- 10 Norwich, Norfolk v Cambridgeshire (Norwich Week)
- 12 Norwich, Norfolk v Bedfordshire (Norwich Week)"

No other county is credited with having a 'week'. Over a century later, Norfolk alone still has its week (although some other counties grumble about having to alter their fixture lists to accommodate it). Does information exist on whether other counties ever held a week/festival that was more than ephemeral?

Notes line 3 Hawken, not Hawkin (at least I think that is what my note says but I cannot read

own lousy writing)

Page 176 Dorset In the "final season" list at line 15 Barnes, not Banres, and Bosworth-Smith, not Bosworth-

Smioth

Page 177 Notes line 3 Would not at 28.80 be preferable to and 28.80(Durham)

Page 179 Glamorgan. In the notes we seem to deal in Christian names where they are available. According

to Andrew Hignell's history, Maxwell was James and Sweet-Escott was Edward.

Page 180 Notes line 3 "in 1908 whe he scored 656 to 50.46" should read "in 1908 when he scored 656 at

50.46".

Page 183 In respect of Match 94 I said that Geen took over as w/k. From what is shown on page 183 it looks

as if the player's name was Green not Geen. An amendment to the Monmouthshire batting card in

Match 94 is, therefore, needed as are two amendments to the Cornwall card for catches by Green.

In the notes above the averages, for the sake of consistency, I think we should say that 1909 was

"the last or only season that these 5......"

Green has become Geen in the averages. I have no way of checking this chap's name as

he is not mentioned in 1910 Wisden. Cricketarchive has WP Geen so this seems correct. However I noted a couple of entries in CA for WP Green which probably need merging into Geen's records. Page 186 Again for consistency I think we should say 3 players who made their (not his) debut in the

heading to the averages.

Page 187 In the notes above the averages insert "XI" after 2nd in line 2.

Page 188 Notes line 2 Edmund' not Edmind.

Page 191 Surrey secretary was Findlay not Findley.

Page 192 In line 1 of the notes "defeating Glamorgan"

Page 194 In the 7th wicket partnership for Bedfordshire in "milestones" we have T A Brown. I have a feeling that

Brown was a pro - he certainly was with Northamptonshire - and, if so, his initials need

moving.

The same applies to George Pollitt for the 8th and 9th partnerships. Again, in the bowling, Brown's initials need moving in 3 places. In the number of appearances below both Brown

and

Pollitt need adjustment. I think that David is correct and that these two were both professionals.

Page 195 Cambridgeshire bowling - I think D,M. Hayward was a pro(3 places). Agreed, and also below

Page 196 Norfolk batting - Holland F.C. 5th wicket Relf A.E., 5th wicket (against) Hayward 6th Holland and

10th Davis were all pros.

Norfolk bowling Shore C.(4 places) and Tomlin E.

Page 197 These are all pros.

batting Ducat, Thompson & Baker

partnerships Hayes, Ducat, Holland, Davis (twice), Rothery (twice), Hutchinson (not sure) – he was a pro,

Thompson, Makepeace and Ellis.

bowling Thompson (2), Smith (2), Nice

appearances Baker.

I appreciate that all these minor things will cause a lot of work and leave you to decide what to do about them. All my previous MC books are in the loft so I have not checked who was a pro and who was not. I cannot remember if Albert Relf began as an amateur in MC.

The proof duly arrived (thanks, Pete) and, so far, I've checked the 'bits' that I 'do'. I found the 'Partnerships' and 'Missing Data' to be correct with a couple of changes which were clearly right and proper.

Under 'Leading Performances', we still lack Christian names for: SR Nicholson (Wilts), WE King (Bedssurely Tony W?), H Mitchell (Wilts), E Gee (Carmarthenshire), J Armstrong (Notts II - Peter W-T?), WN Bickford-Smith (Cornwall) and Sir CEMY Nepean (isn't he 'Cyril'?).

I assume that the tribute to Tony will go in. There are two errors regarding the Norfolk team. Firstly, SD Page appeared in only 57 Championship matches in his career rather than 100+ and need to be deleted from the appearance milestone list. Second, the partial batting order in Norfolk's second innings in Match 35 is: (8) Thurgar, (9) Page, (10) Pilch, (11) Smith. The others as already given (or unknown). White's hat-trick consisted of Cozens-Hardy, Thurgar and Page (the latter two 'bagged 'em').

I'll have a run-through before 'Stars On Sunday'.

This is incorrect as Ted had, for some reason, been asked to open the batting in the second innings. I'll bet my bottom dollar that Pilch thus dropped to number 10 and it was Sydney Page who filled the number 9 slot ('bagging 'em' by the way), immediately following Thurgar who is correctly at 8 (also receiving a 'bag' by the way). The hat-trick thus consisted of Cozens-Hardy: Thurgar: Page. Years of Pilch-watching mean that I am certain about all this - and am also certain that Billy will have 'whipped in' so we can stick 11 next to Smith, EW.

Here are my final comments on the points raised by Colin in games involving Norfolk in 1909:-

Match 71. Allsopp clearly batted at 6 and, although Wilson's name appears in the text before Fowler's, it is obvious from the facts that Wilson blobbed, Fowler didn't and that 3 wickets fell at 35 that Fowler batted at 7 and Wilson at 8. I have gone through this thoroughly three times and am sure of all this. Match 77. Again, I have checked this 3 times - I am convinced that the missing FOWs in Norfolk's first innings are 2-20 (NOT 2-30), 3-68 and 4-81.

Match 83. I 'phoned KEGS, King's Lynn and was given the Email address of their business manager, a Steward Bunting. I have left him a message - I am hopeful that he will be co-operative as he played a few games for Norfolk...

Match 88. OK, you can have Raikes as 1 and McCormick as 2 in Norfolk's first innings - although the text clearly states that "McCormick and Raikes..." went out to bat. As for Brooke's bowling in Norfolk's first innings, the Norfolk papers give the overs bowled as 10.3 no fewer than thrice - however, it's a Lincs home match and I will bow to the superior knowledge of Colin & Ken Trushell. Stick with 11.3 overs (unless the averages hint otherwise...)

'Morning Julian,

Thanks for your Email and for Tony's attachment, which is nearly accurate. Correctly, he lists George Southall Stevens as playing his only Championship matches in 1909 but he gets confused and lists Lynn pro' Stevens, George as a debutant. The 1907 Book correctly lists Stevens, George as making his debut in that year. An easy mistake to make.

As for Norfolk biographies, should there not also be one of Sydney Page? He's missing from page 32 of the 1908 Book, where he should be credited with 48 dismissals (40 ct, 8 ct). He played a total of 58 matches, one as skipper, and finished with 59 victims (47 ct, 12 st), also bagging one wicket with the ball. His top-score was 96* against Herts at Lakenham in 1899; when last man, Charlie Shore, came in to bat, Page offered him two sovereigns if he could survive the two balls remaining in the over and so allow Page the chance to complete his century. Shore stated: "The money is as good as earned, sir, you may give it to me now if you like." - but then played his notorious 'pull' to his first ball and was inevitably dismissed. Borderline perhaps, but more worthy of inclusion than some who have snuck in - and that anecdote is every bit as good as that of F Stedman and the South Western Railway timetable? I'll leave that with you and get on with Billy Smith.

Ted Gibson bowled exceptionally well, finishing with 58 wickets at just 14.16 but, despite a nine-wicket haul, Billy Smith took just 29 wickets in total and was released at the end of the season.

Among the 15 Norfolk players who retired after the 1909 season were three who might require an 'obituary':-

Billy Smith: 226 wickets at 16.18 - a 'must'

Sydney Page: 47 ct & 12 st in 58 matches: captain once - 'borderline'

Ernest Raikes: only 11 Championship games: like HF Fox & WH Manfield, his best was pre-1895: 40 matches in all for Norfolk: 200 wickets at 15.27 apiece, including 17-91 v Herts (1888) - best ever figures by a Norfolk bowler (plus 7 wkts with no analysis): 49 first-class wickets at 10.28 (all in India): ran Norfolk Colts matches into old age: one of the great and the good - a 'must'?
