SILVERLOCK'S GREAT INNINGS AT NEWPORT.

The Minor Counties' Championship match between Monmouthshire and Carmarthenshire was commenced at Newport on Friday in brilliant weather, but before a small crowd of spectators. The home county were weakened owing to the absence of several of the originally selected players, the absentees including M. Stratton, T. Robathan, W. A. Williams, and T. H. Williams, and their places were taken by C. Hews, H. J. Rowlands, W. P. Geer, and Holly (Chepstow). Monmouthshire were first to bat, the innings being opened by Silverlock and Hews, but the latter was bowled when the score stood at 16, and Diver filled the vacancy. The pair of Newport players at once commenced a useful stand, and passed the century between them shortly after one o'clock. Five bowling changes took place in the meantime, but the batsmen played with great confidence. At 1.30 Diver was bowled by Howell, the score being 157 and his contribution to the total was 71. Silverlock completed his century after two hours and a quarter's batting, and shortly afterwards the double century was recorded.

During the afternoon Howell strained a muscle in his left wrist bowling, and had to be assisted off the field. C. Hews, who had previously been dismissed, came out to field.

After the tea interval the partnership between Silverlock and E. S. Phillips was severed through the latter being bowled by Geer, after compiling an almost faultless 71. The remaining players, with two exceptions, reached double figures, thus enabling Silverlock to complete his double century, and he was loudly applauded upon his achievement. Scores:—

MINOR COUNTIES CONTESTS.

CARMARTHENSHIRE'S THREE MATCHES.

Beautiful weather and, of course, a dry wicket favoured Monmouthshire in this match of the Minor Counties competition at the Newport Athletic grounds on Friday. The home side took the field without Mr. Stratton, T. Robotham, T. B. Williams, and W. A. Williams, who had been selected, and their places were filled by H. J. Rowlands, W. P. Geen, C. Hews, and M. Holly, the latter from Chepstow. The visiting side included Conway Rees, the ex-International football player, and his brother, Harry Rees, a former Llanelly full-back. C. Hews and Silverlock opened the batting for Gwent to the bowling of H. Howell and C. Morgans. Runs came slowly, Silverlock playing a steady game. When 16 were registered Hews was bowled by H. Howell after contributing four. Diver partnered Silverlock, and the two professionals made a stone-wall defence. The bowlers were changed again and again, but still runs came at an increased pace. Silverlock reached his 50 before one o'clock, and both batsmen hit freely all round the wicket, and had the Carmarthen fielding been anything but good runs would have come much faster. Captain Hughes Morgan was put on, but Diver paid him but scant courtesy, and continued to hit out. Eventually he was clean bowled by H. Howell for 71, which included 6 fours. W. E. C. Hadden took his place, but when he had scored seven was smartly caught by E. Gee off C. Morgan, and E. S. Phillips joined Silverlock. The latter had by this time passed his century. The visitors again changed their bowling, but both men hit freely, and by 3.45 Silverlock had registered 150 and "E.S." had put on 60. When the sides adjourned for tea at 4.20, the Monmouthshire score had reached 329, with Silverlock not out 163 and E. S. Phillips not out 70. At this period Silverlock's score included 13 fours and "E.S.'s" six fours. After tea E. S. Phillips scored a single and was then bowled by Gee. Harry Rowlands took his place, but went out to C. Morgan and was stumped when he had registered 12. W. P. Geen fell a victim to Davies off Gee for a like score, and E. G. Phillips only succeeded in putting up three before he was caught by Jones off Morgan. At 5.30 Silverlock reached his 200 amidst applause, and when the innings closed at 6.10, for 479, he was still batting strongly with a total of 246, which included 26 fours. C. Morgan took six wickets for 111, H. Howell two for 68, and E. Gee two for 140, whilst without gaining a wicket 14 runs were hit off H. Rees, 27 each off J. C. Rees and Davies, and 70 off Captain Hughes Morgan.

After Monmouthshire had knocked up the prolific score of 479 at Newport on Friday, Carmarthenshire took the wicket on Saturday, the pitch being ideal for batting. The sun was broiling, and the bowlers were frequently changed. Percy Rees and Ike Evans took the wicket first, and although runs did not come so quickly, still the partnership was not dissolved until a pretty 50 had been knocked up. Percy Rees, who was misread off the first ball from Silverlock, was the first to go. Monmouthshire were, under a terrific heat, smart in the field, but with consistent batting the visitors registered the century before the luncheon hour. Hugh Howell limped to the wicket, having strained himself on the previous day. He could not keep his wicket up, although with the assistance of a runner he added 19. E. Gee made a determined effort to retrieve the almost hopeless position of the visitors, and with Capt. Hughes Morgan runs were compiled rapidly. Within five of the half century Gee was beaten by Holley after giving a pretty display. C. P. Lewis for the last wicket treated the bowling freely, and although the visitors were 245 behind when ten wickets were down, they had scored the creditable amount of 224.

At half past three Carmarthen followed on, and with the score at 2 Ike Evans played on to his wicket from Holley. Percy Rees joined Captain Hughes Morgan, and the batsmen gave some delightful cricket. Rees drove freely, while Capt. Hughes Morgan played well all round the wicket. ## TO-DAY'S CRICKET.

### MONMOUTHSHIRE v. CARMARTHENSHIRE.

#### SILVERLOCK'S DOUBLE CENTURY.

This two-days' match in the Minor Counties' Championship was commenced at Newport today in hot weather. The Monmouthshire team was largely an experimental one, trials being given to several young cricketers, who have not figured in the county side before. Carmarthenshire have not yet won a match in the championship, and their recent heavy defeats by Cornwall and Devon did not augur well for their success with Monmouthshire. The home captain won the toss, and sent in Silverlock and C. E. Hews, to the bowling of H. Howell and E. Gee. Hews left at 16, but Silverlock and Diver found run-getting on a hard wicket an easy matter. Despite several changes in the bowling, they scored all round the wicket with great freedom, and added 141 runs before Diver was beaten. The retiring batsman had made 71 by fine free batting, several of his strokes finding the boundary. At the luncheon interval, the score was 157 for two wickets, Silverlock being not out with 80 to his credit.

After the interval, Silverlock, who was joined by W. E. C. Hudden, soon reached his century, for which he had been batting 2½ hours. Hudden did not stay long, but with E. S. Phillips' arrival another stand was made.

Both batsmen hit out freely, and although there were many changes in the bowling, the score rose rapidly. Silverlock, who had been twice previously missed in the long field, was again missed before he reached his 150. Hugh Howell, one of the visitors, strained himself whilst bowling, and had to retire, C. E. Hews coming out as a substitute. The third century was telegraphed three and a half hours after the start.

When the total was 334, Phillips was bowled. He had exactly equalled Diver's score, and had hit seven 4's, and his partnership with Silverlock had added 136 runs for the fourth wicket.

J. R. Rowlands and W. P. Geen, the latter a Newport boy, home on holidays from Hailybury College, each scored a dozen in good style, and meanwhile Silverlock continued to bat splendidly.

The 400 was telegraphed at half-past five, and directly afterwards Silverlock completed his double century, after batting 4½ hours.

They did so well that Phillips was taken off in favour of M. Holley, but the 50 was telegraphed without a separation being effected.

With two runs added, however, Rees was caught off Silverlock, and Conway, of that ilk, took his place. But the total had only been increased to 56 when Evans was taken in the slips off Holley. Both Percy Rees and Evans had batted in good style, though making few big hits.

H. Howell joined Conway Rees, and when the total reached 72 Diver was given a turn with the ball. The old footballer, however, hit out well, but Howell, who strained himself on Friday, was limping badly and had to get someone to run for him. At length Conway Rees was easily caught off Watkins, having made a bright 30, and Howell did not long survive him.

Half the wickets were down for 108, Watkins bowling Davies and C. Morgan with successive balls, and getting John l.b.w. in the next over. At the luncheon interval the score was 128 for eight wickets.

After luncheon Gee and C. P. Lewis hit freely, and carried the score to 157, when Lewis was caught for 32, the eighth wicket having added 43 runs. Capt. Hughes Morgan, the last man, then joined Gee, and another capital stand was made. The pair added 67 runs, and then Gee was bowled, the innings closing at 3.15 for 224.

Captain Hughes Morgan and Ike Evans started Carmarthenshire's second innings. The last-named left with only two scored, but Captain Morgan and Percy Rees made a capital stand.

Captain Hughes Morgan and Percy Rees both hit out splendidly, but at length Hudden lifted the Captain's balls with a beautiful ball. The game was then adjourned for tea.
