MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP

DEVON v. CORNWALL.

Devon entertained Cornwall at Exeter on Friday and Saturday in the Minor Counties Championship. The visitors won the toss, and H. Tresawna and W. N. Bickford-Smith opened the batting against the bowling of Capt. J. C. Hartley and D. O. Boles. Runs came slowly and at 21 Hartley bowled Tresawna. Aston displaced Boles with the total at 40, and Rogers hit a 4 off his second delivery. When the total had reached 62, Light took Hartley's place with the ball, and later Boles displaced Aston. Rogers reached his half-century, and almost immediately after Light took Bickford-Smith's wicket, with the total at 96. A catch from Trevarthen off Light was neatly accepted by Hartley in the slips when the score was 114. Boles caught Rogers above his head with the left hand when the score was 114. Vibart, the next man, was quickly dismissed. The luncheon interval arrived with the score at 134. Play had not been resumed long before Coad tipped the ball off Hartley into the slips, where it was caught by Orchard at full length on the ground. Hawken was shortly after caught in the slips by Shelley off Light at 142. Light was given a rest with the bowling at 149, and at 160 Boles beat Bickford-Smith. Meyrick and Major Williams soon succumbed and the innings closed for 170.

Boles and Orchard opened for Devon, but the total had only reached 15 when Hawken dislodged Boles' off stump. Orchard and Light played carefully, and the latter hit the ball into an adjoining field for 6, a feat which he again repeated a little later. After about an hour and a quarter's play the century was signalled, and two runs later Orchard was bowled by Trevarthen for 51. C. V. L. Hooman was next man in, and hit a 4 off the first ball, but was quickly caught in the slips by Meyrick. At 114 Light gave a chance in the long field, but the ball was dropped. At 138 Shelley played on off Trevarthen for 8. Light hit two 4's and a 6 in succession, the latter stroke bringing his total to 100. Another 6 followed, and off the next ball a high catch was sent up, but Rogers misjudged it. Another catch from Light was missed by Meyrick in the country at 167. With the score at 214 Light sent up a sky-scraper, which Whiting caught in the deep field off Trevarthen. Light had hit six 6's and 21 fours, having been at the wicket about two hours. The sixth wicket fell by Carroll being leg before to Hawken when the total had reached 235. Hartley was also leg before wicket to Whiting for 18, and Davies was run out for 12 at 297. Sturt sent the 300 up with a cut for 2, and after another over stumps were drawn, Devon's score being 303 for eight wickets.

The match was continued on Saturday. The homesters resumed the batting with Sturt and Tamworth, and fifty runs were added before the latter was bowled by Whiting. The innings closed soon for 365.

The visitors opened with Tresawna and Bickford-Smith, but runs came very slowly. With the score at 41, Bickford-Smith was bowled by Light, and the lunch interval arrived with the score at 91 for one wicket. Sturt bowled in place of Aston, and shortly after the century was signalled. At 115 Davies neatly caught Rogers at the wicket. Trevarthen was out in a similar manner. Light bowled Tresawna for 64. Vibart was given l.b.w. at 146, and was ascending the pavilion steps when he was recalled by the Devon captain, only to be caught a little later in the deep field. The visitors with three wickets in hand required 44 to avert an innings defeat. Boles took J. C. Bickford-Smith's wicket when the Cornishmen only required two to avert defeat by an innings, and Meyrick hit a two, which put the question beyond doubt. The innings closed for 199, leaving Devon to get five runs to win.

In Devon's second innings, Rogers took up the bowling. His first delivery was a wide, whilst the third ball was missed by the wicket-keeper and went to the boundary for 4. Devon, therefore, won by ten wickets.

MINOR COUNTIES' MATCH.

Delightful weather prevailed at Exeter yesterday, when the return match between Devon and Cornwall, in connexion with the Minor Counties' Competition, commenced at the County Ground. Devon were unable to place their strongest team in the field, but, nevertheless, the sides were representative of the two counties. The wicket was in good condition, and, owing to lack of rain, it favoured the batsmen. Cornwall won the toss, and compiled 170 after batting about two hours and a half. The majority of their runs were obtained for the first three wickets. R. Rogers, who registered 72, batted exceptionally well. He was at the wickets for over an hour without giving a chance. The remainder of the batsmen did not offer any material opposition to the bowling, and the whole side were out at 3 o'clock for the total mentioned above.

Devon opened their innings none too well, as D. C. Boles was dismissed when only 15 had been scored, his stumps being disarranged by a splendid delivery from Hawken. Boles sent down several overs towards the end of the Cornish innings, and, no doubt, would have batted better had he been put in a little later. Things went merrily for Devon when Light joined J. F. Orchard. Both played in excellent style, and runs came very quickly. Light hit in a brilliant manner, and made 50 in a little over half-an-hour. He twice placed the ball out of the ground, and not infrequently made boundary hits two or three times in an over. The first 100 was telegraphed after the Devonians had been batting for an hour-and-a-quarter. Only two additional runs were added when Orchard was bowled by Trevarthen for a well-earned 31, the second wicket having added 87. C. V. L. Hooman was caught in the slips after he had made 4, the third wicket only adding half a dozen runs. Almost immediately afterwards Light was badly missed in the deep field and showed his appreciation of the let-off by again hitting the ball out of the ground a few minutes later. J. F. Shelley had the misfortune to play the ball on to his wicket when he had made eight. Light continued to score well, and brought his total up to 100 by hitting the ball out of the ground after scoring boundary hits off the two previous deliveries. Immediately after this he sent a delivery from Trevarthen out of the ground, the professional thus making 20 in four successive hits. Light was missed in the deep field a few minutes later by the same player who let him off earlier in the innings. Devon passed their opponents' total after batting for about two hours. Light continued to handle the willow in great style, and in four successive deliveries made a 6 and three 4's, the second 100 being telegraphed at a quarter past 5 o'clock. Light was eventually caught in the deep field when the score had reached 214, the professional having contributed 156 by extremely good batting. His score included six 6's and twenty-one 4's. F. H. Carroll played a useful innings for 30 when he was out leg-before-wicket to Hawken. Captain Hartley was also out in a similar manner when the total had reached 274. Davies was run out when the eighth wicket had realised 23 runs. Devon were leading on the first innings by 133, with two wickets in hand, when stumps were drawn for the day.
