OBITUARY.

MR. R. HALLEY.

Mr. Russell Halley, at one time a prominent New Zealand cricketer, died at Wellington on July 6th at the age of forty-nine. His first appearance in a representative match was for Canterbury against Wellington at Wellington in 1886-7, when he and Dunlop, bowling unchanged throughout, dismissed Wellington for 66 and 34 and won the game for their side by 110 runs. Dunlop took ten wickets for 36 runs and Halley, who at one period bowled 50 balls for one run and five wickets, nine for 52. Halley never did quite so well again in a match of such importance, although he took six wickets for 50 runs for XVIII of Canterbury against Shrewsbury's Team at Hagley Park in March, 1888. He was a left-hand medium-paced bowler and a fair bat.

HERTFORDSHIRE DEFEAT LINCOLNSHIRE BY AN INNINGS.

FEN COUNTY'S FIRST DEFEAT.

SHELFORD TAKES 10 WICKETS FOR 65.

Lincolnshire and Hertfordshire played their return match at Grimsby on Wednesday and Thursday. The match was down for decision on the People's Park, but as the ground was under water the captains agreed to the match being transferred to the Grimsby Town ground. Lincolnshire batted first, but so deadly was the bowling of White and Shelford, who were unchanged through the innings, that the whole side was out for 89 runs. Hertfordshire opened their innings in promising style, free hitting by Golding, R. B. Cowley, G. H. Vasey and C. T. Rudd enabling them to secure an advantage of 100 runs. In the home county's second attempt White and Shelford again bowled extremely well, dismissing their opponents for the small total of 93, thus inflicting defeat on Lincolnshire for the first time this season. The Stevenage bowler was particularly destructive, securing 10 wickets in the two innings at a fraction over 6 runs per wicket. Rudd gave a vigorous display, and in his total of 45 were ten 4's.

The personnel of both teams differed greatly from those who appeared at Hitchin on July 23 and 24, when Hertfordshire, batting first, scored 85 runs. E. T. Cooke, the Spalding amateur, who was absent from this match, on that occasion taking 5 wickets for 17 runs. On the occasion under notice in addition to Cooke, Babby, Foster and Pugh were absent from the home side, their places being taken by L. A. F. Weigall, J. N. Worman, J. Redwood, and J. Brooke. The absentees on the Hertfordshire side were H. M. Harford, E. H. Cuthbertson, H. Williams, Brown and Coleman, whose places were filled by R. B. Cowley, G. H. Vasey, C. T. Rudd, G. C. Hartley and Shelford.

In the first innings White bowled 23 overs (8 maidens) and took 4 wickets for 40, while Shelford bowled 22.3 overs (8 maidens) and took 6 wickets for 41 runs. In the second innings White sent down 29 overs (8 maidens) and captured 5 wickets for 30 runs; Shelford 10.1 overs (5 maidens) 4 wickets for 21, and Marsh 8 overs (2 maidens) one wicket for 10 runs.

COUNTY CRICKET.

Minor Counties Championship.

Linca. v. Hertfordshire.

Lincolnshire sustained a crushing defeat in the last match in the Eastern Section of the Minor Counties Championship, last week, when Hertfordshire, who are "runners-up" in the section, beat them by an innings and 7 runs. The match was played at Grimsby and owing to the unplayable condition of the pitch at the People's Park on Wednesday last, it was transferred to the Town ground, and a start was not made till 3.30. Batting first on a wet wicket, Lincolnshire were all dismissed for 53, J. A. Brooke with 27 and Day with 17, being the only batsmen to reach double figures. Shelford took 6 wickets for 41 and 4 for 46. Before the drawing of stumps Golding and White put on 29 for Hertfordshire without loss. When play was resumed on Thursday the wicket was much improved. Hertfordshire continued their innings and totalled 189, giving them a lead of 100 on the first innings. Golding (46), C. T. Rudd (49), were the chief contributors. For Lincolnshire Weigall was the most successful of the six bowlers tried, he taking 5 wickets for 12 runs. Lincolnshire commenced their 2nd innings after luncheon, but failed to wipe off the arrears of the first innings. Thompson set his men a good example, and carried out his bat for a patient and skilful 29, but the bowling was deadly and the fielding keen. Geeson (17), Day (12), and Ward (12) were the only other batsmen to make anything of a show before White, whose 5 wickets cost 39 runs, and Shelford, who took 4 for 24. THE COUNTY MATCH.

There was a great disappointment in store for the public in connection with the last County match of the season, for it was found that the Park pitch was under water on Wednesday, and at the last moment it was decided to play the game on the Littlefield-lane ground, kindly lent by the Town Club, a start being made in the afternoon. Weigall, Rodwood and Brooke had been included in the Lincolnshire eleven to meet Hertfordshire, and a start was made after luncheon at 3.30, Ward and Thompson opening the Lincolnshire's innings. The opening was disastrous, for with his second ball White bowled Ward. Weigall followed shortly after, having made 9. Thompson played very careful cricket, but with the score at 21 he fell to Shelford. Riley stayed to make nine, the second, third, and fourth men cursorily having made identical scores. Day played sparkling cricket, but the hero of the match was Brooke, the ninth man in, who reached 27. The bowling apparently presented no difficulties to him, and it was by a brilliant catch on the boundary that he was dismissed. The innings closed for 89. Golding and White, Hertfordshire's opening pair, played out time in tedious fashion, taking seventy-four minutes to make 29.

The second day's play was favoured by much improved weather, but the wicket appeared tricky when Golding and White continued Hertfordshire's innings. Although having only to face the low total of 89 scored by the home county, Golding and White, the initial pair of batsmen, played exceedingly slow cricket, and future events proved that they treated the bowling with more caution than it was entitled to.

White was the first to depart, a fast ball from Worman upsetting all his calculations, and his middle stump at the same time. Cowley, who followed, opened more freely, and as the wicket improved the batsmen treated the spectators to some bright hitting. Boundary followed boundary, the Vicarage grounds did not escape the visitation of the ball. In one over two balls were lost. The second wicket carried the total to seventy seven and succeeding batsmen paid just as little respect to the bowlers. Rudd was especially at home and seldom seemed in difficulties. The Lincolnshire fielders were at times painfully remiss, and a lot of runs were wasted. Geeson was twice at fault in giving lives. In striking contrast to the man he captained, Mr Thompson seemed everywhere. "He fields every ball," was a remark heard among the crowd, who repeatedly applauded his energy and skill. A feature of his fielding was the easy manner in which he used either hand to pick up and throw in the ball, and repeatedly he hit the wicket from the leg boundary.

The Lincolnshire total was exceeded by one hundred exactly ere the last wicket fell. Weigall had been the most successful bowler his five wickets costing but twelve runs. Geeson, of whose break balls much had been expected, and for whom the crowd had been clamouring long before he was put on, proved most unsuccessful. His first three balls were hit high over the boundary.

Going in to face the heavy deficit after luncheon Lincolnshire fared badly. Again the contrast in the batting of the teams was marked. Cramped and excessively cautious were the men. The bowling rendered some, but no adequate excuse, for this, and the fielding was also decidedly opposite to what had been seen earlier in the day. Thompson alone saved the eleven from disgrace. Ward was never at home and his wicket had had many narrow escapes ere he fell to White. Day tried hard to stem the rot but did not get set. Geeson played vigorous cricket, and deserved a better fate, the decision which gave him marching orders being open to much question. To Allen, who was patient and assisted his captain to add a few runs to the score, credit is also due.

A word of praise must be given to Fromant, the Grimsby Town Cricket Club 'pro,' for the excellent wicket he prepared at such short notice and under such adverse circumstances.
