The home captain soon got 50, and TYrant rattle up 30 . The list wicket added a few, and when Mitchell was bowled the total had reached 472,127 being added in just over an hour, and tho full score compiled in four hours.
Berkshire wanted 254 to save the innings defeat, but commenced badly, two wickets going down for nine.
