

CHESHIRE v. DURHAM

At Oxton, yesterday, before a fair crowd, Durham won the toss, and in their first innings scored 201 runs. This was mainly due to the batting of Bradford, who scored 70 in capital style, his principal hits being 7 fours, 2 threes, and 9 twos. The Cheshire team did but poorly in their first innings, and in their second innings of 102 just saving them from following. In their second innings of Durham they put on 114 runs, four wickets, and are consequently 112 runs and six wickets to fall. Present scores and analysis:-

MINOR COUNTIES.

Durham's Commanding Lead Over Cheshire.

The return match between Cheshire and Durham was commenced on the prettily-situated ground at Oxton, near Birkenhead, yesterday, in beautiful weather. Durham had three changes from the side which gained a handsome victory at Darlington over the Cestrians, Bewick, Smith, and Robinson playing instead of Russell, Gore, and Parkin, the same side playing as lost to Yorkshire and. Cheshire were at full strength, only two of the eleven which lost at Darlington playing on this occasion.

Coulson won the toss, and took first innings. Bradford and Proud, who laid the foundation of victory in the first match, again placed Durham in a commanding position by a prolonged partnership, but their example was not well followed by the later batsmen, the telegraph board going from 142 for three to 210 for ten.

The Cestrians saved the follow on by only one run, Smith and Thackeray proving too good for them. Hancock alone played confidently.

Durham hardly did so well in their second innings, but, leaving off 142 in front with six wickets in hand, possess a good chance of winning. Score:—

MINOR COUNTIES.

Durham's Second Victory Over Cheshire.

Bright balling characterized the closing day's play at Oxton yesterday, when Durham gained their second five-point victory over Cheshire. The game, as on the first day, fluctuated strangely, and if there had been anything in the nature of a collapse when the Durham score stood at 66 for six wickets in the second innings, Cheshire would doubtless have gained their first victory in the championship, and a fine one it would have been. On Wednesday, the first four wickets of the Durdhamians made the majority of runs, and yesterday Morris, Brooks, Smith, and Thackeray regained for their side the winning position they had previously held.

The Cestrians were left with the formidable task of getting 226 to win, with four hours and a half left for play. Hancock and Morris, by some splendid forcing cricket, sent up the 100 in sixty-five minutes, and W. Jones and Hamilton, playing stolidly later on in the innings, added 66 in ninety minutes, but after making a dogged fight the home county had to admit defeat by 82 runs. But for dropped catches in Cheshire's second innings, the margin of defeat would have been much greater. Score:—

COUNTY MATCH AT OXTON.

CHESHIRE v. DURHAM.

A good many years have elapsed since a county match was played in the Birkenhead area. It was eighteen years ago, in fact, that Cheshire met and defeated Worcestershire, then in the Minor Counties' division, on the ground of the Oxtou Club, and it was appropriate that that beautifully situated enclosure should have been chosen as the scene of a county encounter after such a lapse of time. This year, it will have been noted, a determined effort has been made to revive county cricket in Cheshire, and a very fair amount of success has been achieved both financially and in regard to the outcome of matches. On Wednesday and Thursday the Cheshire team met the Durham eleven in the Minor Counties' championship, and much interest was manifested in the event by local enthusiasts. It was most unfortunate that the match should have clashed with the Show, for this fact unquestionably seriously affected the gate. The attendance, however, was very fair on Wednesday, and some most enjoyable cricket was witnessed. The Oxtou Club Committee, and notably the captain, Mr. H. B. Hancock, had been at great pains to make the arrangements as near perfection as possible, and succeeded to admiration. A splendid pitch had been prepared by White, the groundman, and Mason, and wore finely throughout.

The match was a return fixture, and Cheshire had a defeat to avenge, for the men of Durham trounced them soundly earlier in the season, defeating the Cestrians by an innings and 100 runs.

The visitors won the toss, and made excellent use of their opportunity, putting up the capital score of 201.

The feature of the day's play was a fine partnership between T. A. Bradford and E. B. Proud on behalf of the visitors. The latter, who will be remembered as an amateur international goalkeeper, batted steadily, while Bradford hit cleverly, the feat of the latter's innings being splendid placing to leg and hard driving on both sides of the wicket. The pair came together when two wickets had fallen for 51 runs, and they were not separated until the score had reached 142. They put on 91 runs in 55 minutes without either giving a chance, and provided much the best batting of the day. Bradford, who was third to leave, hit up a splendid 70, which occupied him only an hour and 25 minutes, his principal hits being seven 4s, two 3s, and nine 2s. Proud made 25, other useful contributors being A. E. Walker (23) and T. Coulson (23). The most successful bowlers were Churton, of Broughton Hall, and Morrice, of Birkenhead Park.

Cheshire went in at half-past three, but the start was far from propitious. Mason, the Oxtou professional, was clean bowled after making five, and both R. M. Chadwick and K. D. R. Morrice, the Birkenhead Park cricketers, disappointed, the latter having his leg stump bowled before he had troubled the scorers, and the former, who never seemed comfortable falling a victim to a splendid ball after making ten. When R. H. Voss joined H. B. Hancock, however, the rot was stayed for a time. The Oxtou skipper played with delightful confidence and freedom, and was warmly applauded for several beautiful drives. Just when he seemed well-settled, unhappily, he mis-timed a ball from Thackeray and was splendidly taken in the slips. He had the satisfaction of making top score, however—29—and his success was exceedingly popular with the crowd. Voss was foolishly run out, and subsequently only the captain, the Rev. L. Hamilton, played the bowling with any confidence, the innings closing for 102, or 89 behind. The Durham bowling was admirable. Smith and Thackeray, the Middlebrough footballer, both having fine analyses.

During the hour's play that succeeded the Durham men lost a good part of their advantage, four wickets falling for 43 runs. In addition two bad mistakes were made, one by Mason and one off that bowler in the last over. Mason bowled well, but with ill-luck, and Churton was in grand form, having all the batsmen in difficulties.

THURSDAY'S PLAY.

The attendance was of very moderate proportions when the game was resumed on Thursday morning, but improved in the afternoon. The seriousness of the mistakes made overnight was quickly apparent, for the remaining batsmen rendered so excellent an account of themselves that the total reached 183 before the last man was disposed of. A valuable stand was effected by Morrice (57) and C. Brooks (28), and later Smith and Thackeray hit vigorously. Churton, who bowled so finely on Wednesday evening, again did well, whilst Mason kept a splendid length, always required watching, and was decidedly unlucky.

The Cheshire men were left with the formidable task of obtaining 283 runs, and although they failed they at least made a plucky attempt to get on terms with their

strong rivals. The start was not promising, Chadwick being bowled when only one run had been scored, but then H. B. Hancock was joined by Voss, and a capital stand was made. In the last over before lunch, unfortunately, Voss was given out l.b.w., and was manifestly disatisfied with the verdict. After lunch Morrice and Hancock hit merrily, and Cheshire hopes were rising high when the latter, in essaying a drive, was neatly caught. Once again the Oxtou captain played finely, and has every reason to be proud of his performance in the match. His 46 was a bright and vigorous display, and included a number of very fine drives. Subsequently the Rev. L. Hamilton and W. E. Jones became associated in a splendid stand, and the latter had the distinction of topping the half-century. When the pair were separated, however, the end soon came, the innings closing for 20. Durham has won a well-fought match by 82 runs. Score:—
