





**SPORTING NOTES.**

**CRICKET.**

Surrey's overwhelming defeat at Blackheath leaves the struggle for the County Championship practically between Kent, Lancashire and Yorkshire, and interest promises to be maintained until the end of the season. The match from the Surrey point of view was rather remarkable for the men who did not play than for those who actually took the field. The absentees included the skipper, Mr. H. D. G. Leveson-Gower, who at the last moment received an intimation of the death of an aunt, and was in consequence unable to take the field, Hayward, Hobbs, Mr. J. N. Crawford, Mr. E. C. Kirk, Mr. J. E. Raphael, Lord Dalmeny, Capt. H. S. Bush (who registered a compilation of 245 in a club match at Folkestone last week), Alan Marshal and Hitch. The county is to be condoned with upon its misfortune in being unable to place a representative team in the field. • • •

Rain sadly interfered with local cricket on Saturday, and it was the exception, rather than the rule for a definite decision to be arrived at. Naturally the ball had the command over the bat, and a number of meritorious performances were chronicled. • • •

At Banstead the Rovers were enabled to complete their engagement with Finsbury Park. Harnant won the toss, and took first knock on a good, solid wicket. The bowling appeared to be a little loose, Baldwin bowled two overs of his lobs, but was severely punished by Harnant, who received eleven out of the twelve balls bowled, hitting every ball to the boundary, thus scoring 44 in two overs. With the score at 202 for 7 wickets the innings was declared closed. Finsbury Park never attempted to get the runs. Allen, Borrill and Perring threw their wickets away by running out to hit fast bowling. Allen played good cricket for his 68, and had he been able to find someone to stay with him probably the game would have been saved for them. About ten minutes before time Harnant put Hunter on to bowl, who with his first ball got Allen smartly stumped, the second ball knocked Hinch's middle stump out of the ground, and the third shattered Bullock's stumps. He thus took three wickets for no runs, and accomplished the hat trick. • • •

A correspondent writes:—The Nutfield captain and his men are deserving of the highest praise for playing their League match at Nutfield against Reigate Heath on Saturday on a wicket very unfit for cricket. This they did sooner than render the inevitable replay necessary. Within half-an-hour of the heavy storm that raged about three o'clock play was commenced. With five wickets down for 23 another severe downfall of rain ensued, but play was resumed about half-past five, and in less than ten minutes the innings closed for 31 runs. The Nutfield team then took the field at once, and the Heath began their innings, and in 20 minutes had secured victory. Play was, however, continued until seven o'clock, the hour fixed for drawing stumps, when Reigate Heath had made 13 runs for five wickets. Webb's 42 included several boundary hits. Padgham and Carpenter also batted well. • • •

## CRICKET NOTES.

### Phew!

We have had plenty to interest us in Guildford this week, and during the week-end, in the way of good cricket. The weather could not possibly have been better; the sun has shone with a fervour and persistency which although causing a good many "Phew!" and such-like expressive ejaculations of tolerant approval, has rejoiced the hearts of all keen cricketers.

### Cricket Week.

Guildford's annual "cricket week" started at the Sports Ground on Monday. Almost ideal weather prevailed, and although a fair number attended, much was left to be desired in the matter of the "gate." Some good games were witnessed, and the local batsmen revelled in an almost ideal condition of things—except for the deficiency referred to—and in the matter of sport did not fare badly. The ground, too, was in grand condition during most of the week. Cricket, however, can never hope to rival the fascination of football, which can attract crowds in a biting wind, while the former game often fails to attract in the most glorious weather. But on some days there was almost a respectable attendance, with bright coloured spots round the field where a bevy of ladies lent a touch of gaiety to the scene.

### Brookwood's Rent.

The first day Guildford came off the field eminently pleased with themselves. They had never been in better form, and the players were buoyant with the consciousness of "something attempted, something done," for really there had been a walk-over. Brookwood had been defeated by six wickets and 69 runs, and despite a moderate "gate," the hopes of local cricketers were bright for the morrow. About the scoring the result elsewhere on this page is the most eloquent record of the work of the individual members of the eleven. Wynyard batted splendidly, and must be mentioned, his 69 coming as a fine opening to the game; but even this substantial score is, by comparison, but little to the magnificent 157 contributed by F. H. Franks as a result of his clean hitting and driving. At the close of the game he was still vigorous, and although narrowly missed in the field during the afternoon, was still "not out." Guildford's score of 321 with four wickets down needs only one comment—well done!

### A Draw with the M.C.C.

The local side did not find life so easy on the second day (Tuesday), when they were called to face the M.C.C. These gentlemen gave them a stirring game, and the result is best described as a creditable draw. There were some nice scores on the M.C.C. side, who, batting first, compiled 278. Murrell, the Middlesex man, contributed 89, N. J. Moffat 50, and K. D. Thorburn and F. Titley 35 and 38 respectively. P. Christopherson made the highest for Guildford, scoring 82, and P. H. Franks followed with a useful 46. The Guildford batsmen, who did not exhibit the form of the previous day, played out time.

### A Win for the "Liberals."
