Matters improved somewhat after this, and the last wicket had not been captured before 140 runs had been telegraphed. Isaac Williams with 44 to his credit was the top scorer, H. M. Griffiths and Griff Rowe coming next with serviceable scores of 17 and 12 respectively. E. R. Lewis was the most successful bowler on the winning side, taking 4 wickets for 29 runs.

Burry Port opened their innings in none too promising a manner, but after a while steadied themselves and there was an exciting finish to the game. They won by six runs. During their innings there was a somewhat unpleasant incident, the visiting captain, T. C. Williams, who by the way carried his bat out after scoring 55 runs, challenging the decision of the Llanelly umpire when he gave Rowlands out for lbw. The homesters lost the match owing to indifferent fielding, and unless an improvement is made there are more reverses in store for them. T. C. Williams, who punished the bowling, should never have reached anything like a half century. He gave three or four reasonable chances, but they were allowed to pass, with the result that the Llanelly 2nds are now mourning the loss of their second league match this season, Kid well doing the trick a week previously.

It will be recalled that the last match at Neath between Llanelly and the home team was followed by a deplorable outbreak on the part of the spectators, in which several of the Llanelly players suffered physical injury at the hands of an undisciplined mob. On Saturday the return match was played at Strdey and passed off very pleasantly, the conduct of the crowd being in refreshing contrast to that which marred the previous encounter. There was one incident however which might be misconstrued unless it is explained. It is the custom when the ball is hit over a boundary for the spectators near by to throw in the ball in order to avoid the necessity of the fielders going a long distance for it, thus saving a lot of time and also relieving the game of a little of its monotony. In accordance with this custom a spectator on Saturday picked up the ball and he was peremptorily told to "leave the ball alone." After this the spectators religiously refrained from touching the ball, with the result that the fielders had to hunt the leather for a considerable distance on several occasions, play meanwhile being kept at a standstill.

Unfortunately the home team was an unrepresentative one, such reliable "bats" as Percy Rees, Hugh Howell, E. Gee, and W. Davies being engaged for the County of Carmarthen against Monmouthshire. On the home side, however, was Morton, a Deplishire amateur, who was the guest of one of the Llanelly players.

Neath went to the wicket first and were disposed of for 129 runs, included in the total being no less than 24 extras—a fact which did not reflect credit on some of the fielders. Morton and Clough were the trundlers, the former taking 6 wickets for 47 runs, and the latter 4 for 39. Morton is a fast bowler of the best type, and his deliveries frequently upset the calculation of the batsmen, with the result that wickets were obtained for Llanelly somewhat cheaply.

Llanelly made a promising start at the wickets, the half century being reached with only two wickets down. Clough and Morton, who were the two first batsmen, scored 19 and 16 runs respectively, while C. C. Warner, who was the third man in, proved to be top scorer with 29 to his credit. Warner possesses an abundance of patience and seems contented so long as he secures a run or two in an over. He took no liberties at all, and while his partners came and went he stuck to his "guns." After Phil Rogers had been given out by the Neath umpire, a decision which did not give satisfaction to the crowd, and which certainly surprised the batsman, the home side broke down completely, the only two persons who succeeded in reaching double figures being D.
