CRICKET.

In accordance with this custom a spectator on Saturday picked up the ball and he was peremptorily told to "leave the ball alone." After this the spectators religiously refrained from touching the ball, with the result that the fielders had to bunt the leather for a considerable distance on several occasions, play meanwhile being kept at a stand-still.

Unfortunately the home team was an unrepresentative one, such reliable "buts" as Percy Recs, Hugh Howell, E. Gee, and W. Davies being engaged for the County of Carmarthen against Monmouthshire. On the home side, however, was Morton, a Derilyshire amateur, who was the guest of one of the Llaudly playing the Llanelly players.

Neath went to the wicket first and were disposed of for 129 runs, included in the total being no less than 24 extras—a fact which did not reflect credit on some of the fielders. Morton and Clough were the trundlers, the former taking 6 wickets for 47 runs, and the latter 4 for 59. Morton is a fast bowler of the best type, and his deliveries frequently upset the calculation of the batsmen, with the result that wickets were obtained for Llanelly somewhat cheaply.

Lianelly made a promising stant at the wickets, the half century being reached with only two wickets down. Clough and Morton, who were the two first batsmen, scored 19 and 16 runs respectively, while C. C. Warner, who was the third man in, proved to be top scorer with 29 to his credit. Warner possesses an abundance of patience and seems contented so long as he secures a run or two in an over. He took no liberties at all, and while his partners came and went he stuck to his "guns." Had a few of the others done likewise Llanelly would have won, but instead of that they lost by 17 runs. After Phil Rogers had been given out by the Neath umpire, a decision which did not give satisfaction to the crowd, and which certainly surprised the hatsman, the home side broke down completely, the only two persons who succeeded in reaching double figures being D. H. Davies and Criff Rowe. Seeing that there were no loss than four members of the 2nd XI, and one player from a junior club playing on the Llanelly side, the result of the game, and it might easily have been reversed, is very creditable.
