

81 wickets, he played a not-out innings of 172 against Sussex at Brighton, putting on 428 runs for the sixth wicket with Noble, who scored 234. But Armstrong has ever been a man of large innings and prolific partnerships. In April, 1904, when playing for Melbourne against Melbourne University, he made 438 in 395 minutes, hitting a 5 and forty-six 4's, and with E. Monfries (123) increased the total by 433 for the fifth wicket. His doings for the Melbourne Club that season showed an aggregate of 812 and an average of 135.33. His innings of 303 not out against Somerset at Bath four years ago ranks as the highest ever made for an Australian team in this country, whilst his 335 for Melbourne v. Southlands, at Wellington in March, 1906, constitutes a record for New Zealand. South Africans also have good cause to remember his capabilities as a run-getter, seeing that in the Test-match at Johannesburg on October 18th 20th and 21st, 1902, he made 49 in his first innings and 159 not out in his second. But of him it may truly be said that, whether he has been playing in his native land, in England, New Zealand or South Africa, he has not failed to leave his mark—and a very large mark, too—on the score-sheet.

SHORT COMMONS AT CARDIFF.

Play in this semi-final of the Minor Counties Championship at Cardiff yesterday was limited to 65 minutes. Drizzling rain fell in the early morning, but about eleven o'clock ceased, and Glamorgan, winning the toss, commenced batting at twenty minutes past eleven, with Riches and Sweet-Escott.

Riley and Barnes opened the attack, but both batsmen played with confidence, especially Riches, who made some really pretty strokes to leg. Runs came at a good pace, the score board registering 59 after three-quarters of an hour's play, when Clifton relieved Barnes, whilst in the next over Lee took the ball from Riley. These bowling changes caused the rate of run-getting to become slower, although Riches made one huge drive to the leg boundary off Lee. With the score at 63, Riley resumed in place of Clifton, but after 4 more runs had been added, rain again began to fall, and continued throughout the day, necessitating an abandonment. Score:—

NOTTS. II. v. GLAMORGAN.

WELSHMEN QUALIFY FOR THE FINAL.

Although Glamorgan undoubtedly played good cricket they were much favoured by the trickiness of the wicket at Cardiff yesterday, and thus fortune secured their entry into the final of the Minor Counties' Championship.

Their score of 72 without loss on an easy wicket made during the hour's play on Tuesday gave them an insuperable advantage, indeed all their wickets fell before lunch yesterday for an additional 64 runs. The total of 136 did not seem very formidable, but those who know the ultra tricky wicket at the Cardiff Arms Park after rain has fallen very accurately predicted that Notts. would not equal it and with the practical certainty that the match would be decided on the first innings the visitors were in a tight corner.

Riley's bowling had been wonderfully good during the Glamorgan innings, but Nash's was even better in the Notts. innings. Good bats like James, Carr, and Inmonger were dismissed cheaply, and three wickets were down for 36. Turner, Lee, and Whysall were the only men to stand up to the bowling of the senior Glamorgan professional, and Lee had hard luck in being caught and bowled by Nash, the ball slipping through the bowler's hands and sticking between his legs. Creber, the Glamorgan slow bowler, who usually comes off on a sticky wicket, was punished severely, and was barracked by the crowd. Notts. were all disposed of at 3.45, and were in arrears to the extent of 44 runs.

It was then thought that the match would inevitably be decided on the first innings, but so quickly did the Glamorgan wickets fall in their second innings that the home supporters at 4.30 began to fear that the Notts. men had still a fighting chance. Three wickets were down for 34, and with Barnes continuing to bowl astonishingly well there was a procession of batsmen to and from the pavilion. Creber, a stone-waller, and usually the last man in, was sent in at the fall of the sixth wicket to try to stem the rot, but he was soon bowled by Barnes. However, Preece and Symonds stayed quite a long while for their few runs, and when the innings ended at 5.45 Notts. had no possible chance of pulling the game out of the fire.

On going in a second time Notts. fared no better than Glamorgan, and at the drawing of stumps had lost three good men for only 28 runs. Score and analysis:—

GLAMORGAN QUALIFY FOR CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL

MATCH DECIDED ON FIRST INNINGS.

FAULTLESS BATTING BY RICHES.

With the match between Glamorgan and Notts Second ending in a draw at Cardiff on Wednesday, the question to be decided was whether Glamorgan, in virtue of their leading on the first innings, would be given the victory, and thereby qualify to meet either Wiltshire or Lincolnshire in the final of the Minor Counties Championship.

YESTERDAY'S PLAY.

Although there was no rain during the night, the wicket on the Cardiff Arms Park in the morning still showed signs of the heavy rain of the two previous days, and the start was delayed for a short time to allow it to recover.

Bancroft followed, but after scoring 3 from the first ball he received was clean bowled by Riley in the next over, Preece taking his place. Riches soon followed, being easily caught by Iremonger at a cover-point off Barnes.

MERRY HITTING.

Symonds was soon run out in attempting an impossible run, and Hacker was caught by Lee off Riley. Seven wickets were thus down directly the 100 had been telegraphed.

VISITORS START BADLY.

Punctually at 1.15 Gibson led the Glamorgan team out to field, and a burst of applause greeted the arrival of James and Carr, the latter a young player whose brilliant net out century against Cheshire has given him a great reputation.

On resuming, at 2.30 Carr was partnered by Iremonger, to the bowling of Crober and Nash. In the latter's second over Carr was bowled, having made 8. At 22 Iremonger was run out. He hit hard to Symonds and started to run. Turner, who had succeeded Carr, signalled him back, but before he could do so Riches had put down his wicket.

Nash, who bowled excellently, took six wickets for 30, and was backed up by smart fielding, Hacker especially distinguishing himself; whilst Riches was very sound at the wicket, only allowing one bye.

GLAMORGAN'S SECOND VENTURE.

At four o'clock Sweet-Escott and Riches came out to open the Glamorgan second innings. Tuesday's partnership, however, was not to be repeated, as, after playing cautiously to Riley and Barnes for ten minutes, Riches was easily stumped off Riley.

THE VISITORS' TASK.

At 4.15 o'clock Iremonger and Turner came out to open the Notts second innings. Nash and Maxwell bowled. Turner was the first to leave, being lbw to Maxwell, and Carr, his successor, was bowled by the same player a few runs later.

A large crowd watched the later stages of the match, and showed by their frequent applause a keen interest in the game. Full scores and analysis:—

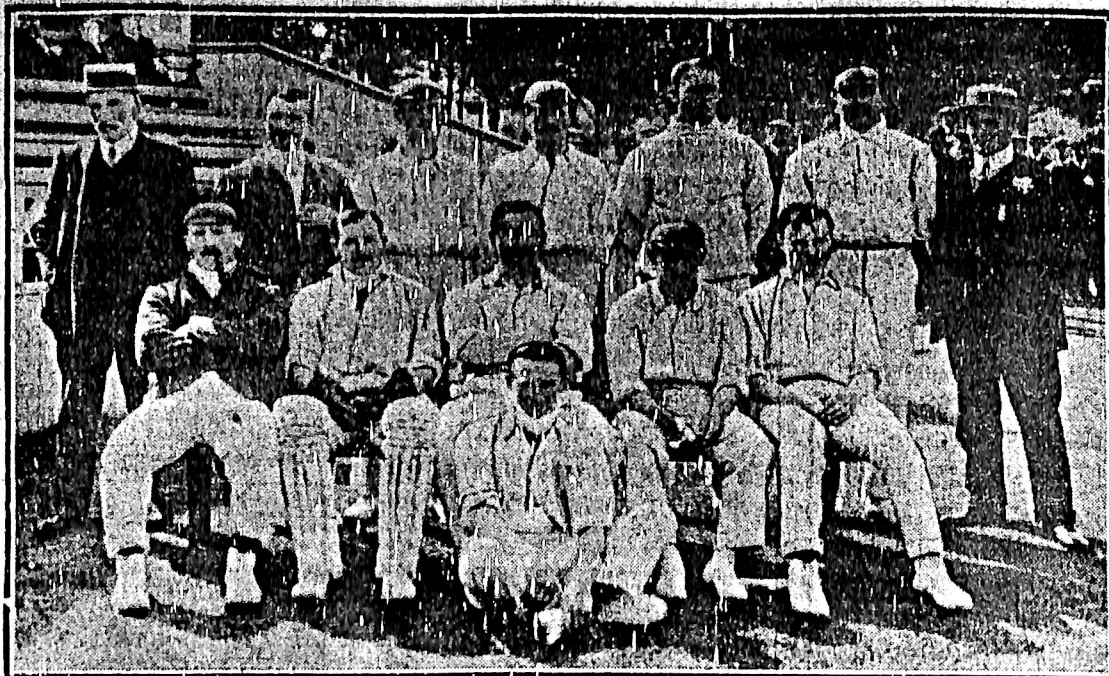

**GLAMORGAN START WELL,
BUT RAIN CAUSES ANOTHER
DISAPPOINTMENT.**

After the disappointment of Monday it was some relief to find that a start could be made in the Minor Counties Championship semi-final between Glamorgan and Notts Seconds at the advertised hour on Tuesday, a different pitch having been provided at the Cardiff Arms Park from the one originally prepared. Glamorgan having won the toss, Gibson sent E. B. Sweet-Escott and N. V. H. Riches in to open the innings at 11.30 to the bowling of Riley (left-hand medium) and Barnes (right hand). The pitch played too slowly to be really difficult, and both batsmen started confidently, Riches in particular making some pretty strokes on the off, and ten minutes from the start delighted the crowd by a magnificent on-drive out of the ground off Riley. At 20 Barnes was relieved by Clifton in order to allow Riley to change ends. In this over Sweet-Escott had a narrow escape from being run out, and off the last ball of the over survived a confident appeal for a catch at the wicket. On changing ends the rate of scoring decreased. At 37 Clifton (right hand fast) relieved Barnes, and one over later Lee (slow right hand) went on at the other end for Riley.

Runs came fairly easily, and the 50 was

telegraphed as the result of fifty minutes' play. This rate of scoring continued, Riches getting Lee twice to the boundary, first with a lofty hit to deep square leg and later with a fine off-drive. At 72 the rain, which had been threatening all the morning and had made the attendance very small, set in steadily, and the players were forced to seek the shelter of the pavilion, Riches being then 48 and Sweet-Escott 24, after the game had been in progress an hour and five minutes. It was soon seen that no more play would be possible before luncheon. The afternoon, however, brought no abatement in the weather, and finally, at three o'clock, the two captains decided to abandon play until to-day (Wednesday), at eleven o'clock.

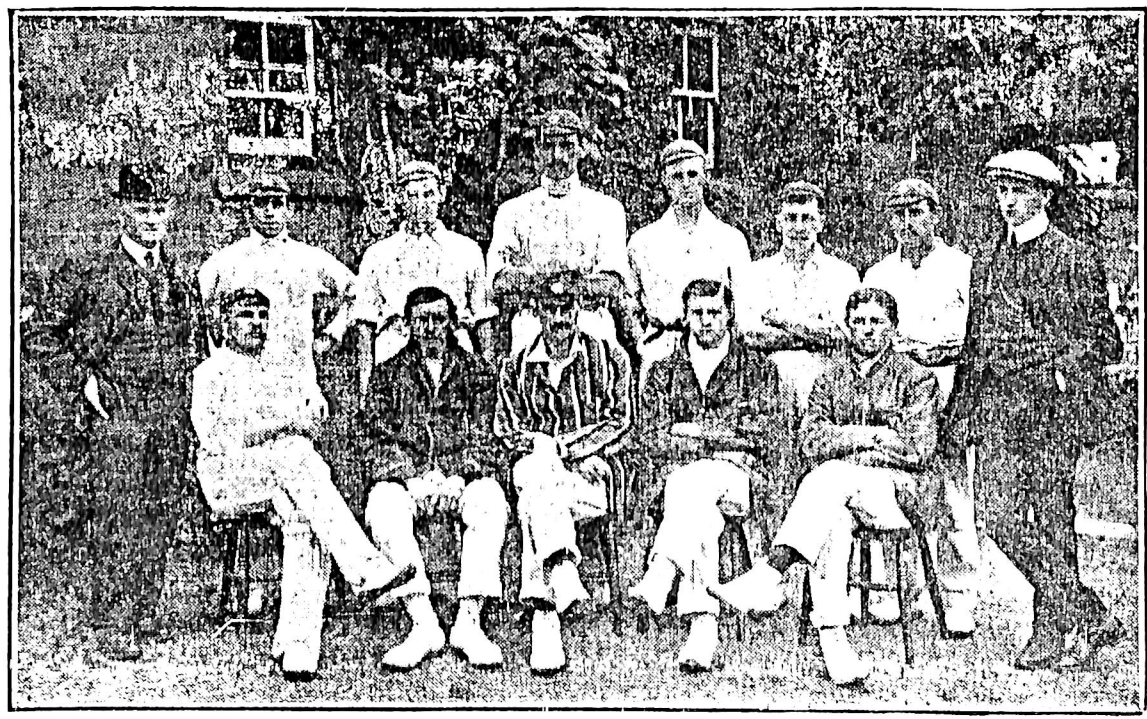

GLAMORGAN V. NOTTS 2nd.
MINOR COUNTIES' SEMI-FINAL AT
CARDIFF TO-DAY.

One of the most interesting matches in local cricket this season will be that played between Glamorgan and Notts Seconds on the Cardiff Arms Park to-day, to-morrow, and Wednesday. For the third year in succession the Glamorgans have succeeded in reaching the semi-final, and by their consistency have established a record in the Minor Counties' Championship. This will be the first time for a Nottinghamshire team to play on the Cardiff Arms Park, and the match is invested with exceptional interest on account of the fact that among the visitors will be a youngster who is not yet out of his teens, and who last week won the enviable achieve-

ment of making a century. In the event of Glamorgan winning this match they will enter into the final with Wiltshire or Surrey Seconds as their opponents, and the match will probably be played at Cardiff.
As a result of the unbroken sequence of Glamorgan's performances in the Minor Counties' Championship, there is a strong and a very natural feeling that some serious effort should be made by which the premier Welsh county should be included in the first-class counties, and before the next season is inaugurated it is probable that steps will have been taken to place Glamorgan on a level with the leading first-class counties of England.
In this week's match the home side will be captained by Arthur Gibson, to whom every praise is due for the skillful way in which he has led his side this season, especially in view of the fact that he had to take the place of such a fine cricketer as J. H. Brain.
The Glamorgan team will consist of the

following: A. Gibson (captain), Norman Riches, J. R. Sweet-Escott, the Hon. Archer Windsor Clive, and H. G. Symonds, with Bancroft, Crobat, Nash, Hacker, Prosee, and Maxwell.
Wickets will be pitched at 11.30 this (Monday) morning, and at eleven o'clock on Tuesday and Wednesday. Admission to the ground can be gained through both gates at sixpence, and boys will be admitted at half price. Ample accommodation has been provided, and, inasmuch as considerable expense has been incurred by the Glamorgan Club Committee in securing the match for Cardiff, it is to be hoped that their enterprise will be rewarded with a liberal measure of public patronage. The M.C.C. umpires will be H. Wainley (Leeds) and G. Hutchings (Chapeltown). The Notts men arrived in Cardiff by the 9.25 train on Sunday evening, and were met at the station by Mr. W. G. Bowden, the hon. secretary of the Glamorgan Club.
