**NORTHUMBERLAND'S CHANCE.**

**Dunelmians' Disastrous Day's Play at Jesmond.**

Northumberland gained a commanding advantage on the County Ground at Jesmond yesterday in the opening day's play of the first of their annual matches with Durham, and they were leading at the close by the large number of 126 runs on the first innings with four wickets still to go down. Many a time and oft in the past have the Northumbrians upon the first day in this engagement outplayed the Dunelmians to an extent promising well for victory on the second day, and too often have they collapsed in most unaccountable manner, and in the end suffered crushing reverse. Should the weather not interrupt play to-day, and last evening the conditions seemed more settled, the Northumbrians, if they do not succeed in pushing home the advantage they now hold to victory, should certainly, at the very least, secure the points for the lead on the first innings.

**DURHAM'S POOR START.**

To many of the two thousand people who were on the ground at half-past eleven it would come as a surprise to find the pitch not affected to an extent to prevent play commencing then by rain that had fallen from midnight until close upon nine o'clock. It was a very wet wicket, though, upon which Durham went in to bat first at twenty-five minutes to twelve, E. B. Proud acting as captain of the team, through T. Coulson being unfortunately indisposed and unable to leave his house, having won the toss and decided to go in first.

Very seasonal was the beginning of Durham's innings. In the absence of bright sunshine and with a good drying breeze blowing it did not seem likely that the bowlers would have the batsmen at all at their mercy, but (George Milne and C. M. Skinner, who opened Northumberland's attack, were practically unplayable for a time. With the total merely four J. Newick was out to Milne's bowling; at eight C. Adamson was caught at point by J. Gilman off Skinner's bowling, while at 28 both T. Kinch and A. P. Ashley were out to catches off the deliveries of Milne, against whom the batsmen could make no shape, his analysis now reading three wickets for seven runs.

A. E. Walker, who had gone in upon the fall of the first wicket, was now joined by E. B. Proud, and two runs more had been scored when rain caused a long stoppage. Play had been in progress three-quarters of an hour, and it was not until twenty-five minutes past two—luncheon having been taken half-an-hour earlier than usual—that a resumption was made. Durham fared little better for a time, Proud and the Rev J. A. Lush being out to successive balls from Skinner at 34, while at 50 Walker, who had steadily upheld his wicket for an hour, during which time he made merely four runs, was dismissed by a good catch at point by Gilman off Milne, this making seven wickets down for half a century of runs—a truly deplorable state of affairs for the Dunelmians.

**A GOOD PARTNERSHIP.**

Durham's innings, indeed, seemed on the point of being ended for a trifling score. An enterprising partnership, with force and fearlessness hitting that so often proves profitable after the failures of the recognized batsmen of the side, was now produced by Morris and Thackeray, however. Without a run being added, Morris had an escape of being dismissed, Richardson, running in from mid-off, failing to hold a catch off the bowling of Milne. In half an hour Morris and Thackeray actually doubled the score, Morris making some big hits, and the total was one beyond the century when the Sunderland professional struck a ball from the Rev H. White to Milne at mid-on. Morris' 37 included five 4's and one 5. The end to the innings soon came now, the remaining two wickets being captured with the score taken only to 104. Durham's venture having lasted an hour and forty minutes.

**ANDERSON'S MERRY INNINGS.**

The Northumbrians entered upon their response at five minutes past four, another but not very heavy shower of rain having fallen during the interval between the innings. C. F. Stanger-Leathes and Stan. Anderson opened the venture, and most entertaining was the beginning of the innings when Anderson four times got the ball to the boundary in Adamson's first over. When he had made 22 out of 29, however, Anderson, seemingly a little too anxious to continue his merry hitting, gave an easy chance to Thackeray, running in from the long field, off Morris' bowling. Richardson had a brief stay, being nicely caught in the slips by Morris off the bowling of Thackeray, while Stanger-Leathes, in for forty-five minutes for 15, was third out to a catch at the wickets off Morris, and E. W. Gillespie was fourth out at 65, with 17 scored, to another catch by Morris off Thackeray. Northumberland were not slaying too well so far for a lead of any note on the first innings.

**GILMAN'S BEST.**

Durham's score, however, was well passed before another wicket fell. The partner for the fifth wicket were J. Gilman and S. Nesbit, the former of whom, in the two club games he had played in this season, had not given much evidence of having settled down to his real form. He was quickly batting now, however, with the greatest confidence, and runs coming at a nice rate, the score was advanced by attractive cricket to 135—or 68 for the wicket in forty minutes—

before Nesbit, with a valuable 34 to his credit, was out to the bowling of Pinder. In making 15, Marshall assisted Gilman to send the score by other 62 runs up to 195, and then Milne stayed with Gilman till the close of play for the day, the Northumbrians in two hours and twenty-five minutes having completed 250 for the fall of six wickets. Gilman is but eight runs off the century, his chief hits so far being one 6 and fourteen 4's.

In the afternoon the crowd steadily increased to close upon 4,000, the play being followed with the greatest keenness. The resumption to-day is timed for 11 o'clock. Score—

**NORTHUMBERLAND WIN.**

**Durham Easily Defeated by Ten Wickets.**

The Northumberland county eleven easily pressed home the splendid advantage they had gained over Durham County on Monday at Jesmond, when they closed the day's play 126 runs ahead, with four wickets still to be captured, and a few minutes after four o'clock they had won a brilliant victory by the crushing margin of ten wickets.

The last occasion upon which Northumberland defeated Durham outright was in the year 1904 at Jesmond, when the features of play leading to the victory of the Northumbrians was the surprising but wicket-saving of E. Nicholas and eleven-wicket and the wonderful bowling of R. H. Gillespie, a Northumberland player now resident in London and unable to assist his native county. The scores in that match were:—Northumberland, 139 and 161; Durham, 172 and 90.

Though a light drizzle had fallen for some hours, it was found possible to resume play at twenty minutes past eleven. Twenty-five minutes proved sufficient to finish off the innings of the Northumbrians, in which 250 runs had been scored on Monday for the fall of six wickets in answer to Durham's score of 104. The remaining four wickets produced other 35 runs. The last ball of the opening over by Thackeray bowled Milne with four added to the score of 17 of the previous day, and then a useful stand was made when T. Ullathorne joined J. Gilman, who at the close of play on Monday needed only eight runs to reach the century. The eighth wicket ran the score to 265, Gilman's magnificent innings then closing for 105. Gilman, who was eventually bowled by Morris, was batting altogether a shade over two hours, his faultless display including principal hits of one 6 and fifteen 4's. The end of the innings quickly followed, the Rev H. White being clean bowled by Morris with the next ball, and C. M. Skinner suffering a like dismissal from Thackeray a run later. Ullathorne carried out his bat for 17, and Northumberland's innings of 264 had lasted altogether three hours and a quarter.

Durham commenced their second innings at a quarter-past twelve, and though steady partnerships were made in the opening stages of the venture the score reached only 162, thus averting an innings defeat by only two runs. The Dunelmians' second innings did not conclude until a quarter to four, and Northumberland's well-earned victory was completed a few minutes after four o'clock. Score—
