MINOR COUNTIES.

Northumbrians Outplayed at Trent Bridge.

The return match between Notts II. and Northumberland was commenced at Trent Bridge, Nottingham, yesterday, in boisterous weather. Unfortunately the Northumbrians were not anything like fully represented, and with Notts juniors full strength—no less than six of them having appeared at some time or other in the first eleven—the visitors were "bottom dog" throughout the day.

Battling first on a wet wicket, they were disposed of in an hour and a half for 74. The fielding side gave nothing away, and effected several splendid catches, two being quite first class efforts. On the home team batting they were soon ahead, going to the front with only one wicket down. James played delightful cricket, and the second wicket stand of 54 was well followed up by the remainder of the side, of whom Lee was most prominent, having the misfortune to play on whom but 7 runs short of three figures. The Notts captain also hit well, the innings closing with Notts having the useful lead of 207. The Northumbrians had three quarters of an hour batting at the close and lost Bell for 24.

Before the bowling of Barnes and Ironmonger, who were splendidly backed up by the fielders, Northumberland never gave the impression of running up anything like a good total, the ninth wicket stand of 19 being the biggest of the innings. Bell led to a fine catch with extended hand in front of the wicket, the wicket-keeper reeling over but retaining the ball. Wilkinson was the victim of Ironmonger's length, the long Middleander taking a high catch which an ordinary man could not have reached. Score:—

Rain Saves Northumberland from Defeat.

Notts Second had to rest content with three points for the lead on the first innings in their match at Nottingham with the Northumberland eleven, and it was particularly unfortunate for them that when the best batsmen of their opponents had been got rid of that rain, coming on just after noon, prevented them from dismissing the four tail-end wickets when 123 runs were still wanted to save the innings defeat.

Carr and C. F. Stanger-Leathes, the hot outs, continued the Northumberland second innings. The batsmen started confidently against Barnes and Riley, but with only 9 added the amateur was dismissed. Marshall came in, and with Carr presented a dogged front, being content to stop the good balls and punish the loose ones. Fifty appeared after the innings had lasted an hour and a quarter, Marshall getting Barnes away beautifully to the leg boundary. When the partnership had added 30 in half an hour the left-hander was snared in the slips. In Riley, Ironmonger, and Armstrong Notts have a wonderful trio of slip artistes, and any ball coming their way is almost sure to be held. Wilkinson joined Carr, and the first innings' aggregate was beaten, but immediately after the footballer fell to a catch at the wickets, while four runs later Wilkinson was also dismissed. Hill's single enabled him to miss "spectacles," but Watson did not escape the indignity of falling in a similar manner to the first innings. Rain now fell heavily, and was still falling at four o'clock, when the match was abandoned as a draw. Score:—

NOTTS. II. v. NORTHUMBERLAND.

By reason of a very indifferent display Northumberland yesterday, found themselves in a well-nigh hopeless position, at Trent Bridge. In continuation it must be conceded that the absence of three or four prominent members materially weakened the team, while it is also a fact that Albert Iremonger and Barnes bowled with remarkable steadiness. But still the batting, taken generally, never reached a very high level, nor can the state of the wicket be held wholly responsible.

Northumberland won the toss, and going in first, the captain, Bell, started confidently enough, but Stapleton ran forward to effect an excellent catch, in doing which he rolled over. Something approaching a collapse ensued. Iremonger's high one-handed catch at second slip sent Wilkinson back, and Armstrong snapped up Stanger-Leathes before that batsman really settled down. Marshall made some attempt to stem the tide, and Ullathorne and Foster were responsible for a bright few minutes, but the innings was over before lunch, in an hour and twenty-five minutes, for a total which Notts. II. passed with the utmost ease. Iremonger took six wickets for less than half a dozen runs apiece.

The feature of the home innings was a sound display by Lee, who hit with refreshing freedom, as will be inferred from the fact that he helped himself to ten 4's, six 3's, and eight 2's. Once he settled down, the bowling rarely seemed to find him in difficulties, although he gave more than one chance in the slips. Shaw furnished an attractive display, and James did very well, including five 4's in his contribution. Iremonger had a pleasant little stay, and the captain played a good forcing innings. Numerous changes were made in the attack, but with little effect.

The 281 took about three hours and a quarter to compile, and the visitors had lost their captain ere stumps were drawn for the day. Given a full day's cricket to-day, it will be a remarkable effort if Northumberland succeed in staving off defeat. The weather was unsettled, and slightly interfered with play, but there was never more than the merest handful of spectators present. Score and analysis:-

RAIN ROBS HOME SIDE OF VICTORY.

The Notts. second string met with undeserved ill-luck at Trent Bridge yesterday, when, with victory well within their grasp, rain came to the rescue of the Northumbrians and brought about the abandonment of the match. The home side had fairly overwhelmed their opponents from the North by piling up the big score of 281 in response to the feeble total of 74, and as in their second venture the visitors had only managed to score 84 for six wickets, the innings defeat stood them in the face. But although Notts. II. were not destined to reap the fruits of their fine batting, the match is sufficiently satisfactory in that it demonstrated the outstanding abilities of practically the whole of the team, and with that the supporters of the county club must perforce rest content.

Barnes and Riley bowled to the not out, Carr and Stanger-Leathes, when play started yesterday, and both the batsmen played free cricket until with nine added to the overnight score of 24, a snick by the amateur off the left-hander found its way into the safe keeping of second slip. Scoring proceeded consistently with Marshall in, and the innings had lasted an hour and a quarter when 50 was hoisted. A double change in the bowling was then tried, Clifton and Iremonger taking up the attack, and 15 runs later Marshall, after getting each bowler to the boundary, was out to a catch in the slips, three wickets being down for 63. Carr stayed an hour and a half for a good 34, but Wilkinson and Watson were quickly out, and at 12.15 rain stopped play, the Northumbrians, with four wickets to fall, being still 123 behind.
