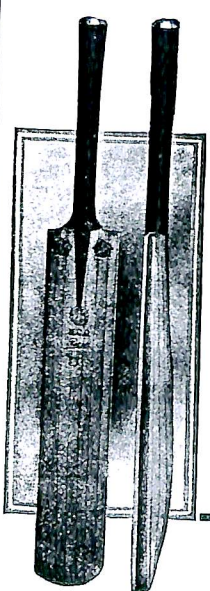

NOTTS. II. v. DURHAM.

Notts. II. opened a Minor Counties' match against Durham at Sunderland yesterday. Winning the toss, Durham went in first, starting with a fine partnership that produced 101 runs. For his 71 Turnbull played fast, but not risky, cricket. The only other man to make a good score was Bradford, who got 53, after a very shaky opening. The last five wickets only produced two dozen runs, Iremonger, in his second bowling spell, getting five victims for 3 runs. In consequence of the tail-end collapse, the Durham score was not nearly as big as it ought to have been.

On Notts. batting, James was disposed off before any score was made, but Morris hit splendidly for his 51, before being bowled by a very fast ball from Smith, who got five wickets for 40 runs. The Notts. men batted in a poor light towards the end of the day's play, and so far close had lost eight wickets for 113 runs. Score and analysis:-

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

NOTTS. II. v. DURHAM.

Play in the second day in the match between Durham and Notts. II. at Carley Hill, Sunderland, yesterday was very slow. The Notts. first innings soon concluded, 84 runs behind their opponents, who in their second venture did not do so well as on Monday, Turnbull and Bradford being got rid of very cheaply. The principal scorer being J. Bewick who took two hours and a quarter to knock up 44. This gives some idea of the general slow batting by the Durham men, Iremonger and Clifton being very difficult to play, though the latter could not get many wickets. Iremonger's deliveries led to catches in the slips, and consequently had to be watched very carefully. Smith played lively cricket for 25, but the whole side were out for 175, leaving Notts. two and a half hours to bat and 269 runs to make to win.

The visitors started badly, James being disposed of in the first over, and thus bagging a brace. Morris was bowled at 26, and 8 runs later J. K. Lane was given out to a very doubtful catch in the slips. About 4 o'clock it became windy and very cold, and rain stopped play, which was abandoned altogether with the Notts. score at 45 for three wickets, and the game in an interesting state. Durham thus won the points on the first innings. Score and analysis:-

DURHAM v. NOTTS 2nd.

Dunelmians Well Placed in the Match at Wearmouth.

Durham and Notts 2nd met at Carley Hill, Southwick, Sunderland, yesterday, the weather at the commencement being somewhat dull. The attendance at the start was only moderate, when Durham, winning the toss, sent in A. E. Walker and Turnbull against the bowling of Barnes and Clifton.

At the outset the batsmen played cautiously. In a very short time, however, the score had gone up to 39, when Iremonger took the ball in the place of Clifton. Runs after this did not come so quickly, the half-century being reached after half an hour's play. Stapleton was at this stage injured, a delivery from Iremonger catching him in the face. As a consequence he had to retire, Durham sending in Thackeray to fill the vacancy amongst the fielders.

Turnbull reached his half century in fifty-five minutes, and at 86 Lee was put on to bowl in the place of Clifton, who had resumed after a short rest. The century was soon raised, but Iremonger soon after obtained Walker's wicket, the Darlington player being caught at first slip by Armstrong with the total at 101. At 105 Turnbull was caught by the wicket-keeper, Whysall, his score including thirteen 4's. Kinch was twice almost caught when other ten had been added to the total, the first by Armstrong and the second by Barnes. Clifton again took over the bowling in the place of Iremonger, and his second ball clean bowled Kinch when that player had obtained 10. In the same over J. Bewick was also bowled by Clifton, the score being then 163. At luncheon time Durham had scored 165 for four wickets, Bradford playing steadily.

Play was later delayed for an hour and twenty minutes owing to a heavy fall of rain. It was resumed at 3.30, but the partnership had not lasted long when Bradford's fifty went up. Both batsmen were hitting freely, Bradford being the more productive. Iremonger again went on to bowl in the place of Clifton, and his second ball proved the downfall of Bradford, who was taken by Lee, after having contributed a valuable 58. T. Coulson next joined Proud, but the first ball delivered was neatly placed into Armstrong's hands. Morris quickly lost his partner, Proud, a minute or two later, and the partnership between Smith and Morris was of short duration, Morris being caught by Staunton. Thackeray was next at the wicket, and, as in the previous case, his partner was caught by Lee. I. Robinson only stayed whilst Thackeray obtained his thirteen, and then he was caught in the slips by Stapleton, the Durham innings closing with a total of 220.

The Notts innings commenced at 4.55 with J. K. Lane and James, while Durham put on Morris and Turnbull to bowl. The first ball delivered by Morris sent James back to the pavilion, Robinson being responsible for a very smart catch. C. R. Morris joined Lane, and the pair between them produced 34 runs, when Smith took over the bowling, vice Turnbull. The first ball clean bowled Lane, whose total was eight. Iremonger then partnered C. R. Morris, and the pair speedily carried the total to 79, when C. R. Morris was bowled by Smith, after obtaining 51. With one run to his credit the Rev H. Staunton was given out leg before, to be followed later by Iremonger, who was bowled by Smith with the score at 88.

Stapleton, who followed, was dismissed in a similar manner for three runs. Close on time, Lee was bowled by Bewick, who had taken the place of Smith. With the last ball of the day Morris took Armstrong's wicket. Details:—
