MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

SUFFOLK v. LINCOLNSHIRE.

Thanks to the drying propensities of the Portman Road ground, Ipswich, it was possible to start this match on Monday morning at the usual time, although after the heavy rain on Sunday the wicket was naturally soft. The weather was too cheerless-in fact, almost wintry-to attract many spectators, only about a hundred being present at the start. About eleven o'clock it commenced to rain, but the wind came up and quickly dispersed it.

The Suffolk captain won the toss, and Quaife and O. H. Walters faced the deliveries of E. T. Cooke and Geeson. In Cooke's first over the professional might have been caught by Geeson in the slips, whilst at 12 he received another let-off at mid-on of the other bowler. The second chance was a somewhat difficult one, and the ball spun out of the fielder's hand, which enabled the batsman to run a single. Cooke sent down many short-pitched balls, and, failing to find his length against the end, was nosed at 33 by Day, whose first ball Quaife got to leg for a couple, but in the new bowler's second over the old Sussex and Warwickshire professional was caught and bowled. Captain Wilson came in next, and after scoring 5 from the four balls sent down, rain caused a stoppage for a quarter of an hour. Geeson, who had bowled eight overs, four of which were maidens, for eight runs was relieved by Riley. At 40 Day made a confident appeal for Walters being leg before, but the umpire ruled in the batsman's favour. Five later Cooke bowled again, but it was Riley who, without addition, got rid of Walters. The Oxfordian endeavoured to get him round to leg, but instead cocked the ball up to point, and was easily held. For some reason J. F. Ireland had not arrived to go in his allotted place of second wicket, and Kenneth Raynor filled the vacancy, only to give an easy catch to J. E. Crookes with the first ball he received. It was a useful over of Riley's—two wickets and a maiden. The brothers Wilson were then associated, and C. S. Wilson was all out with a ball which went for a couple of bytes. The Captain succumbed to a similar ball from Riley at 48, and the Lincolnshire bowler had the honour of capturing three of the four wickets for three runs. He got another victim without another run being hit off him, F. H. Mustard being caught at long leg by W. E. Thompson. Half the side were out for 50 and four later C. S. Wilson was well caught by the wicket-keeper, and Riley had secured five wickets still for 3 runs. H. Hoyland hit the first four of the match, a fine off-drive from Cooke, and lunch was taken with the score 60 for six.

Riley's first over on resuming was pretty expensive after lunch, 8 coming from three leg hits. The batsman was just beginning to please the bowler, which by this time numbered about 40, when Penfold, in getting Cooke's round the leg, was caught by A. W. Foster. The Bury pro. had made 7, and he was missed by Geeson in the slips before he had scored. J. F. Ireland, who arrived during the interval, was the new-comer, but he only made a single before Cooke found his way into the stumps. The score-board registered 77-8-1. P. P. Cornell was lucky in getting a couple through the slips in the same over, and was then run out.

As soon as Suffolk got into the field rain came down sharply, and there was another fifteen minutes' stoppage. Lincolnshire started with the Rev. C. G. Ward and Day to the bowling of Penfold and Trudgett. The clergyman smacked the Bury pro's third ball to the leg boundary, and he was lucky in getting one from Trudgett just clear of mid-off. The score was taken to 24, when another shower drove the players to shelter. The ground was rendered very wet, and the bowlers had recourse to sawdust almost every ball. At 34 K. Raynor bowled in Trudgett's place, and sent down a maiden over. The first wicket fell at 35. Day drove Penfold very hard, and Ireland, fielding at mid-off, brought off a brilliant catch. At 46 Hoyland dropped E. T. Cooke off Penfold from a skier in front of the screen, but five later a latter was out to T. Hedworth was out first ball, caught and bowled Penfold, and the bowler had to run half-way up the pitch to bring off the catch. W. E. Thompson sat on his bat to prevent Penfold bringing off the hat trick, but the score had not advanced when Ward returned a yorker to Raynor. This alteration in the state of affairs made W. E. Thompson very careful, and the last-named was fortunate enough to book one from Penfold just clear of Capt. Wilson in the slips. Riley afterwards scored fairly freely, but Thompson was in a long time for a single. Trudgett relieved Raynor, and at 80 a piece of mis-fielding by Ireland ended luckily for Suffolk, as the batsman attempted a run, and Ireland, gathering up the leather, returned shrewdly to the wicket-keeper, who had the balls off in a twinkling, and Riley was run out. The pro. had made 28 whilst his captain notched a single. The Suffolk tota was passed with H. E. Williams partnering Thompson, and then Penfold retired temporarily, owing to a strain. This led to J. F. Ireland bowling, and in his first over, Williams made a tame stroke, which resulted in his being caught at mid-off at 87. Penfold was soon on again, and cricket was terribly slow. Thompson was in three-quarters of an hour for five, and his poky methods were somewhat painful to watch. Ireland relieved Trudgett at 93, but it was Penfold who split up the partnership, C. S. Wilson catching J. E. Crookes at short slip.

An interval for tea was taken, and on resuming, A. W. Foster mis-hit Penfold, and was smartly held by C. S. Wilson, who took the ball high up with then a foolish attempt by Geeson to steal a run and then in his being smartly thrown out by Hoyland. One later, Allen looked to be fairly caught by C. S. Wilson, and the fielders were walking towards the pavilion, but for some reason the umpire disallowed the catch. The umpire afterwards said he thought the ball went off the batsman's pad, but there was no doubt that it came off his bat first. The result was that the last wicket put on several useful runs. Thompson did not quit for a change, and Trudgett was reacquainted again. The innings closed for 126, Cornell effecting a smart piece of stumping which

disposed of Thompson. Forty-four in arrears, Suffolk went in again for twenty minutes, batting in a bad light. Quaife and O. H. Walters again opened to E. T. Cooke and Geeson, and the start was disastrous, Quaife being bowled by an extra fast one from Cooke, Hoyland then played out time.

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

SUFFOLK v. LINCOLNSHIRE.

This match was resumed on Portman Road Ground, Ipswich, on Tuesday, punctually to time! On the previous day Suffolk had the worst of the deal by 44 runs, the totals being—Suffolk 82, and Lincolnshire 126. The home-sters, too, had lost a wicket for three runs in their second innings, and they were likely to be very much handicapped by the fact that Penfold's strain was so serious that it was doubtful whether he would be able to bowl. The weather was dull and cold when the two not out, O. H. Walters, O. and H. Hoyland 2, resumed, to the bowling of E. T. Cooke and Riley. The Ipswichian got Riley prettily to leg for 3, and despatched a full leg toe from the fast border to the boundary, but at 16 he was beaten by Riley with a ball which just came in sufficiently to take his off stump. A slight drizzle made things unpleasant for everybody, but it was not sufficient to stop play. The visiting captain was evidently a believer in changing the bowling frequently, as the score was only 23 when Geeson relieved Cooke. Capt. Wilson joined Walters, and there was no improvement in the rate of run-getting; in fact, 20 overs had been bowled in the innings so far, and only 25 runs had been obtained, and this was the result of a full hour's play. It was something wonderful when Walters drove Riley for a couple, and got him to leg for 4 (all run), and a single in one over. Day bowled at the top end to allow of Geeson changing ends, and the former had Walters caught at the wicket in his second over. Three wickets were down, and Suffolk were still two in arrears. Usually Walters bats in free style, but as he had occupied an hour and 20 minutes in making 20, there is no doubt that run-getting was fearfully dimmed.

When only two on Capt. Wilson played forward too soon to Geeson, and was bowled, J. F. Ireland and K. Raynor were in three overs without scoring after which cups came at the rate of about one an over. At last Ireland managed to get one from Day to the boundary, but it was a risky lofty stroke, which went very near to Williams, fielding near the pavilion. He next straight drove the same bowler and got him to leg, both shots going to the boundary. Geeson, who had bowled 20 overs for only 17 runs, was relieved by Riley at 74, and three later Day had Raynor out leg-before in attempting to pull a full toss which he missed, and which pitched on his foot. The first innings score was passed with C. S. Wilson partnering Ireland, but the former was smartly run out at 85. Wilson had hit Riley very hard to leg, and attempted to run two, but Foster gathered the ball splendidly, and returned it so sharply that the balls were off with the batsman well away from the orange. Geeson had another wicket to the ball, and all hopes of Suffolk winning practically vanished when Ireland was caught by the wicket-keeper after compiling 28, the score was 91, and there were seven out. F.

H. Mustard tried to send the score up quickly by hitting out, and just as the century was topped he was adjudged leg before wicket to Geeson. At 108 Penfold had his off stump lowered and Trudgett went in and stayed to the luncheon interval.

The second ball after lunch finished off the innings, Cornell being bowled by Geeson. Ireland there and a comparatively easy task, having only 65 to win. The Rev. C. G. Ward and Day again started, and Penfold and Trudgett bowled. The Bury pro. was unable to let himself go, and sent up slow, which, however, proved puzzling. The clergyman was all but caught at cover in his first over. Nine came from Trudgett's first over, and then Ward had further luck when Walters just failed to get to a skier in front of the screen. Ward next got Penfold beautifully to the on boundary—quite the biggest hit of the match. Trudgett was relieved by Ireland after two overs, and the first ball of his third over resulted in Penfold snapping Day at first slip. The score was 22. Ireland met with further success by catching E. T. Cooke at 28 off his own bowling.

Hedworth was some while in before he opened his account, and thus escaped a pair. The ground was drying rapidly, and it was much easier to force the ball past the fieldmen than it was in the morning. Ward made several brilliant shots, and Lincolnshire were rapidly approaching victory. When 15 more were required, Captain Wilson bowled his leg breaks in Ireland's place, and the skipper himself went on just before the finish, but W. E. Thompson stayed with Ward till the necessary runs were knocked off, and Lincolnshire won by seven wickets.

Over 150 paid for admission, and the gate receipts for the two days realised £12 13s., about the largest amount ever taken for a Suffolk match.

There were several rain interruptions on the first day. For the winners, Ward top-scored with 41 not out. On the first day Ireland arrived after lunch so batted down the order for Suffolk. During the Lincolnshire first innings Penfold suffered a sprain when bowling and retired temporarily before returning to bowl again at a slower pace. A crowd of 400 was estimated to be present on the first day and over 150 on the second. The match receipts of over £12. 13s.0d were a record for a Suffolk match.
