It will be remembered that Bedfordshire beat 'Liroclinshire at Wardown a short time ago, and this was the return fixture, The home side were without their captain. The Bedfordshire men first went to the wickets, WE King and B L Peel batting. The latter proved a disappointment, for he had only made five before he was bowled by Geeson. King played well, however, and he and Wharmby looked like carrying the total well forward. Wharmby had only reached double figures when the Beds "pro." lifted a ball from Cooke to Williams, who caught him out. Holdstock followed on, and it was a treat to witness the way he treated the home bowling. Evidently determined to redeem his non-success at Luton, Bert, as usual, started carefully, and when he began to feel a bit secure he laid about him with quies confidence. The score gradually mounted, he and King playing the bowling well. In fact runs came so regularly that a change in the bowling was tried. This proved ineffectual, for the total of the visitors still grew handsomely. Both wickets fell rather close together, "King having scored 69 and Holdstock 42. H. R. Orr, the Beds captain, and E E Aptherp both unscountably failed, the former having scored but a single when he was bowled by Cooke. Apthorp fell to a catch. The Dunstable Master has a weakness for "golf strokes" at cricket. H O Entherland and G S Leventhorpe met with more success, otherwise the score of the visitors would have looked poor on such a perfect wicket as that at Skegness. LINCOLNSHIEE v. BEDFORDSHIRE.

Bedfordshire made their first acquaintance with Lincolnshire at home on Friday, beautiful weather favouring the meeting at Skegness. Bedfordshire had a good side out, the eleventh place being given to G. S. Leventhorpe, an old Elstonian, who justified his invitation by a capital 25.

King and B. L. Peel opened Bedfordshire's venture, but Peel soon retired beaten by the old Leicestershire pro. Wharmby, too, was not a stayer, but with Holdstock partnering King there was a long stand, during which the first 100 was sent up. Then came a series of disasters, until Sutherland and Leventhorpe, playing sterling cricket, pushed the scoring board along at a good pace. After their dismissal Geeson and Cooke quickly finished off the Bedfordshire innings, which had realised 215 in three hours.

A long first-wicket stand by Ward and Hatt gave Lincolnshire an excellent start, the partnership standing until a brilliant catch by Morcom got rid of Hatt, who had been the more aggressive of the two. Wickets then fell fast, five men being out at 107. Then Riley and Cooke stayed the rot by cautious batting, until Wharmby entired Cooke out of his ground, and Apthorp smartly stumped him. Directly afterwards Apthorp took Norman at the wicket off Foy, so that at the close of play, with three wickets in hand, Lincolnshire were 28 behind on the first innings, Riley being then 47 (not out) and Geeson 4 not out.

After another series of fluctuations the game ended on Saturday afternoon in a four wickets victory for Lincolnshire. Geeson did not stay much longer on Saturday morning, but Riley soon completed his 50, and batted weil until Morcom disturbed his stumps. Then Wells and Allen made a long last-wicket stand, and Bedfordshire's total was eventually exceeded by 32.

Bedfordshire made rather a worse show in the second innings, for only the skipper felt at home with Cooke's swervers, and the venture left them with only 136 runs in hand. However, they still made a good fight of it, Morcom and Wharmby dressing down the earlier batsmen so well that with half the men out the game stood quite in Bedfordshire's favour. Then a long stand by Duy and Cooke intervened with the result that the runs were knocked off and Lincolnshire won a most interesting game by 4 wickets.
