BARNES IRRESISTIBLE.

A Northumbrian Collapse Against Staffordshire Bowler.

Northumberland County started their away programme with a somewhat weak batting team, J. Gillman, F. W. Gillespie, and O. F. Messinger-Leathes all being absent. O. M. Skinner, who won the toss, elected to bat. With 21 for one wicket there was nothing unusual in the state of things, but a remarkable collapse followed, Barnes, aided by several splendid catches, being the main cause of the destruction. The first, second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth wickets all fell at the same total. Nine wickets were down for 51, but Eley and Marshall added a useful 49 for the last wicket. The latter was first in and last out, and was to be sympathized with on not having the pleasure of carrying his bat through the innings. At the fall of the sixth wicket Barnes had taken five wickets for seven runs, and at the ninth eight for 14, but the last wicket somewhat spoiled his figures.

Skinner and Milne opened the bowling when Staffordshire went in. Ullathorne brilliantly stumped Briggs; Hollowood was caught at square leg. Foreday and Nicholls, however, added 45 for the fourth wicket, albeit Skinner and Milne got through the batsmen's defence repeatedly, only to narrowly miss the wickets. Stratton in one over had three boundaries to his credit for lucky snicks through the slips.

The innings eventually realized 38 more than that of the visitors, who fielded brilliantly.

Northumberland again commenced badly, four wickets being down for 20. R. Foster was again sent in early, however, and this time he succeeded in participating in fruitful fifth and sixth wicket partnerships. W. G. Brown was responsible for the finest innings of the day, pulling driving, and cutting superbly, Barnes, among others, coming in for punishment. With Foster he added 30 in quarter of an hour. He was eight out after batting thirty minutes, the innings realising 121.

# CRICKET AT STOKE.

## Second Class Counties Competition.

### STAFFORDSHIRE v. NORTHUMBERLAND.

Home Team Victorious:

Triumphant by Four Wickets.

#### THE SELECTED TEAM TO MEET CHESHIRE.

STOKE, Tuesday.

Going in for a second time at 4.35 yesterday afternoon, Northumberland were all out again shortly before half-past six for 121, and as the visitors had been 38 behind on the first innings, Staffordshire were left to get 84 in order to win the match. Yesterday, so many as 30 wickets fell for an aggregate of 319 runs, and although this did not leave any hope for a full second day's play, those who were fortunate enough to be present on the opening day must have been delighted with the quality of the cricket and the amount of entertainment provided. Once more Barnes was the hero, and one will never tire of singing the praises of so talented an exponent of the game. In each of the Northumberland innings he took eight wickets, and in spite of the fact that during the association of Brown and Foster, late in the afternoon, he was hit for 17 in one over, at the close of play he had to his credit the remarkable figures of 16 wickets for 93 runs. To take 16 wickets in a county match for Staffordshire is a record for Barnes, and a record of another kind was to be knocked for 17 in one over.

#### PLAY RESUMED.

The continuance of the match was delayed owing to several showers, and it was half past eleven before the players came out. P. Briggs and Hollowood again opened the Staffordshire innings, and Milne and Skinner bowled. When six had been scored Hollowood reached out to Milne and was strumped. Just after the arrival of H. D. Stratton, rain came on again, and an adjournment to the pavilion was made. The delay lasted twenty minutes, and then both Briggs and his captain began to play steadily, and a number of singles preceded a splendid pull to the leg boundary by the Stoke man. This he immediately followed with another four off Skinner's next ball, and then both batsmen got a single off Milne. Marshall took the ball from his captain at the railway end, when the total was 25. Briggs made his score into 20 out of 30, and was then caught at third man. Fereday came next, and a number of singles were stolen; Fereday once only just getting home when his partner gave him a short run. When thirteen successive singles had been run, Marshall's place in the attack was taken by Carr, and he more was scored in his initial over. The home side then required 40 to win. After the sixteenth single Mr. Stratton got Carr away for a couple, but in this bowler's next over the captain skied the ball to mid-on and had to retire.

With Nichols in, Fereday caused the half century to be hoisted, but at 55 he lost the late Oldfields professional, and Barnes became his partner. Fereday greeted the new comer by lifting Carr into the tennis courts, and another single in the same over placed the home eleven within 24 of victory.

#### STAFFORDSHIRE SUCCESSFUL.

But at 68 the fifth wicket fell; Fereday giving a hard return to the bowler, and Elsey completed the catch at the second attempt. After J. W. Johnson came in, there was a spell of quiet play before Barnes pulled Elsey to the rails. Four singles made the score 76, and then Barnes gave a very difficult chance in the slips. The score reached 80 by means of two singles to Barnes and a couple to the Uttoxeter amateur, but without addition the latter was caught at the wicket in attempting a big hit. Bucknell filled the breach, and with a single and a drive for four off his bat, the match was won. Thus Staffordshire triumphed by four wickets, and they have therefore benefitted to the fullest extent by their first two engagements.

#### Brilliant Bowling by Barnes:

EIGHT WICKETS FOR 38.

#### Cheap Dismissal of the Visitors

#### HOME SIDE'S HOPEFUL OUTLOOK.

STOKE, Monday.

Among the many improvements which have been and are being made on the County ground, perhaps the most important is the erection of a modern scoring-board, similar to those seen on some first-class county grounds. The new board has been put up during the last few days, and it first came in use to-day on the occasion of the visit of Northumberland in the second of the championship matches on the Staffordshire card. The small crowd present at the start seemed to take a deep interest in the innovation, and there is no doubt that it will be found to be very valuable as a help to following the game by all who attend the matches.

#### SOME SMART CATCHING.

The first half-hour's play was of the most sensational description. Northumberland won the toss, and commenced with Lieutenant H. Cooper and Marshall, and the pair put on 21 before the bowlers—Barnes and Lane—could claim any victims. But without addition six wickets fell! The first man to leave was Lieutenant Cooper, who was wonderfully well taken round to leg, by Lane, who was making his debut for the county. Two deliveries later Barnes spread-eagled the sticks of Carr, the Newcastle United footballer, and then Lane sent down a maiden. With the help of Lane, Hollowood, and Bucknell, the Test match hero then continued his work of destruction, and in a maiden over he got three more wickets. The batsmen tried hard to get him to leg, but Hollowood and Lane were there, and they brought off two very fine catches, which dismissed Milne and N. R. E. Wilkinson. Then R. Foster lifted Barnes towards the tennis courts, but Bucknell took the ball excellently, and half the side were out in twenty-eight minutes. Barnes was very heartily cheered upon the accomplishment of this marvellous performance; and at this time he had taken five wickets for seven runs. When Lane went on again he clean bowled Richardson with the first ball of another maiden over. The sixth wicket fell on the completion of half-an-hour's play.

#### PROFITABLE LAST WICKET.

Marshall then found a partner in W. G. Brown while 16 runs were added, and with the score at 36 the amateur was well caught at cover-point by Fereday. This brought in C. M. Skinner, the visitors' captain, and with the addition of one more run Mee bowled at the pavilion end instead of Lane. The score had reached 45 when the skipper skied the ball in front of him, and Barnes, racing up the pitch, made the catch. The half-century had been passed by one, when T. Ullathorne got under a seemingly nice ball from the Porthill man, but, like Foster, he found Bucknell was waiting for it, and another splendid catch was added to the list. The last wicket pair were troublesome, and runs were registered in an alarming manner, Barnes once being hit for ten in one over. At 69 the first missed chance of the innings occurred, Nichols dropping a catch at square leg, from Eisey, off Mee. Two runs later Bucknell was put on at the Norton professional's end. The left-hander, Marshall, got most of the bowling, but at last a single to Eisey brought the latter face to face with Barnes, and after being in difficulties with one ball he pulled the next to the pavilion, and then got a single. When Bucknell went on again, however, Marshall was caught in the slips, and the innings, which had lasted an hour and forty minutes, closed just before

quarter past one for 90; the last pair having added 39 in twenty-five minutes.

The features of the play had been the further successful bowling of Barnes and the excellent fielding of the whole side. With all his well-known cunning, the All-England bowler always had the batsmen in trouble until the last two made their stand, and then Marshall displayed a little more confidence in dealing with him. Lane, who bowls a good fast ball, had displayed good form, and he was remarkably keen in the field.

#### HOME SIDE AT THE CREASE.

Staffordshire had one over and scored two runs before lunch, and then, upon the resumption, the first wicket fell when only seven had been scored; P. Briggs reaching out at Milne, left his ground, and Ullathorne had the wicket broken before he could get back. Four runs later, Hollowood, who had opened the venture with Briggs, was caught at square leg in attempting to repeat a stroke by which he had just got a boundary. H. D. Stratton and Fereday were then together, but the latter got his leg in front of a straight ball from Milne, and the third wicket fell with a dozen runs scored; which was an exceedingly bad start. The captain got two somewhat lucky fours through the slips off Skinner, who had opened the bowling with Milne, and then with an off-drive found the rails at the expense of the other bowler. Again getting his rival captain through the slips to the fence, the skipper made his score 17. Nichols then began to hit, and 37 runs were added within less than twenty minutes of the commencement of the partnership. The 50 was signalled with the innings forty minutes old, Nichols being responsible for the run that completed the half century. At 51 Eisey went on in place of Skinner at the railway end. After the new bowler had sent down one over, Mr. Stratton faced Milne again and was stumped off the last ball; some doubt surrounding the decision. The wicket had added 45 by splendid cricket in twenty-five minutes. Barnes was given a warm reception by the crowd, who had increased in numbers to about 2,000 after the interval. His partnership with Nichols did not last long, for the latter had his bails removed at 65, and half the side had thus been dismissed. J. W. Johnson, the young Oldfields player, who has been showing good form recently, was the next comer, and he and Barnes batted steadily until the visitors' total was passed, when the innings had progressed 75 minutes.
