GLAMORGAN WON BY AN INNINGS AND 73 RUNS

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

CORNWALL v. GLAMORGAN.

In ideal cricket weather these counties commenced their two-days' engagement at Penzance yesterday. Cornwall won the toss and elected to bat. Blackwell and Trevarthen opening to the bowling of Nash and Maxwell. In the fifth over Trevarthen was run out. Barrie Bennetts followed, and after playing himself in, showed bright cricket, cutting and driving Maxwell for 4's in successive balls. The latter, however had his revenge, for when apparently well set he removed his off-stump, Bennetts playing on. Bennetts' 26 included four 4's. Blackwell was joined by H. Treasawa. Overaid cricket by these two brought a change of bowling. Craber for Maxwell, and in the newcomer's third over, Craber was early taken by Nash at slip after a punstaking 35, which included three 4's and seven 2's. J. C. Bickford-Smith early played on to Nash, four wickets falling at 84. H. Hawken followed and out Craber for 4, and followed this up by snickling Nash for a like number. This brought up the 100, but immediately afterwards Hawken was caught by W. B. Bancroft. After lunch A. E. Mayrick and Treasawa were associated, but after ten minutes' play Craber found a weak spot in the latter's defence, causing his retirement for a well-played 44. Whitting, Trevarthen, and H. Williams brought up the rear. The former obtained 18 in dashing fashion. Whittington and Sweet Escott opened play for Glamorgan to the bowling of Trevarthen and Trevenen. In the early stages the former was let off by Blackwell at slip, a mistake which ultimately proved expensive. Whittington was dismissed for 43, but without effecting a separation. Mayrick was then tried. At 68 the scores were equally divided between the batsmen, while half-an-hour later each had obtained fifty. At length to one of Whitting's Sweet-Escott was snapped up in the slips by Trevarthen. His innings was without flaw, and he was loudly cheered for his 61, which included five 4's and five 3's. W. Bancroft followed, and by a 5 (all run) equalled the Cornish total. His next two hits were boundaries. Tall hitting was here the order of the day, and Bancroft capped all by a six, and in his forty minutes stay scored 57. Immediately following this welcome dismissal Whittington was cleverly caught and bowled by Trevenen, his excellent innings of 92 including eight 4's. R. Rees and H. G. Symonds were now associated, and the latter when striking dislocated his shoulder, and was attended on the field by Dr. Symonds. Glamorgan's score now stands at 215 for 4 wickets. Scores:

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

CORNWALL, DEFEATED BY GLAMORGAN.

With 86 in hand, Glamorgan continued their first innings at Penzance yesterday in brilliant weather. Rees and Hacker opposing the bowling of Whiting and Hawken. After adding 37, the partnership was dissolved by Rees putting one up to Bickford-Smith. Maxwell filled the vacancy, and after driving Hawken to the boundary, a series of byes brought up 300. Five runs later Hacker was beautifully taken at point by Blackwell, having put together a well-hit 47. Nash followed and had his middle stump removed by the first ball from Whiting. J. Bancroft shaped in do or die style, and commenced well by on-driving Whiting for 3, but a ball later got Maxwell taken in the slips by Whiting. Craber brought up Whiting twice in the next over. Craber emulated the example by treating Hawken in a like manner, 14 in one over. Bancroft was badly missed by Bickford-Smith. This punishment of the bowling brought on Trevarthen, whose third ball Craber on-drove to the boundary. The next ball he was easily stumped, the innings closing for 356, leaving Cornwall 190 in arrears. Cornwall, in their second innings, sent in Blackwell, who was secured by Rees in the slips when only 2 were subscribed. The captain and Trevarthen had a brief partnership, but at 20 the latter skied one to Rees, two wickets being down for 43. Mayrick made a better show, but after being given a life by Sweet-Escott, the mistake was amply redeemed by a magnificent catch in the long field. Vihart was treated in a like manner by Rees with the first ball. Only Treasawa appeared able to resist the deadly and all too tempting bowling of Craber. Bennetts and Hawken fell for 3 and 2 respectively. Whiting only stayed long enough to add 4, but Treasawa here reached his 60 amid cheers, but was shortly after clean bowled by Nash for 60. Trevenen and H. Williams were the last two, Nash bowling the latter with the second ball. The innings closed for 126, leaving Glamorgan victorious by an innings and 73 runs.

The first day's play in connection with this match at Penzance, on Wednesday, went all in favour of Glamorgan, who scored 113 for the loss of only four wickets, in reply to Cornwall's total of 157.

On Thursday Rees and Hacker continued the innings, and took the score to 356 before a separation was effected. Creber and Bancroft also made useful scores, and the venture realised 356.

Opening their second innings 119 in arrear, the Cornishmen again failed. As in the first innings, H. Treawna was top-scorer, with 65. Trevarthen and Meyrick were the only other batsmen to reach double figures, the efforts of the remaining eight batsmen totalling 18. Scores and bowling analysis:—

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

CORNWALL v. GLAMORGAN

Glamorgan continued their tour in connection with the Minor Counties Championship and opened a 2 days' match at Penzance on Wednesday against Cornwall, after defeating Devon by the narrow margin of nine runs at Exeter on Tuesday. The home team won the toss, and H. Blackwell and Trevorthen faced the deliveries of Nash and Maxwell, Trevorthen treated Nash's opening over with the utmost respect, a maiden resulting. Blackwell placed Maxwell nicely for a couple of 2's, and the batsmen seemed like settling down, when Trevorthen was most unfortunately run out. Only eight runs had been scored, and of these Trevorthen's share was three. Barris Bennetts succeeded the Helston pro., and runs came now more freely. Bennetts was playing with freedom and vigour, but, after placing Maxwell to the boundary with two successive balls, the latter took his middle stump, the Penzance man playing on. Bennetts' 26 included four 4's and a 2, Cornwall's total being 46. H. Treaawna, who is captaining the home county, then partnered Blackwell, and steady play was the order. The first 50 had gone up in three-quarters of an hour. Blackwell continued to add to his total, but when he had made 35 he was well taken at slips by Nash. His innings had included three 4's and seven 2's. J. C. Bickford-Smith's stay at the wickets was brief, he being beaten in playing back to Nash, after scoring three. Hawken and Vibart did not offer much opposition, but Treaawna batted very carefully. At lunch the score was 118 for six.

Treaawna (not out 88) and Meyrick (not out 0) resumed after lunch before a growing crowd of spectators. Creber and Nash had charge of the attack. Extreme caution was exercised by both batsmen, only three runs coming from the first three overs. The first boundary came from Meyrick, who off-drove Nash finely for four. Creber required a lot of watching, evidently getting a lot of work on the ball. Meyrick had a fortunate escape in Creber's next over, Maxwell failing to hold a one-handed catch at mid-off and the next ball—a full toss—presented a possible chance to the same fieldman, the ball going away fairly high. The slow-bowler in his next over proved too much for Meyrick, who after driving him for two, was caught at backward point by Whittington off a full toss. The score was 135, when Whiting joined his captain and hit Creber into the deep field for a single. With the score at 140 Treaawna lost his wicket to Creber. The Cornish captain had batted steadily, having gone in at the fall of the second wicket. Trevorthen came next and refused to be tempted by Creber's slowness, and curiously enough this was the first maiden over sent down by the slow bowler. Whiting cut Nash high over point for three, and just after got a lucky snick through the slips for four. Trevorthen survived a unanimous appeal for a catch behind the wicket in Creber's next over and Whiting sent the 150 up by chopping Nash to leg for a couple. Two balls later he pulled Nash to the on-boundary for four and next ball out him hard for three. Off the first ball of his next over Whiting was safely held at deep cover by Rees, though only partially getting hold of Creber. Williams failed to open his account and the score closed for 157.

Whittington and Sweet-Escott opened for Glamorgan, Trevorthen and Trevorthen sharing the bowling. Runs came freely at the start. Sweet-Escott once getting the Penzance man through the slips beautifully, although the first and second slip were certainly at fault. Bickford-Smith was responsible for smart ground work at third man, but Blackwell who occupied this position for Trevorthen's bowling failed to hold a right handed catch from a hard out by Whittington. Sweet-Escott also got one up in the slips from Trevorthen, but Trevorthen failed to get at a swiftly travelling ball with his left hand. The score was carried to 40 without a separation and Whiting then took the ball from Trevorthen, and nine runs later B. Williams relieved Trevorthen.

Runs came slower after this, Whiting sending down two "maidens" in succession. The batsmen, however, played most confidently, and another change was tried at 68, Blackwell coming on vice Williams. Vibart was keeping wicket remarkably well, standing up close to all bowlers, and he was frequently applauded for the manner in which he took some awkward balls on the leg side. Whiting was bowling splendidly, his first nine overs containing five "maidens," and only 10 runs being knocked off him. The Cornish captain marshalled all his forces to the attack and Meyrick was the next to take a turn with the leather in place of Blackwell. With the score at 93 Sweet-Escott almost lost his wicket. He cooked a rising ball from Whiting up in front of him. Vibart galloped round the batsman in an attempt to reach the ball, but fell with his fingers almost on the leather. It was an exceedingly difficult chance. Meyrick proved very expensive and the century was soon hoisted. Whittington now began to score much the faster and a couple of beautiful cuts off Whiting sent up the 120. The Penzance pro. had Sweet-Escott in difficulties and at length got him caught at first man. This wicket was put on 137 runs of which the retiring batsman claimed 61. Sweet-Escott had batted with great patience and his five fours and five threes. Bancroft (W.) came next and sent up the 150 by hitting Whiting to the bowling screen. Off the next ball he obtained 5 (three for an over) and gave Glamorgan the lead. Bancroft showed little respect for the bowl-

ing and sadly disfigured Whiting's analysis. One half-volley from Trevorthen he despatched to a neighbouring field. This brought Trevorthen on again in place of the Helstonian, but this had little effect on Bancroft who reached his 50 and hoisted the second century simultaneously. Five runs later Whiting knocked his leg stump down. Bancroft had made his runs at a tremendous pace, hitting a six, a five, and nine fours. At 211 Whiting claimed his third victim, beating Rees, who had failed to open his score. As Whittington approached his century he slowed down considerably, but when he had made 92 Trevorthen caught and bowled him. The retiring batsman, baring the chance to Blackwell early in his innings, played perfect cricket and hit eight fours. Synons came next and was most unfortunate. Guarding himself from a short pitched ball by Trevorthen he dislocated his shoulder. The batsman flung his bat up quickly and in doing this put his shoulder out. Drs. Synons and Lawry attended him and put the limb back, and Synons had to be assisted to the pavilion. Rees and Hawken played out time, the Glamorgan score then being 243 for five wickets, the former being 11 not out, and the latter 21.

THURSDAY'S PLAY.

Glamorgan continued their batting on Thursday in beautiful weather, Hawken and Whiting bowling. Cricket was extremely slow, the score creeping up mostly by singles, but both batsmen got Whiting prettily to leg. Rees, in particular, scored largely by this stroke, and in the end this brought about his dismissal, Blackford-Smith making a nice catch at rather deep mid-on. The morning's cricket had carried the score from 243 to 281. Hawken was bowling splendidly and frequently bent the batsmen—and the wicket-keeper—at the same time. Hawken was dismissed at 807 by a smart one handed catch at point by Blackwell when only requiring three for his 50. Whiting met with further success, bowling Nash with the first ball he gave him. Maxwell was the next to go, Whiting catching him in the slips. Bancroft and Creber gave some trouble, hitting at everything that turned up, one over from Hawken yielding 14 runs. Bickford-Smith missed Creber and Bancroft out successive overs from Hawken and Whiting, but there was some excuse for the first attempt. Trevorthen came on vice Hawken and after Creber had pulled him for four Vibart stumped the batsman, Creber walking down the pitch to meet him.

Cornwall began their second venture 100 runs in arrears. Blackwell and Treaawna opened and off the last ball of Nash's first over W. Bancroft missed Blackwell in the slips. The captain placed Creber to the on-side beautifully for three, and then the first disaster befell the Cornishman, Blackwell, in reaching forward to Nash, being taken at first man. Trevorthen had a lucky escape off the second ball he received, getting one up in the slips, but neither Bickford-Smith nor Bancroft made any attempt to reach the ball. The Helstonian then got Nash through the slips nicely for four, and when opposed to Creber twice batted him past cover point to the boundary. Bancroft gave Trevorthen another life after this at third man, failing to hold a hard out off Nash's bowling. He did not stay long, however, Creber dismissing him in his next over. The Helstonian had certainly improved Cornwall's position during his stay, and his innings was entirely composed of fours. Cornwall's cup was not full yet, for in this over Bickford-Smith lost his wicket in attempting to turn a straight one to leg. Treaawna and Meyrick were together at lunch, the score being 66, Treaawna 17, Meyrick 6.

The 70 soon appeared after lunch, boundaries from both batsmen living matters up. Bancroft lost a possible chance of stumping Treaawna, who in jumping out at Creber, had the ball, but the wicket-keeper, fortunately for him, failed to hold the leather. Meyrick, too, was let off. Sweet-Escott dropping a running catch in the deep field. Meyrick's persistent attempts to punish Creber proved his undoing, Sweet-Escott bringing off a magnificent one-handed catch on the deep-field boundary. Vibart, who came next, immediately lost his wicket. Rees holding a lofty drive at deep cover. Treaawna was playing capital cricket, keeping everything on the ground, his playing being extremely accurate. Bennetts opened his account by driving the slow bowler for 2, and followed this with a single, and Treaawna then smashed Creber to the leg boundary, sending up 80. Bennetts then left, Creber deluging his off ball.

Hawken only added a couple when Creber bowled him, the ball dropping on to his wicket from his body. Whiting has to thank Rees for allowing him to "break his duck," the felder dropping a fairly easy catch at extra cover. Treaawna sent up the century by driving Creber to the boundary. At 109 Nash clean bowled Whiting. With Trevorthen in the score crept slowly up, and at 120 Creber made a good attempt to hold a hot return from the Penzance man. Treaawna reached his 50 with a cut past point and was warmly applauded for a splendidly defensive innings. Trevorthen was given another life a few runs later off Creber's bowling, Nash letting him off at first man. At 127 the Cornish captain was out, a ball from Nash coming across and taking his leg stump. Treaawna had batted right through the innings and looked like carrying his bat through Williams, the last man in, was bowled the same over, and the Cornishmen were defeated by an innings and 78 runs.
