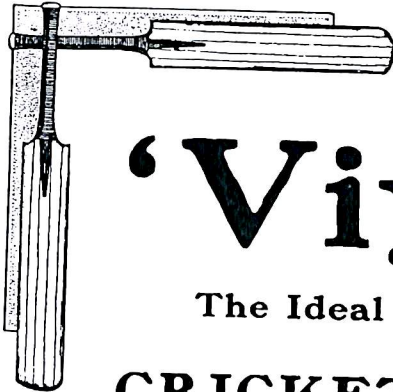

Northumberland v. Cheshire at Jesmond.

F. W. GILLESPIE A CENTURY

The Northumbrians gave a very fine display of batting on the County Ground at Jesmond, yesterday—indeed, one of the most attractive exhibitions ever seen at this enclosure—and actually scoring 256 for the fall of this enclosure—and actually scoring 256 for the fall of merely three wickets in the two last hours—and ten minutes of play they passed by eight runs a total of 248 Cheshire had been occupied some three hours in compiling. This gives them a position holding a great promise of victory in their match in the Minor Counties Tournament with the Costrians, who are making their first visit to Newcastle.

The weather was beautifully fine all day and it was on a capital wicket that Cheshire were fortunate enough to gain first innings, and though some steady partnerships followed a very moderate beginning, three wickets being down for 53 runs, the batting was never very attractive. Admitting that Northumberland's bowling was good and well managed and the fielding very clean, Cheshire did not make runs at as fast a rate as they should have done on so true a wicket. Their batting generally was unenterprising.

The Costrians commenced their innings at twenty minutes to twelve to the bowling of C. M. Skinner and Milne, the latter early capturing the first three wickets, J. C. Fallow being clean bowled at 40 and Bert and J. L. Osborne being caught at the wickets at 40 and 53 respectively. R. H. Voss was fourth out at 77, clean bowled by R. Foster, and with the century passed by five. A. S. Turner was dismissed by a smart catch at point by Gilman off the Rev. H. White's bowling. A good stand was made by H. P. Rigby and E. F. Stockton for the sixth wicket, the pair running the score to 173 before a fine one-handed catch in the slips ended the innings of Rigby, whose 55, made in an hour and twenty minutes and including seven 4's, was by far the brightest cricket in the venture. A useful score of 23 by the Rev. I. Hamilton helped to run the total to 211 for the next wicket before he was smartly stamped off the fourth ball sent down by W. G. Brown, T. D. Brewer in making 25 stayed while the score was being raised to 248, and then Brown capturing the two last wickets as the same total, and taking altogether three for 15 runs, brought the innings to a finish at four o'clock. It, upon the fall of the fifth wicket at 176, Stockton who gave a chance at the wickets off Milne's bowling when he had made 18, was not out with 37 scored after a painfully slow exhibition of batting.

Batting of a vastly different and much more enterprising order was seen when Northumberland commenced their response at twenty minutes past four, with F. W. Gillespie and Stanley Anderson the first pair of batsmen. A fast bowler in A. S. Turner, the ball sometimes coming dangerously high off the pitch, needed very careful watching, but still runs from the outset came at a most exhilarating rate, Anderson, who gave a very hard dounce in the slips when 13, off the bowling of Dixon, especially scoring at a fast pace with some fine drives and strokes to leg. The first century, indeed, was passed in three-quarters of an hour, and Anderson had been at the wickets only five minutes over the hour when he was at first out with 75 scored out of 132, his delightful innings including chief hits of fourteen 4's. Richardson stayed while only a dozen runs were added for the second wicket, and Marshall, never shaping like making runs, kept his wicket up while Gillespie hit out fearlessly, and the score was 190 before the third wicket fell. Then in the last half-hour of play there was another period of scarce hitting, Gilman, who made two splendid 6 hits, one right into a house in Osborne Avenue off the bowling of Osborne, and the other into the cemetery off Dixon, scoring 34, while Gillespie, who slowed down slightly just as he was reaching his century, ultimately raised his score to 114, gained by faultless play, with his principal strokes so far reaching seventeen 4's. Gillespie's clean and crisp cutting and pretty placing of the ball to all parts of the field was masterly in the extreme, and the continuation of both the innings and Gilman's to-day at eleven o'clock should attract an even larger crowd than that which witnessed with the keenest interest the whole of the opening stages of the match. Northumberland v. Cheshire at Jesmond.

EXCITING FINISH.

Home County's Victory Five Minutes Off Time.

There was a remarkably exciting finish at the County Ground, Jesmond, yesterday evening, the Northumberland eleven, sent in to score 116 in an hour and five minutes, accomplishing the task with five minutes to spare, and thus achieving a brilliant and undoubtedly well-earned win over Cheshire by four wickets.

Recalling the progress of play on Monday, the Northumbrians, through a very fine exhibition of batting, had compiled 256 for the fall of three wickets in response to Cheshire's score of 248, and, summarizing yesterday's play, previous to the memorable cricket in the closing hour, the home county raised their score to but one short of the fourth century, and then dismissed the Costrians a second time for 266, which placed them in a minority of 115 runs.

The Northumbrians entered upon their great fight at 25 minutes past five o'clock. F. W. Gillespie and Stanley Anderson, who had made so excellent a start in the first venture, facing the deliveries of Buxton and Turner. Gillespie quickly scored 17 before he was caught at the wickets off Turner's bowling with the total 27. His place was taken by W. G. Brown, who at the beginning of his innings was struck on the body by a very fast ball from Turner, and he did not recover from the blow for some few minutes. However, he soon got going, and there were visions of victory when, to the delight of the crowd, he drove Turner's bowling four times to the boundary in one over. Curiously enough, Anderson, who in the first innings had played the fastest cricket of all, could take no liberties with the bowling, and he had only scored 13 in eleven upon half an hour when, with the total reaching 60, he was clean bowled by Dixon. Brown, then joined by J. Gilman, continued to score quickly, but at five minutes past six, with the score standing at 80—36 thus still being needed for victory—he was clean bowled by Buxton. His dazzling innings of 41, in which he hit one 6 and six 4's, really placed Northumberland well on the road to the victory that was eventually achieved, but of the gaining of which there were grave fears when R. Foster was clean bowled, with the next ball sent down by Buxton, while five runs later Gilman was fifth out just as he appeared to be settling down to some hard hitting to a grand catch at mid-off by Dixon from a drive that otherwise would have gone to the boundary.

T. Ullathorne and Richardson were the partners for the sixth wicket, and they led the fieldmen a merry dance when fairly sealing several singles with some fast running between the wickets. Still, the score was two runs short of the century when Ullathorne was out, but Richardson and Milne gained the necessary five minutes off time without another wicket falling. Most of their runs came in singles, and the time occupied in the frequent changing of the field through a left-handed batsman being in, with the time also once wasted with the particular care Turner showed in placing his men, seemed likely to rob Northumberland of victory after all, but with six runs needed Milne sealed the issue with a drive to the boundary and next a snick through the slips for four. The Northumbrians were cheered by one of the best crowds seen at a county match at Jesmond except in the engagements with Durham, and complimented on all hands upon their really memorable victory.

The play previous to the second innings of the Northumbrians may be briefly dealt with. Much interest centred in the continuation of the innings of F. W. Gillespie and J. Gilman in Northumberland's first venture, the captain, having on Monday compiled 114 and his partner 34. Gillespie, however, added only 9 runs, and for his splendid and faultless innings of 123 he was at the wickets altogether two hours and twenty minutes, and hit nineteen 4's. He was fourth out at 265, and Gilman fifth at 298, the latter's 54 including six chief hits two 6's and eight 4's. W. G. Brown, C. M. Skinner, and T. Ullathorne made useful contributions, and with merry cricket R. Foster and the Rev. H. White put on 57 for the last wicket, Foster hitting one 6 and five 4's. Altogether, Northumberland were batting three hours and a half for their 262.

In a minority of 151, the Costrians entered upon their second innings at twenty minutes to one, and were backing three hours and three-quarters, or until ten past five, for 266, five which they were principally indebted to a good innings of 78 by R. H. Voss, who, going in fourth wicket down at 110, was seventh out at 163. He made his runs in an hour and ten minutes, and hit thirteen 4's. Score:—
