If anything, the natives seemed to me to be the better all-round men. I then thought it would be a very good idea, and a very educational one for the Westralians, if a visit could be arranged. The turf pleases them immensely, and anyone who has partaken of the hospitality of the Island can never forget it. Trevarthen and Coad added 50 runs before the latter was out to a catch off Silverlock. Vibart, who succeeded him, heiped Trevarthen to put on another 89 runs before the next wicket fell. At the luncheon interval the visitors had scored 334 for the loss of six wickets.

On resuming after luncheon the hitting continued, but when Trevarthen was caught the Cornish captain declared the innings closed at 331 for seven wickets. Trevarthen had made 88 runs, including twelve 4's, and although he scored rather slowly his innings was a sound one.
