PLUCKY STAND FOR CARMARTHEN THEN BY CONWAY REES.

Result of corresponding match last year—Cornwall, 189 and 180; Carmarthenshire, 115 and 112. Cornwall won by 200 runs.

Cornwall gained a fine victory over Carmarthenshire by an innings and 182 runs. When the match was resumed at Camborne on Tuesday morning, in beautiful weather and on a very fast wicket, E. Gee and Davie continued the visitors' overnight innings with the score 22 for five. Runs came slowly for the first half hour. Gee was bowled by Whiting after contributing 18. Six wickets had fallen for 25. Cyril Morgan's first 58 from Hawken went to the boundary. In the next over Morgan was bowled by Hawken. Captain Hughes Morgan followed, and Hawken's first delivery was sent to the boundary. Davis was caught by J. C. Bickford-Smith at point when he had reached 6. C. P. Lewis, who partnered Captain Hughes Morgan, scamed at home to Hawken, and with a neat cut made another boundary. In the next over Captain Hughes Morgan was bowled by Whiting for 10. Carmarthen again went to the wickets, Rees and the Evans opening. The latter was bowled by Hawken without a score on the sheet. Conway Rees next batted. These players, although making a rather prolonged stay, did not score freely. After getting 6 P. Rees was caught by W. N. Bickford-Smith. Two wickets were down for 10. A minute later E. Gee retired from Whiting's bowling without increasing the score. Trevarthen and Esott took Whiting's and Hawken's places. This was the first change in the Cornish bowlers during the match. CORNWALL v. CARMARTHEN.

GOOD START BY THE CORNISHMEN.

By compiling a total of 443 in five hours, and in less than three-quarters of an hour dismissing five of the Welshmen for 22 runs, the Cornishmen distinguished themselves in their match with Carmarthen at Camborne yesterday. The batting honours went to the captain of the home county, H. Trewartha, who scored 101; to W. N. Bickford-Smith, who made a splendid contribution of 99; and to Trevarthen, who compiled 78. The last-named gave a chance before the score, which was not taken.

The home county had first knock on a wicket which rolled out well and played easily, and in great contrast to their previous performances with the bat this season gave a marvellous display. The building up of a large total was initiated by W. N. Bickford-Smith and Trevarthen, who made a splendid first wicket stand. They were not separated until they had been together an hour and an half, and put on 154 runs. Both batted well, and the dismissal of Trevarthen came through his being run out when he had scored 78, and his being missed at point for the second ball to him proved an expensive mistake. After that, however, he timed the ball beautifully and drove with great power. Vibart joined W. N. Bickford-Smith, and at the luncheon interval they were still together, with the score at 198. They, however, did not long survive after lunch. Vibart was first out, after having made a useful 50, having helped to put on 56 for the second wicket. In the following helped to put on 56 for the second wicket. In the following over by Rees, W. N. Bickford-Smith was out by an easy delivery, having had lines in missing his century by a single. Bickford-Smith played lovely cricket, hitting at times with great freedom, and never giving a chance in making his 99. Three wickets were down for 217 runs. The score steadily rose with the Cornish captain and J. O. Bickford-Smith in, and they added 88 before the latter was out to a catch behind the wicket from a fast ball which C. Morgan sent down. Hawken joined Trewartha, and runs came at a greater pace, both batsmen punishing the bowling. The 300 went up with four men out. With 16 more on Hawken was caught behind the wicket, and then there was a prolonged stand by the captain and Godrick. The cricket became rather slow, and Cornwall were not seizing the opportunity to force the game, though at the tea interval there were 379 on the board, and the bowling had deteriorated into very ordinary stuff. Shortly after the interval the 400 was registered, and Trewartha and Godrick were still defying the bowling. The Porthurno player, however, was out shortly after. Godrick batted extremely well for his 43. The partnership had produced 95. The Cornish captain had the honour of getting his century, which he made after 21 hours batting, but shortly after he was out, and the Cornish innings closed at 5.30 for the total of 443.

Carmarthen had a little less than three-quarters of an hour's batting before the drawing of stumps, and their display was in marked contrast to the start the home county made. With Hawken and Whiting, both bowling well, backed up by good fielding, three of the Welshmen were sent back to the pavilion without a single run having been scored, followed by the fourth player with only one scored. When stumps were pulled up the visitors had lost five wickets with only 22 runs scored, and they will have to make a great effort to avenge their defeat. Scores:—

DECISIVE VICTORY OF THE CORNISHMEN.

Cornwall won their game against Carmarthen at Camborne yesterday by an innings and 182 runs. Davis and E. Gee resumed Carmarthen's first innings, the wicket playing much easier. Gee was bowled for 16, and Cyril Morgan, who filled the vacancy, started well, but was soon bowled by Hawken, seven wickets being down for 36 runs. Capt. Hughes Morgan opened with a bonfire, but Davis was smartly taken at point by J. C. Bickford-Smith in Hawken's next over; the partnership yielding 12 runs. Lewis played good cricket, and scored freely off Whiting, but the Porthurno man bowled Morgan in the next over. The last pair made a prolonged stand, but the innings closed for 81 runs, or 362 runs in arrears.

Carmarthen started their second innings just before mid-day, the Cornish bowling being entrusted to Hawken and Whiting, as in the first innings. Ike Evans was sent back before a run had been scored. With the score at 10, P. Rees was smartly taken in the slips, and E. Gee, who filled the vacancy, was bowled by Whiting with his second ball without any addition to the score. H. A. Lunch was taken with the score at 47 for 6. Ecott caught Davis off his own bowling after 21 runs had been added. CORNWALL'S BUMPING SCORE AGAINST CARMARTHEN.

Cornwall and Carmarthen opened their fixture in fine weather at Camborne yesterday, before a satisfactory gate. The Cornubians went first to the wickets, and put together 100 runs in less than an hour, W. N. Bickford-Smith being responsible for 45, and Trewarthen for 52. Carmarthen were not at all strong in bowling, and boundaries became somewhat commonplace. Trewarthen kept going ninety-five minutes, when he was run out with 78 to his credit. One wicket had fallen for 154. Vibart joined W. N. Bickford-Smith, and by lunch time the score had been carried to 185, Bickford-Smith's contribution being 90 not out, and Vibart's 23 not out. A couple of 3's by Bickford-Smith resulted in 200 for one wicket being telegraphed. Vibart was bowled by Rees for 30, and in the ensuing over Bickford-Smith was clearly bowled by Rees when only 1 short of a century. A total of 217 for 3 wickets put the home team and the spectators in high spirits. From 275 for four (when J. C. Bickford-Smith was caught after making 33) Cornwall advanced to the third century. As the afternoon wore on the bowling grew slower and weaker, and Cornwall, taking full advantage of every opportunity, piled up for their county quite a record score, which at 4.30—the tea interval—stood at 379 for five. By five o'clock the scoring board showed 400, with Tressawna—who had then been in about 2 1/2 hours—and Godrich still partners. Godrich was soon after caught at point, when he had made 43. There was great applause when Tressawna just turned his century before being caught. On his return to the pavilion he was accorded an ovation. The other contributions were insignificant, and at half-past five Cornwall were all out for the splendid total of 443.

CORNWALL v. CARMARTHEN.

BRILLIANT BATTING BY THE CORNISHMEN.

The Cornish eleven distinguished themselves at Camborne on Monday by compiling the huge score of 443 in five hours in their first innings against Carmarthen in connection with the Minor Counties Championship. The chief contributors to this total were H. Tresawna, 101, W. N. Hickford-Smith, 99, and Trevarthen, 79. The first wicket yielded 194 runs, when Trevarthen was run out. He had batted well, although he gave a chance from the second ball to him. Vibart made a use of 50 and W. N. Hickford-Smith was out to an easy delivery, when within a single run of a century. He played a faultless innings, and hit with freedom. The score steadily rose, and although many changes were tried, the bowling was severely punished. Tresawna's hitting was powerful, and, on being joined by Godrick, 35, 400 was registered. The partnership produced 50, and after 2 1/2 hours' batting, the Cornish captain had the honour of completing his century. The Cornish innings closing at a total of 443. In striking contrast to the brilliant opening of the three-quarters of an hour's batting lost five wickets with only 22 runs on the board. Hawken and Whiting bowled well, and when the fourth wicket fell there had been only a single scored.

The game was resumed at Boskear on Tuesday in brilliant weather, and Carmarthen's first innings closed for 81. The visitors followed on 363 runs in arrears and up to lunch time five wickets had fallen for 47. Conway Rees batted for over an hour and a half, and was dismissed at 122, for a capital innings of 72. Cyril Morgan and Capt. Hughes Morgan scored fast, but the innings closed for 180. CORNWALL v. CARMARTHEN.

In connection with the Minor Counties' Championship, a two days' match between Cornwall and Carmarthen was started at Camborne on Monday. The ground had been prepared by Brock, the Truro groundman, and there was an easy wicket.

Cornwall batted first, W. N. Bickford-Smith and Trewarthen facing the bowling of Gee and Rees. For the first few overs runs came slowly, until Trewarthen lived matters with a boundary, following with two pretty cuts, which added 5 more to his score. Bickford-Smith responded in a similar manner, and runs now came fairly freely. The Cornishmen played ferociously, and in less than an hour 100 runs were recorded, Bickford-Smith having contributed 45, and Trewarthen 22. The bowling of the visitors was very weak, and boundaries were the general order of things. Trewarthen was run out after being in ninety-five minutes and making 74 runs. The score now read 154 for one wicket. Vibart partnered Bickford-Smith, and at the interval for lunch 195 had been scored, Bickford-Smith being 90 not out, and Vibart 23 not out.

On the re-start, Bickford-Smith in the first over made a couple of 8's, which brought the total to 200 for one wicket. Both batsmen were playing first-class cricket, and the deliveries of the bowlers received scant ceremony. Up to the present there had been seven bowlers. A quarter of an hour after lunch, Vibart retired from play, having been neatly bowled by Rees after making 30. Bickford-Smith was also cleanly bowled by Rees in the next over, after making 40, for which he was loudly cheered. The score read 217. J. C. Bickford-Smith and H. Tresawna were now together, and in spite of the continual change in the bowlers, the score was rapidly increased, until at 3.30 the scoring board registered 275, when J. C. Bickford-Smith was neatly caught behind the wickets after amassing 33. E. Hawken followed, and a quarter of an hour later the score reached 300. The last-named batsman was also caught behind the wicket when he reached 23. Godrich was the next to go in, and at 4.30 the score read 379 for five wickets, and half an hour later 400. Godrich was caught at point when he had scored 43. Meyrick's stay at the wickets only lasted a few minutes, he being stumped by Davis. Whiting was the next to go in, and it was during the time he and Tresawna were partners that Tresawna made his century, to the accompaniment of loud cheering. He was neatly caught by John without adding to his score.

Carmarthen opened very badly. Percy Rees, Ike Evans, and Conway Rees being caught without opening the score sheet. H. A. Rees was caught by Meyrick in a difficult position when he had made 1, and another wicket fell when the score reached 9. Up to the present the batting display of the visitors was very feeble, and they could do little with the deliveries of Hawken and Whiting.

The game was resumed on Tuesday morning, the batsmen being E. Gee and Davies. Runs came slowly for the first half hour, the batsmen playing very careful cricket. Gee was clean bowled by Whiting, after making 16. Six wickets had fallen for 25. Cyril Morgan's visit was of short duration, he being bowled by Hawken after reaching eleven. A few minutes later Davies was caught by J. C. Bickford-Smith at point, after having made six. Capt. Hughes Morgan and C. P. Lewis were now partners, and the score sheet registered 48 before the former was bowled by Whiting.

Carmarthen started their second innings just before mid-day. The bowlers were Hawken and Whiting, as in the first innings. Ike Evans was sent back with Hawken's second ball before the score sheet had been opened. P. Rees and Conway Rees made a fine stand, but runs were difficult to get against the consistently good bowling and fielding of the Cornishmen. When the score had reached 10, P. Rees was smartly taken in the slips, and E. Gee, who took Rees's place, was dismissed by Whiting's second ball. There were three wickets down for 10 runs. H. A. Rees followed, and was missed in the long field by Godrich, but Conway Rees made some splendid strokes, and was apparently well set. When the score had reached 24, Trewarthen took Whiting's place as bowler, and the scoring became exceedingly slow, the fielding being remarkably fine. John was taken smartly in the slips by Trewarthen when the indicator registered 43.
