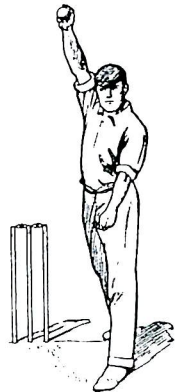

CRICKET.

Minor Counties Championship.

Lincolnshire v. Cambridgeshire.

Ideal weather prevailed when these counties met on the Black Swan enclosure, Spalding, on Wednesday and Thursday, in the Eastern Division of the Minor Counties Championship.

Of the side originally selected to represent the home county, Hibbert was prevented through illness from taking part in the match, and the eleven was completed by the inclusion of C. C. Harrison, until whose arrival A. S. Barlow fielded as substitute.

Winning the toss, Cambridgeshire decided to bat first on a slow wicket. Watts, the old Surrey cricketer, and Coulson opening the innings against the bowling of Cooke and Geeson. The first four overs produced only 3 runs, and at 6 Geeson bowled Coulson with a ball which pitched on the leg and took the off stump. With the score still unaltered, Broughton, who had gone on pace Cooke at the King's Road end, got Watts lbw., and directly after Allen failed to hold a sharp chance from Roberson off the same bowler.

The scoring was painfully slow, half-an-hour's cricket producing only ten runs. A magnificent one-handed catch by Broughton off a hot return from Roberson brought about the latter's dismissal at 22, but with Ling in some delightful hitting was witnessed, the new-comer forcing both Broughton and Geeson to the leg rails. In Broughton's next over, Ling hit three successive 4's, the 50 appearing at the end of an hour and twenty minutes.

Seven later, however, Riley, who had displaced Geeson, clean beat Bryan, the partnership having added 35. Three more wickets fell quickly, Riley, who was keeping a perfect length, dismissing Laurie and Ling with successive deliveries at 73. Ling's vigorous display included five 4's. At lunch time Cambridge had lost 7 wickets for 81, the not outs being Morgan (8), and Boccock.

Upon resuming, Morgan was missed at second slip off Riley's second ball, but at 91 Boccock was smartly run out, Allen whipping off the ball following a return by L. S. Harrison. The innings closed at 96, the last two wickets adding five. Riley came out with the remarkable analysis of 5 wickets for only 9 runs.

Lincolnshire commenced their innings at 3 o'clock, Thompson and Ward giving the home county a good start by scoring 33 in 35 minutes for the first wicket, Coulson then bowling Ward, who had batted well for his 19. Thompson left at 44, and L. S. Harrison and Riley were both dismissed at 52, the former being nicely taken at first slip.

Crookes at once set about the bowling, but at 70 he was caught in two minds, and latten by Coulson. The retiring batsman had scored 14 of the 18 runs made during his stay of 10 minutes. Broughton, who had gone in at the fall of the first wicket, continued to score freely, and he twice hit Coulson to the leg boundary in one over. Broughton lost Redwood at 95, but with Cooke in the Cambridge total was passed, the professional just previously offering a hard chance at mid-off.

A terrific drive by Broughton, off Coulson, which hit the top of the boards, and was within an ace of landing out of the ground, sent up the 100 at the end of an hour and a half, but six later Cooke got in front of a straight one from Coulson.

Broughton's fine innings was closed by a smart piece of stamping at 125, he having been batting altogether 70 minutes for his 51, which included nine 4's. The next wicket fell at 127, but Geeson and Allen stayed together an hour and 5 minutes to add 47 runs for the last wicket, Geeson carrying out his bat for a valuable 29.

Cambridge had half-an-hour's batting before play ceased for the day, and in that time lost 3 wickets for 39. In his second over, Broughton dismissed Morgan and Roberson with only 5 on the board, though afterwards B. W. Pigg and Bryan offered a sound resistance, and looked likely to play out time, but in the last over the latter was brilliantly run out, Riley stopping a hard drive from Pigg, and breaking the wicket before the batsman could get back.

Thirty nine runs in arrears, with seven wickets in hand, the visitors continued their second innings on the following morning, Pigg (28) and Coulson facing the bowling of Cooke and Riley. The wicket was more difficult than on the previous day, and the bowlers made the ball turn appreciably. Riley was unfortunate in beating and bowling Coulson with a "no ball" in his opening over, but the latter did not long survive his escape, being out "lbw." in the next over from Cooke, the 4th wicket falling at 53.

Pigg alone appeared to face the bowling with any confidence, but after batting superbly for 36 minutes, he had his leg stump removed by a beautiful ball from Riley. Of the 55 runs scored during his stay at the wicket, Pigg was responsible for no less than 41, his principal strokes being seven 4's.

Ling departed at the same total, and Laurie, after getting a single, was yorked by Riley, whilst a wonderful catch by Crookes near the on boundary dismissed Watts at 70. Boccock and C. Pigg, however, succeeded in passing the Lincolnshire total without further loss, but the last two wickets both falling at 84, the home county only required 7 to win. In obtaining these Lincolnshire lost two wickets, before L. S. Harrison made the winning hit, Cambridge being defeated by 2 wickets.

Riley came out with an excellent record for the match of 10 wickets for 35 runs. Scores and analysis: -

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

LINCOLNSHIRE v. CAMBRIDGESHIRE.

This fixture in the Minor Counties Championship took place at Spalding, on Wednesday and Thursday, Lincolnshire gaining an easy victory by eight wickets. Going in first, Cambridgeshire were all dismissed for 96, mainly owing to some particularly fine bowling by Riley, who had the remarkable analysis of five wickets for 9 runs, after sending down thirteen overs.
