## OBITUARY.

## Mr. R. Halley.

Mr. Russell Halley, at one time a prominent New Zealand cricketer, died at Wellington on July 6th at the age of forty-nine. His first appearance in a representative match was for Canterbury against Wellington at Wellington in 1886.7, when he and Dunlop. bowling unchanged throughout, dismissed Wellington for 66 and 34 and won the game for their side by 110 runs. Dunlop took ten wickets for 36 runs and Halley, who at one period bowled 50 balls for one run and fire wickets, nine for 52 . Halley never did quite so well again in a match of sach importance, although he took six wickets for 50 runs for XVIII of Canterbury against Shrewsbury's Team at Hagley Park in March, 1888. He was a lefthand medium-paced bowler and a fair bat.
