MINOR COUNTIES' CRICKET.

SURREY II. v DORSET.

Yesterday's Scores.

In the Minor Counties' Championship, Surrey's second eleven met Dorset on the Guildford Sports Ground yesterday. The weather was ideal, and the pitch in excellent trim. Dorset won the toss, and decided to go to the wicket, sending P. F. Williams and the Rev. W. H. Arundel to face the bowling of Thompson and Platt. The match was marked by a sensational opening, Arundel being stumped from the first ball. After this reverse, however, the runs came steadily, though none of the batsmen seemed at home with Thompson's 'googlies.' G. Gordon was the only man to reach 30, and played well for his 54, before his wicket fell to one of Thompson's fast balls. At the luncheon interval the score was 124 for six wickets. The remainder of the wickets went cheaply, and the total was 147.

Knight and Gontley opened the batting for Surrey, Sewell and Stacey handling the ball. Gontley had hard luck in being given out lbw. when his score stood at 35. Sewell bowled well, and made a remarkably smart catch, which dismissed Abel for nothing. There was nothing further remarkable in the run of the game until Thompson, as last man, joined Vigar, when both batsmen commenced to hit out in fine style. Thompson, however, was caught when his score stood at 17, and curiously enough Surrey's total was 147, honours being thus even on the first innings. After tea Dorset returned to the wicket, and made 55 for four wickets before stumps were drawn. To-day (Saturday) play commences at 11 o'clock.

The County Game.

First of all a word about the county game which started on Friday morning and finished earlier than many thought it would end—soon after lunch on Saturday. It cannot be said that Guildfordians evinced any alarming amount of interest in the fact that county cricket was being played in their midst. When I looked in on Friday morning soon after the start I suppose there were less than a hundred spectators looking on beneath the shade of the sheltering eims, although during the afternoon the "gate" certainly did improve. But it was altogether a poor attendance. I think, however, if the Guildford Executive had had the wisdom to spend a few extra shillings on advertisement they might have been better rewarded. Many tradesmen in the High-street were in ignorance of the fact that county cricket could be seen on Friday in Guildford!

A "Googlie" Bowler.

When Dorset went to the wicket on Friday morning the pitch was in first-class condition—quite speedy, in fact. The West Countrymen looked just before lunch as if they were going to run up a big score, but subsequently Thompson's "googlie" bowling played havoc with the "Dorset" men. G. M. Gordon, hitting with a fine free stroke, was the only man in the team to knock up anything like a total. He obtained 54 before Thompson got him out with a beauty. Dorset's first innings total was 147; and, strangely enough, this was the figure reached by Surrey II. in their first knock.

Surrey's Low Scoring.

Surrey had a fairly strong team doing duty, and it was confidently thought when they went in to bat that they would quickly proceed to set their opponents leather-hunting. It cannot be said, however, that they made at all a promising start. Goatley and Vigar, the latter being not out, were the only two of the team to make a stand. The former made 35 and the latter had one less to his credit. Had these two failed Surrey would have found themselves in a mess. As it was, as mentioned above, the figures were only just equal on the board when the innings closed. Dorset had another smack and obtained 54 for four when stumps were drawn for the day.

Won by Three Wickets.

When play was resumed on Saturday morning the Dorset men continued their second innings, and were very soon disposed of for a total of 117. When Surrey's turn came for a second innings the scores still ruled low, but the cricket was oftentimes clever and almost always interesting. When the seventh wicket was down the Dorset total had been passed, and the county men won by three wickets. Sewell and Harrison shared the bowling honours.
