ANOTHER correspondent, writing from Poona, sends me a second interesting piece of descriptive writing in the shape of the appended letter to an Indian journal:—

CORRESPONDENCE.

A SCHOOL BOY'S COMPLAINT.

To the Editor of the Daily Telegraph and Deccan Herald.

SIR,—I beg through your medium to draw the kind attention of the Secretary and others of the Athletic Sport Club for boys with respect to "Umpires." In the Shield-match either Senior or Junior generally the teachers of the respective schools or often boys or men with little knowledge of Cricket-rules become Umpires and when often dispute arises it turns out a serious matter and grumbings of the injured party have no limits. For however upright and angel-like Umpires may be, but when there is an exciting game only exerting for 2 or 5 runs to win, their hearts are voluntarily melted to show partiality and are tempted to decide in their own side's favour anyhow. And thus the other party is greatly wronged and loses the game also. So cannot the authority redress this grievance by kindly appointing two neutral Umpires, who have no concerns whatsoever with any of the contending schools and who must possess knowledge of the cricket rules, when both the parties will be satisfied and no more grumbings afterwards about being duped. On the fixed day those appointed umpires only should be invited to watch and decide the game.

I trust the heads of other schools, whether wronged or otherwise, will join and concur with my opinion and suggestion.

OBITUARY.

Mr. F. PERRIN.

Mr. Frederick Perrin, eldest brother of Mr. P. A. Perrin, died on the 12th inst. at Suffolk House, Woodberry Down, Finsbury Park, in his forty-fourth year. He was a hard-hitting and free-scoring batsman, who would have made a name for himself had he elected to devote his energies to first-class cricket. In club matches he made many large scores, including 209 not out for Tottenham v. Wanstead in July, 1899, and 247 not out for Crouch End against Lauderdale in June of the following year. The latter innings was played on the Crouch End ground after Lauderdale had been dismissed for 100. He and A. E. Crang (123) made 363 for the first wicket, the first three hundred runs being obtained in 105 minutes. Crouch End's final score was 390 for one wicket.

The return game was commenced at Bury St. Edmunds on Monday, when the home County made a wretched start, losing three wickets for 7 runs. A fairly good recovery was made, and the sixth man was out at 142, but the innings closed for the addition of 11. The visitors passed their opponents' total at the sixth wicket, but the innings concluded with only 19 on. On Tuesday Suffolk knocked off the arrears before a wicket fell, but only Walters, Ireland, and Raynor shaped at all well, and the side were out for 145. Wharmby bowled finely. Set 127 to win, Bedfordshire made a useful start, and Peel in particular scored runs freely after being missed in the long field. At 75 only three wickets were down, but for ten more six were out, and the totals were equal at the fall of the seventh wicket. It looked any odds on the visitors now winning, as there were still three men to come in to get the single run required. But again the uncertainty of cricket manifested itself, for Apthorp was dismissed first ball and Foy with the next. Rice, who had taken no part in the game all day through being indisposed, was by courtesy allowed to bat; but Peel, in his anxiety to get the run, made a poor stroke and skied the ball into slip's hands; and this sensational ending left the match a tie, the five points being divided

SUFFOLK v. BEDFORD.  
FIRST DAY'S PLAY.

The meeting of the Suffolk and Bedfordshire county teams at Bury St. Edmunds on Monday was favoured with glorious summer weather, though the sun proved somewhat troublesome. The first day of this two days' fixture, which has been eagerly looked forward to in Suffolk, proved very successful, and some splendid play was witnessed. The home team, who were the first before the wickets, kept the Bedfordshire bowlers going well into the afternoon, consequently the time of drawing stumps was prolonged to a quarter to seven, enabling the visitors to complete their innings. The scoring on the part of the latter was more even than in the case of Suffolk, and after a splendid fight they had a lead of 19 runs. The initial partnership was made by O. H. Walters and E. Pritchett, but Morecom soon brought off Walters' bails with a good ball. Pritchett, who was in good form, was not so easily dealt with, no fewer than 34 standing to his name when he left the wickets. Orr was responsible for his disposal. Hon. R. Gorell Barnes, following the example of Walters, did not open his score, he being run out. Grierson held the ball off J. F. Ireland's bat, when the latter had only registered 2. S. Hillwood made a fine stand for 34, when he was caught by Apthorp. Capt. Wilson knocked up 50, the highest score of the day, in splendid style. He was also caught by Apthorp. K. Raynor made 17 (not out), playing well. The other four wickets were disposed of for an aggregate of 6, so that Suffolk's score totalled 153, including 19 extras.

R. W. Rice and B. L. Peel were first to bat for Bedfordshire, and they put up 50, the former scoring 30. Both played well, and were dismissed by catches. Wharmby's wickets were down for a quintette, and King only exceeded his score by 4. Holdstock played a nice 16, whilst Orr, who made a steady stand, put up 44 slowly, including three 4s. Apthorp was smartly stumped as the unlucky number, and Sutherland was caught with 9 to his credit. SUFFOLK v. BEDFORDSHIRE.

This match opened at Bury on Monday, in ideal cricket weather. It was Suffolk's last game in the competition, and they had one of the best sides possible, P. W. Cobbold being the principal absentee. It was regrettable that room could not be found for Trudgett, who had been asked to play, but who stood down owing to the fact that arrangements had been made for the inclusion of the Rev. H. F. Steel. The wicket appeared a good one, and winning the toss should have proved an advantage to Suffolk, but a wretched start was made against the bowling of A. F. Morcom, the old Cambridge fast bowler, and H. Grierson. With his third ball Morcom lowered O. H. Walters' off stump. The Hon. R. Gorell-Barnes followed. The ball went to leg on his pad, and E. Pritchett ran, but the Oxfordian was too intent on watching the progress of the ball to get off the mark, and Pritchett making no effort to get back Barnes sacrificed himself to the West Suffolker by crossing over. J. F. Ireland filled the vacancy, made a couple, and was then caught at mid-off, Morcom being again the bowler. This made three out for 7. Things improved when Hill-Wood parted with Pritchett, the former made some excellent shots, but the ball did not travel far in the long grass. Pritchett out Morcom to the pavilion rails, and Hill-Wood got a leg glance to the wall in the same over. The first bowling change was made at 46, P. A. Foy relieving Grierson.
