**Berkshire at Trowbridge.**

For the fourth match in succession the Berkshire Cricket Club were defeated on Saturday by an innings, Wiltshire securing the points by an innings and 57 runs. There is this consolation, that the Berkshire batting showed a considerable improvement on previous displays, but the weakness of the bowling was evidenced by the fact that the first Wiltshire pair put on 138 in an hour for the first wicket. Hawke'sworth's absence in these circumstances is all the more to be regretted, for he was proving the most effective member of the attack when he received his injury. A pleasing feature in an otherwise disappointing season is the consistency of Sir D. F. Nepean, who again hit up 48 and 52 in this match. The advent of F. E. Rowe has considerably strengthened the batting, and it was unfortunate that he just failed to reach his century, the veteran A. M. Miller bowling him when 7 short of that total. Shoosmith and Barrett were also fairly successful with the bat. In the bowling department Simpson has proved, of late, Berkshire's most effective cricketer. To take half the Wiltshire wickets for 184, with a total of 472, is, after all, not such a bad feat. George Williams had the unusual experience of a pair of spectacles, but he atoned for this by capturing 3 wickets for 96.

**WILTS v. BERKS.**

**Brilliant Win by the Moonrakers.**

Wilts, after gaining two handsome victories over Dorset and Bucks, commenced its third match of the week at Trowbridge, on Friday, when it met Berkshire, in glorious weather. The visitors won the toss and batted first on a perfect wicket, but made an inglorious start, two wickets going down for nine runs. Rowe hit freely, but four were down for 53. Then Sir Charles Nepean and Shoosmith made a splendid stand, putting on 72 before the visiting captain was splendidly caught by Grant for a valuable 48. At lunch the score was 130 for six. On resuming, Shoosmith was magnificently held on the boundary by Nicholson from a hard drive. Barrett quickly rattled up 34, and a total of 218 was reached.

Wilts started batting at 3.35, C. Awdry and S. R. Nicholson being the first pair of batsmen. The former at once commenced to hit, getting ten in the first over and 12 in the second. The following over he drove a ball right over the rails, amid the plaudits of the spectators, and 36 was reached in ten minutes. C. Awdry continued to bat in magnificent manner, scoring at a tremendous pace. In half an hour the score had reached 77, of which Awdry claimed 57. Nicholson then got a couple of beautiful fours through the slips, and a splendid cut by the local player sent up the century in 43 minutes. Both batsmen were now thoroughly set, and between them got 19 from one over off Wicklow. With the total at 136, made in exactly an hour, Nicholson was caught at mid-off for 48, which included eight fours. When 82, Awdry was missed over the bowler's head. Arthur Newman followed, and at once commenced to lay on the wood, hitting six 4's in quick succession, but he failed to properly get hold of a ball and was caught at cover point. Taunton failed. C. S. Awdry was brilliantly caught at mid-on for a splendid 118 marred with one chance. He hit eighteen 4's. The visitors' total was passed with four wickets down, and then ensued a long partnership between R. W. Awdry and Perkins, who put on 111 before the former was bowled for 52, including eleven 4's. At the close the score was 345 for five.

When play was resumed on Saturday Perkins and Miller scored at a tremendous pace, but just when everybody was expecting the former would complete his century he was bowled for 91—a delightful innings, made without a chance, and which included thirteen 4's. The home captain soon got 50, and Grant rattled up 30. The last wicket added a few, and when Mitchell was bowled the total had reached 472, 127 being added in just over an hour, and the full score compiled in four hours.

Berkshire wanted 254 to save the innings defeat, but commenced badly, two wickets going down for nine. Then Rowe was joined by Sir Charles Nepean, and a lengthy stand was made, these two putting on 123 before the latter was brilliantly caught left hand in the slips by C. Awdry. Soon after Rowe was bowled for a splendid 91, which included eighteen 4's. With 183 for five the visitors looked like saving the innings defeat, but A. Newman caused a collapse, and a total of 197 only was reached, Wilts thus securing its fourth win by an innings and 57 runs. Scores:—
