Hayes played a really fine game: he made 80 out of 176 in 150 minutes without a chance and hit five 4's. In response to a total of 196, Leicestershire lost Wood at 22, but Knight played well for 31 and Whitehead and Coe put on 40 in 25 minutes. When stumps were drawn with five wickets down for 92 the latter's score was 23. Yesterday Coe failed to add to his score and the remaining wickets went down for 17. During the innings Strudwick made five catches and Smith took six wickets for 42. Going in again, Hobbs and Hayes, by fine forcing cricket, put on 74 together in 40 minutes after Hayward was out without a run. The others, however, failed, only Strudwick and Marshal reaching double-figures, and Leicestershire were set 217 to win in three hours and a-quarter. Smith and Rushby again met with success, six wickets going down in an hour for 40. RABBIT A CRICKET EXPERT.

ANIMAL HELPS BELLEVUE CLUB TO WIN ITS MATCH GAMES.

A gray rabbit that plays cricket is the chief ornament just now of Anderson Park in this city. It is an active member of the Bellevue Cricket Club and takes part in match games. Members of other and competing clubs object to the Bellevue Club ringing in a rabbit. The objections are ignored, however, and thus far all the scores made stand as being official. The rabbit is a poor little orphan. It has no father, no mother, no brother and no sister. The only relatives it has are the members of the cricket club, who have been adopted.

As soon as the cricketers line up on the green, the rabbit, which has been christened Artie by the members of the Junior Mountain Society, hops out on the green and takes his place in the Bellevue's line-up. When the ball goes afield the rabbit makes after it, stops it with its front paws, swings about, backs up and gives the ball a powerful kick that sends it spinning towards the wicket-keeper. The more radical admirers of the rabbit say it is one of the most scientific fielders of the team. It has literally kicked its way to popularity.

Bunny is everybody's pet. Even the rabbit hounds refuse to chase it. When it first was seen in the Park, almost a year ago, it was exceedingly wild. The children began feeding it and petting it and now it eats out of the hand. In Upper Montclair there is a children's organization called the Junior Mountain Society. Its mission is to preserve the natural beauties. The children in the club have constituted themselves the guardians of the cricket playing rabbit when the members of the Bellevue Cricket Club are not around. Once or twice a day the boys are seen in or near the Park engaged in fierce combat. Inquiry in relation to the cause of the fighting almost invariably elicits the information that one of the boys was caught chasing the pet rabbit and that the other boy is thrashing him for it. It is the best protected rabbit in New Jersey.—New York Press.

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

NOTTS. II. v. DURHAM.

Cricket was played at Trent Bridge yesterday under the most favourable circumstances. The Notts. Juniors had by far the best of matters with both bat and ball, and at the close, when each side had batted once they led by 108 runs. The wicket was absolutely true, so that it was a little surprising to find the visitors dismissed in two and a half hours for 143. Most of the execution was done by Clifton and Barnes, who kept an impeccable length. Turnbull and Brooks were the only batsmen to face the Notts. bowlers with any degree of confidence, and the professional's innings, which included seven 4's and one 3, was a very praiseworthy effort.

At one time it seemed that James and Armstrong, who opened the Notts. innings, were destined to make a very productive stand, but the former played hard on from Smith, and Armstrong, after apparently settling down, treated the same bowler with too much confidence, and paid the penalty when 7 short of his 50. He made some fine pulls, and cut the fast bowler with great skill. Carr revealed extremely promising form in compiling 30, but the tit-bit of the day's play came towards the end, in the shape of a splendid last wicket partnership between Staunton and Riley. Coming together at twenty minutes to six when the score stood at 172, they tacked on a welcome 81, before the professional gave a hard return to Morris. Fortune favoured the brave, and, aided by several lives the pair took a thorough grip of the bowling, and boundaries were frequent. The catch with which Turnbull dismissed Lee was brilliant, indeed, the fielding of both sides was for the greater part of the day above criticism.

NOTTS. II. WORST DURHAM.

Two hours sufficed to finish this match at Trent Bridge yesterday, Notts. obtaining a creditable victory by ten wickets. Thanks to a fine last wicket stand the previous night, Durham had 103 to get to save the innings defeat, and they started none too well, three wickets being down for 13 runs.

A stand by Turnbull and Brooks made things look better, but the professional's middle stump was uprooted by a fine ball from Clifton with the score at 35. Brooks's partnership with Cumberlege brought a double change in the bowling, Iremonger replacing Barnes, and Riley, Clifton, Whysall, whose smart wicket-keeping was a feature of the game, snapped Cumberlege off Iremonger, and put an end to a partnership which had taken the score from 40 to 91. With Coulson in Brooks brought up the century, and at 107 Armstrong bowled for Iremonger, Clifton having previously taken Riley's place. Off Armstrong's first ball Coulson got a single, which saved the innings defeat, but the next clean beat Brooks. Bowick was run out before he had scored, and attempting a foolish run off the next ball Morris shared the same fate. The innings closed for 113 just before half past one, and Notts. knocked off the 6 necessary runs without loss. Score and analysis:—
