, when this match was brought to a conclusion. Although still cold the weather was much brighter, but there were not quite so many spectators as on the previous day, when the company attained fair proportions. The chief feature of the day was the batting of Messrs Marsden and R. Frank, who in the first hour's play took the score from the overnight 64 to 143. They had put on 79 while together, Mr Frank scoring 53 of that number, or just twice as fast as his partner. Mr Marsden stayed through the remainder of the innings, and was not out with 64 to his credit, for which he played excellent cricket. He was in while 184 runs were scored, his stay at the wickets lasting two and a half hours. The Northumberland side probably never fielded better than in this match, and in this they were decidedly superior to their opponents. Northumberland had to go in against a lead of 257 runs, and they did very fairly to reach 163. Yesterday, in contrast to the experience of Thursday, they had a good light to bat in, and they might have done even better had Messrs Brutton and Thompson exercised a little more care, for the latter was very badly run out, while the former was well set when Harrison tempted him to hit out. The best batting on the home side was when Messrs Hoare and Hansell came together, both men playing pretty cricket. They put on 55 runs for the fourth wicket. In the end Northumberland were beaten by 94 runs, a result very largely due to the bowling of Harrison, who in the match secured the dismissal of fifteen batsmen at an average cost of 5½ runs each—a very fine performance. Details:—

At 1.30 the innings resumed their second innings, in which five wickets had fallen overnight for 64 runs. Mr Marsden, not out 8, was accompanied by Mr E. W. Frank, the bowling being divided by Messrs Walters at the pavilion end and Simpson from the further wicket. Both men batted with confidence, but Mr Frank had only scored 6 when he just escaped being caught and bowled by Mr Simpson, the ball touching the latter's fingers as it passed over him. At 21 Mr Walters gave way to Mr Scott, but no separation was effected, and 100 was telegraphed after half an hour's play. Two runs later Mr Nicoll took the ball at the further end, the South Northumberland man crossing over. This had little effect, however, for both batsmen were well set, and runs came at a fair pace, Mr Simpson being the chief sufferer, and at 123 he gave way to Mr Brutton. A little later Mr Frank completed his half-hundred with an on drive from Mr Nicoll, his actual score being 53; but he got no further, for in the next over from the pavilion end he returned one short to Mr Brutton, who made a clever catch. The batsman had been in just an hour for 53, made up of eight 4's and five 2's, and the sixth wicket had produced 79 runs. (143-6 53.) Harrison was the next comer, and after small contributions 150 was exhibited at 12.55, but five minutes later the professional was clean bowled by Mr Nicoll. (153-7-8.) Mr Cayley was ninth man, and he lifted Mr Nicoll right out of the ground on to the road, but hitting the next ball in a similar direction was out to a well judged catch by Mr Hoare. (176-8-15.) Mr W. H. Worsley partnered Mr Marsden, but he was caught and bowled by Mr Brutton without scoring. (184-9-0.) Bishop was last man, and with his arrival Mr Simpson displaced the ex-East Rinder, and after a spell of quiet play Mr Marsden completed his 50 with a single to mid-on from Mr Brutton. At 193 Mr Walters resumed in place of Mr Brutton, and 200 was telegraphed at 1.20, Mr Thompson failing to hold a cut to the boundary by Bishop. The end soon came now. Bishop being caught at the wicket by Mr Fenwick off Mr Simpson, the innings closing at 1.25 for 211. Mr Marsden was not out 64, for which he had played excellent cricket, in which he gave only one possible chance at point when 25. He went in overnight second wicket down with the score at 27, and was batting about two hours and a half, and included amongst his hits were five 4's, three 3's, and ten 2's.

At 1.40, with the large balance of 257 runs against them, Northumberland commenced their second innings, Mr Crawford and Mr Scott opening the venture to the bowling of Harrison and Mr W. L. Frank, from the entrance and further wickets respectively. It was not a good start, Mr Scott being clean bowled by the professional at 11. (11-1-5.) Mr Hoare came in first wicket down, and put the last of the over to the off boundary. His captain then lifted the left-hand bowler into the road at square leg, and this he followed by several other boundary hits, the score being 34 at luncheon, Mr Crawford not out 21 and Mr Hoare not out 8.

A slight shower caused a delay of five minutes, and play was resumed at ten minutes to three; but at 35 Mr Crawford was bowled by Harrison without increasing his score. (39-2-21.) Mr Hansell came in, and at 46 Mr Frank gave way to Bishop, 50 being telegraphed at 3.5. Both batsmen were playing with care, and hitting hard when opportunity offered. Bishop was proving somewhat expensive, and after four overs he was displaced by Skilbeck at 76; but the new bowler after one over was removed for Mr A. Worsley, whose fourth ball Mr Hoare drove finely to the long-on boundary, but in his next over Mr Worsley got him leg before. He had played very good cricket for fifty minutes, and had three 4's, two 3's, and nine 2's included in his 41. (94-3-41.) Mr Brutton was the next comer, and shortly 100 was posted, having occupied an hour and five minutes; and six minutes later Mr W. L. Frank took the ball from Harrison at the pavilion end, the

latter crossing over, and in his second over clean bowled the left-hand batsman, who had compiled 30 in excellent style. (119-4-30.) Mr Walters partnered the young Tynemouth man, and runs came even more freely, 140 being telegraphed as the result of an hour and a half's play, but two minutes later Mr Brutton, who had showed good form for 15, was caught by Mr Usber at mid-off. (142-5-15.) Mr Thompson came in and Mr Marsden took the ball from Mr Frank. The new batsman had only scored a couple, when he was very badly run out. (146-6-2.) Mr Simpson was bowled without scoring—(148-7-0)—and Mr Fenwick partnered the Newbrough captain, who had scored 27 by fine cricket when he was caught at the wicket. (1-7-8-27.) Mr Curry was last but one, and had only scored a single when he put one from Harrison into the hands of Mr Usber at mid-off. (163-9-1.) Mr Nicoll as usual was last man, but he was bowled without scoring, and the innings which had lasted two hours and a quarter closed for 163. Northumberland thus suffered defeat by 94 runs.
