COUNTY CRICKET.

BUCKS v. DORSET, AT MARLOW:

THE FIRST DAY.

These two counties met in the minor counties championship at Marlow, on Monday and Tuesday. Dorset are third in the list, while Bucks come next last but one. Dorset went to the wickets first, and gave a very bright display, putting together a total of 304 in their first innings. The team batted with confidence, and only one man in the side failed to add to the score, which mounted up prettily rapidly. The first wicket fell at 42, the second at 87, the third at 129, and at lunch-time the score stood at 143 for 4. A fine display of batting was given by Sewell, who hit the bowling everywhere, on one occasion sending it over the hedge into an adjoining field, and on another, to the roof of the pavilion, necessitating a new ball. Sewell lost his wicket through an ill-timed attempt at a run, which was the reverse to cautious and returned to the pavilion top scorer with 83 as his share of the score. Browne and Canby were not long in returning to the pavilion, though the first-named played a very bright little innings of 20. Hodges, who succeeded Browne, scored very rapidly, and when the eighth wicket fell the score was 223. Harrison now joined Hodges, and the score steadily progressed. Hodges's dismissal came by way of a catch. Keen taking him off Vickerstaff's bowling. The game was now 9 for 293, and Stacey, who went in last, carried his bat out for 5, Harrison having been run out for a useful 28. Of the bowlers, Wright took 6 wickets for 111 runs, and Vickerstaffe 2 for 34. Bucks opened with Dr. Weaver-Adams and Orton; Harrison and Sewell bowling. Sewell's second ball captured the Doctor's wicket, and the score was nil. G. M. Faulkner came in, and after scoring three was caught by H. Harrison, off W. Harrison, the score being 7 for two wickets. Leat succeeded, and a few singles were stolen, run-getting being exceedingly difficult, owing to the exceptionally keen fielding. The third wicket fell at 28. Orton being bowled by W. Harrison, having made 4. Keen filled the vacancy, and Leat and he carried the score to 42, when Keen was bowled by Sewell. The figures were 42 for 4, and were immediately made worse, Wright being out, leg before, to the first ball Sewell served him. Half the side were now out for 42, and seven runs later Leat was caught by Clarke, off Harrison, having put together 25. The Bucks Captain (W. F. Lowndes) went in and scored four for a start, but the promise of better things was not redeemed, for at 64 Lowndes was caught by Canby. H. L. Slocock followed, but returned leg before to Sewell, without adding to the score, and eight wickets were down for 65. E. A. Shaw, of Marlborough, and son of the Rev. E. D. Shaw (Vicar of High Wycombe), came in, West, the left-handed batsman, was bowled for 16, and the score was 95 for 9. Shaw and Vickerstaffe failed to raise it to the hundred, and the innings closed for 99. The bowling figures were: Harrison, 5 wickets for 42; Sewell, 5 wickets for 38. Bucks were thus left with a deficit of 205 on the first innings, and followed on, Shaw and West opening to the bowling of Harrison and Sewell. Shaw hit the first ball Sewell sent him to the boundary, and began to play with confidence. Eight runs were registered when West was caught by A. Harrison, off Sewell. Wright taking his place. The last-named contented himself with playing cautiously, and the score began to rise, chiefly owing to Shaw. At 26, Gordon replaced Stacey at bowling, and at 30 Sewell gave way to Canby, but the change of bowlers led to nothing, and when stumps were drawn for the day the score was 41 for one—Shaw 81, Wright 7. That Bucks would succeed in averting a single innings defeat was more a hope than expectation. To do that they had to get 164 runs for the 9 wickets that were left. Still, with a renewal on Tuesday of the style displayed by Shaw and Wright, it was not without the bounds of probability.

THE SECOND DAY.

The over-night not-outs, Shaw and Wright, went to the wickets and faced the bowling of the two Harrisons (A. and W.). Shaw gave a delightful batting display, and though he had a narrow chance of being run out early, his innings was otherwise sound. The 100 was made just after noon, and Shaw had, up to then, hit 8 fours and several threes. The Bucks supporters began to look quite cheerful, and someone suggested that he was set for a century, when he was neatly caught by Arundell, off Sewell, for a valuable 76, and returned to the pavilion amid hearty applause. Two wickets down for 110. Orton went in to bat, and the bowling was changed, Stacey going on at the pavilion end. In his first over, Stacey bowled Orton, and the score stood at 135 for 3, the retiring batsman having scored 9. E. Leat filled the vacancy, and 5 runs later, Wright was caught by Canby, off Stacey, with the total at 140 for 4. Wright's innings of 34 was a good steady piece of work. The score had not risen when Leat was bowled by Sewell, after scoring a couple of runs. Half the side were now out for 140, and Bucks still wanted 65 to avert a single innings defeat. The rate at which the last three wickets had fallen made things look gloomy once more. The Bucks captain (W. F. Lowndes) and Dr. Weaver-Adams now became partners, and started sending the bowling in all directions. Boundaries came freely and confidence rose. The partnership was dissolved,

however, at 184, Lowndes being clean bowled by Sewell. Keen, who went in next, should have been out with the first ball he received, but the Dorset fielder just failed to get it, amid the gasps of his colleagues. The 200 went up just before lunch. Canby went on bowling in place of Stacey, and a ball that Weaver-Adams hit was overthrown; crediting that player with a five, and at the same time passing the first innings total of Dorset. Keen was then smartly caught by Hodges (the wicket-keeper), off Sewell, and the adjournment for lunch saw the score at 209 for 7. On the resumption of play, Weaver-Adams was run out, owing to a misunderstanding with Faulkner, who was at the other end, and did not run. H. L. Slocock went in, and Faulkner was bowled by Harrison. The score now being 216 for 9, Vickerstaffe joined Slocock, but the last wicket was not destined to add materially to the score, for after scoring a single, Vickerstaffe was bowled by Sewell, and the innings terminated for 217. Sewell took 6 wickets for 93 runs, and Stacey 2 for 36. Dorset wanted 13 runs, and P. F. C. Williams with the Rev. W. H. Arundell soon knocked off these, leaving Dorset winners of the match by 10 wickets. Scores and analysis:—
