Berkshire's Good Fight.

Berkshire made a capital struggle in their first match in the Minor Counties Championship against Bucks, being beaten by three wickets after holding a good lead in the first innings. To Berkshire's total of 147 in the first innings, Sir Charles Nepean, who has so long been a stalwart in Berkshire cricket, contributed 42, being top scorer in the match, and George Williams and Whichelow also did well. H. Barney, well known to local cricket, was given a place in the team, so that leading cricket was well represented. Bucks responded in the first attempt with 97, or 50 behind, for which Berkshire owe much to Hawkesworth, who captured 7 wickets for 46. Shoosmith had the other 3 for 47. Unfortunately, though holding this decided advantage, Berkshire failed to keep it at the second venture, for they were dismissed for the poor total of 98. Vickerstaff, who has come on wonderfully during recent seasons, was the chief factor in their discomfiture, taking 9 wickets for 54. Sir U. Nepean again proved of great service to his side, left with 144 to win Bucks at first second scarcely likely to achieve the task, but Vickerstaff's coolness took them through. The slower bowler has rarely done a better piece of work for his county. Hawkesworth again did excellent service with the ball, taking 6 for 46, or 19 for 144 for the match. It is evident that Berkshire will have to look to him for much service this season, and it was unfortunate that he was obliged to retire hurt against Surrey II before showing what he could do in such company.

BUCKS v. BERKS.

This match, in the Minor Counties' Championship, was played on the County Ground, Aylesbury, on Wednesday and Thursday, in fine weather. The attendance of the public on the latter day was fairly good, and some interesting cricket was witnessed. On Wednesday morning Berks went first to the wickets, and after losing two wickets in quick succession Sir C. Y. Nepean and G. E. Williams became partners and runs came freely. The former made 42 before he was bowled, and the latter had 27 to his credit when dismissed. Wickelaw also batted well for 28, and J. O. Collings was responsible for 18, but the remainder of the side did little, and the innings closed for 147. Wright was the most successful with the ball, taking 4 wickets for 44.

Bucks made a disastrous start, losing 3 wickets for 9 runs. Wright came in and after losing the assistance of Southall, he was joined by Boddy, and there was an improvement in the position before a separation was effected. E. West batted in good style for 17, and Vickerstaff carried his bat for 9. The others, however, did little, and the innings closed for 97, leaving Berks with a lead of 50.

The visitors had a few minutes batting before the call of time, losing two wickets for 27 runs. On the resumption of play on Thursday morning, the bowlers seemed to have best of matters, and Wright and Vickerstaff did good service with the ball. Several of the Berks team reached double figures, but the innings terminated for the small total of 93, leaving Bucks with 144 to get to win. Vickerstaff had a really fine analysis, taking 8 wickets for 54 runs.

G. M. Faulkner and T. R. Kent opened the batting for Bucks, but they were not partners for long. However, West and Wright got together, with the result that there was some fast scoring. On the former losing his wicket, Orton enabled Wright to carry the score to an interesting position before the former was out for 23. Boddy also played well for 23. The Captain came in seventh wicket down, and by careful cricket with Wright enabled Bucks to win the match by 3 wickets. Wright carried his bat for an excellent innings of 39, proving that he has lost none of his skill as a batsman. W. F. Lowndes was also not out for 20, his success, after the great interest he has displayed in the Club, being very gratifying. Score and analysis:—
