The first county match at Bridlington opened on Wednesday in ideal crucket weather. Yorkshirs second string opposed Cheshire. The visitors included ten amateurs. There was a gate of 600. Enlivening cricket characterized the opening day's play in the Yorkshire Second Rieven v. Cheshire match, which commenced as Bridlington yesterday. 
