CORNWALL v. MONMOUTH.

At Truro yesterday the home county fared badly in their match with Monmouth. The weather was dull and the wicket was a trifle soft. Tresawna won the toss and elected to bat first, but the Cornishmen put a sorry figure against the bowling of Phillips and Silverlock. After 48 minutes' play half the side were out for 38, and the remaining five wickets only produced five runs, the whole side being dismissed in an hour and five minutes for 41 runs. To say the small number of spectators were disappointed at this wretched display would be but to mildly express their feelings. The batsmen were quite powerless to stand up against Phillips' bowling, which was responsible for eight wickets for 14 runs, six men being clean bowled. Monmouth had 35 minutes' batting before lunch, and passed the home total without loss. In the first over after the interval Tresawna bowled Stratton, and brought to a close a partnership which had produced 40 runs. With the score at 61 Silverlock was dismissed by Trevarthen with a fine catch in the deep field. With the score at 77 for four, Hawken took three wickets in four balls, and he would have had four wickets in the over had Barry Bennetts not missed an easy catch given him by Williams. Things were looking bad for the visitors when Williams and Hudden became associated. They set up a strong partnership, fully mastering the bowling and scoring pretty freely, and carried the total to 178 before being separated. Barry Bennetts's miss proved a most expensive one for Cornwall, for it enabled Monmouth to get a lead which up to that point was certainly far from being anticipated. Williams having been bowled by Tresawna, the innings soon came to a close, and Cornwall were behind on the first innings by 148 runs. The visitors' innings occupied about two hours. Cornwall started their second venture at four o'clock, but with only 10 on the board the captain was clean bowled by F. G. Phillips. Trevarthen and W. N. Bleckford-Smith made things a bit more lively, the former getting several boundaries off Williams, and after 38 minutes the first innings' total was passed. The partnership realized 38 runs, and the half-century was hoisted in 43 minutes. With the score at 80 rain fell, and play was adjourned until to-day. Scores:--

MONMOUTH BEAT CORNWALL BY 8 WICKETS.

At Truro the home county lost this match by eight wickets. Cornwall were 148 behind on the first innings, and overnight had scored 40 for the loss of two wickets in their second venture, the not-outs being Trevarthen (17) and Meyrick (6). The home met made a far better show than in the first innings, and not only saved the innings' defeat, but put together the respectable total of 199, and thus gave Monmouth 51 to get to win. Meyrick only added one to his overnight score. Trevarthen was bowled by a no-ball in Phillips' first over, and he was let off at cover-point when 21, but fell a victim to Silverlock when he had completed 33. Five wickets were down for 97, and then Lubbock and J. C. Bleckford-Smith became associated and made a splendid stand. They both hit freely and added 64 before Lubbock placed a ball from Williams' the first delivery to him after an interval rendered necessary by a heavy downpour of rain into the hands of F. G. Phillips. His 47 runs included eight 4s, and were obtained principally by hard hitting. Bleckford-Smith scored 40 by good batting, the features of which were some straight drives and his excellent placing. The remaining batsmen gave little trouble. Monmouth were an hour knocking off the runs required to win. Their start was not promising, Stratton being easily taken in the slips off Hawken when only one run had been scored. At the luncheon interval the Westmen wanted 40 runs to win, and Silverlock and Dyer put on 34 after the resumption. The Minor Counties Championship match between Cornwall and Monmouth was opened at Truro yesterday. The home county, winning the toss, gave a wretched display, being disposed of in sixty-five minutes for the paltry score of 45. Three wickets were down for 15, and then Lubbock and Meyrick doubled the score. F. G. Phillips bowled with deadly effect, and the fielding was smart. The visitors passed Cornwall's score without loss, but had 7 wickets down for 77. Hawken captured three men in one over, and should have had a fourth, Bennetts missing W. A. Williams. The let off was an expensive one, for Hutton and Williams put on a century before a separation was effected. The end soon came, Richards taking the last two wickets with successive balls. In a minority of 146, Tressawna and W. N. Bickford-Smith opened Cornwall's second innings, and after the latter had had a narrow escape of being run out for a foolish run, Tressawna was bowled with the score at 10. Bickford-Smith and Trewarthen enlivened the proceedings, the latter making 19, mostly by hard drives, before being beaten by Silverlock. CORNWALL v. MONMOUTHSHIRE.

DISAPPOINTING DISPLAY BY THE HOME COUNTY.

Cornwall sustained their second defeat in this competition, at Truro, on Saturday, losing to Monmouth by eight wickets.

Cornwall won the toss on Friday, and decided to bat first, opening with H. Tressawna and W. N. Bickford-Smith. F. G. Phillips and Silverlock took up the trundling, and so well did they bowl that Cornwall were put out in just over an hour for 41 runs. The opening batsmen experienced considerable difficulty with the attack, a quarter of an hour's play resulting in 4 being hoisted for the loss of W. N. Bickford-Smith's wicket. The home captain did not long survive, being out for 10, with the total at 14. A smart catch by E. S. Phillips sent back Trevarthen, and three wickets were down for 16—Meyrick and Lubbock withstood the bowling for a while, and when the last-named left the score-board registered 31. Meyrick was the next to take his departure after making 12, which proved to be the top score of the innings. The last five wickets added five to the total, and the innings realised only 41.

The visiting batsmen opened in promising fashion, obtaining seven off Whiting's first over. The rate of scoring then, however, fell off, Hawken bowling six successive maidens. At 32 Tressawna took the ball from Whiting, but no success attended the trundler's efforts before lunch, when the Cornishmen's total had been passed without loss. After the interval a complete change came over the game, Tressawna capturing the first wicket with his second delivery. The total was increased by a dozen before Silverlock fell to a catch by Trevarthen. Twelve more were added when E. S. Phillips was caught by W. N. Bickford-Smith, and at the same total Williams was bowled by Tressawna. Then Hudden added a boundary, but another collapse took place, three wickets falling at the same total in four balls by Hawken. Seven for 77. W. A. Williams with his score at four sent a catch to B. Bennetts, but the Penzance man fumbled it badly—a mistake for which the home county paid dearly, no less than 100 runs being put on before a separation was effected. No vigorous was the hitting, that a change in the bowling was necessitated, Trevarthen relieving Hawken. The Helston pro. met with no success, and gave way to Richards, who captured the last two wickets with successive balls. Thus the venture closed for 187, leaving the Cornishmen 146 in arrears on the first innings.

The home county opened their second attempt at 4 o'clock, Tressawna being accompanied to the wickets, as on the former occasion, by W. N. Bickford-Smith. Disaster soon overtook them, for after "W. N." had been missed, Tressawna was bowled with the total at 10, of which he had contributed eight. A partnership between Bickford-Smith and Trevarthen improved the total by 36, when the former was sent back. Meyrick sent the 50 up with a pull to leg for four, but rain coming on after an hour's play, the game was abandoned for the day.

Play had not been long in progress on Saturday before Meyrick was dismissed. Lubbock joined Trevarthen who, with his score at 21, gave a catch to Hudden at point which was not accepted. At 91 Silverlock changed ends, and immediately beat Trevarthen without any addition to the score. Richards filled the vacancy caused by Trevarthen's dismissal, but returned to the pavilion shortly after for a "duck." Lubbock and J. O. Bickford-Smith came together at 97 and by powerful hitting the score was carried to 161 before the former was taken in the slips by F. G. Phillips for 47, which included eight 4s. Shortly after J. O. Bickford-Smith was out after a patient bowling, in which he took no liberties with the bowling. Vibart and Hawken added 7 and 4 respectively, whilst Bennetts also obtained 7, the innings closing for 196, setting the visitors 61 to win.

Monmouth started their comparatively easy task just before lunch, but soon lost Stratton with only one on the board. Both Silverlock and Diver played cautiously and a hour and a half was occupied in knocking off the required runs, though this was not accomplished before another wicket had fallen.
