COUNTY AVERAGES.

WARWICKSHIRE.

When the match at Bournemouth finished yesterday afternoon Warwickshire had sustained their eighth reverse of the season, this defeat being even more decisive in character than that suffered in the opening match at the Oval, where Surrey won very easily. Looking back over the season it is a poor record that meets the eye, for of the twenty county championship matches played three have been won, eight lost, and nine drawn. With the bowling at the command of the county the one thing needful to assist in success were hard and fast wickets. Those, unfortunately, were not forthcoming, and when the season opened with such a succession of slow wickets it required little prescience to predict for Warwickshire a dolorous and unsuccessful summer. For a long time neither batsmen nor bowlers could do anything right, while the eleven were greatly handicapped at the opening by the inability of T. S. Fishwick to assist. With the wickets unsuitable for Field, who had happily recovered from an old ailment, the bowling never appeared very formidable, and with so much depending upon an old servant, Santall, the team could scarcely hope to get out cheaply the stronger batting sides encountered. It is some little consolation, however, to find some of the younger amateur aspirants making fair progress, and in F. R. Foster, H. G. Pridmore, and one or two others who have assisted occasionally Warwickshire possess promising recruits. But while there may be room here for a little congratulation, the fact must not be overlooked that some at least of the professionals are approaching a stage when they are bound to be challenged by younger players, and in approaching this particular detail one's buoyancy concerning the amateurs is quickly overwhelmed, for it is abundantly obvious that there are no young professionals to fill any gaps that may occur. This is a subject that may well cause the committee some concern. In a season so depressing the task of leading the side has frequently been irksome and disheartening, but Mr. Glover deserves a good deal of credit for sticking to his guns in the proper spirit of a sportsman.

Commencing with the defeat by Surrey in May, reversed followed at the hands of Lancashire, Derbyshire, Northants, and Hampshire, and the county had to play into the middle of July to record their first victory, this being obtained at the expense of Sussex. At Leeds, Yorkshire won after some rather keen fighting on the last day of the match, and yet another severe reverse came from Worcestershire. Playing at Northampton the team did infinitely better, and it was not at all a bad performance to defeat the vastly improved Northants team, this victory following up a win over Gloucestershire at Edgbaston. Over the game at Bournemouth one does not desire to linger, for the bowlers always had our batsmen in difficulties, and one may be reasonably doubtful whether in winning the toss the visiting captain gained any advantage. It was a substantial defeat, but not quite so surprising, and certainly not so humiliating, as some of the others. To give the season's doings in detail it may be added that defeats were inflicted by Surrey, Lancashire, Derbyshire, Northants, Hampshire (twice), Yorkshire, and Worcestershire; victories were obtained against Sussex, Gloucestershire, and Northants; and drawn games were played with Derbyshire, Surrey, Gloucestershire, Worcestershire, Yorkshire, Leicestershire (twice), Sussex, and Lancashire.

BATTING.

With one or two notable exceptions the batting of the team has been uneven and disappointing. Once more William Quaife occupies the leading position, and is again followed by Kinnair, the left-hander. The latter started off in splendid form, but was unseated at a critical period of the season by an accident to one of his fingers. Quaife's highest, and probably his best, batting display of the season was at Northampton, where his innings of 147 not out had a good deal to do with the victory ultimately achieved by Warwickshire. He has shown his usual consistent form, at any rate, since July came in, but has received anything but strong support from his colleagues. Kinnair played two very fine innings, against Surrey and Worcestershire respectively, the latter display going a long way towards getting Warwickshire out of a difficult position. Mr. A. C. S. Glover, without playing a three-figure innings and with only a few big scores, has really excellent figures, and the same may also be said of F. R. Foster, who has proved himself one of the most improved batsmen of the year. It was against Sussex that the latter made 87, his highest score, and this remarkably fine innings had much to do with Warwickshire's first victory of the season. Lilley and Charleworth come out with creditable figures, but of the remainder very little of a favourable nature can be said.

BOWLING.

Santall has proved himself the most consistent and successful bowler of the year, and the probability is that had he received more support he would have obtained better figures. F. R. Foster, who follows Santall in point of merit, has not quite sustained the promise of last year, and it is the opinion of many good judges that he has sacrificed some of his efficiency in an endeavour to bowl at higher speed than last season. As already pointed out, Field has been unsuited by the wickets. Hargreave has not been so deadly as of yore, while it has appeared occasionally that both Charleworth and Quaife might have been given more opportunities.

COUNTY AVERAGES.

WORCESTERSHIRE.

Mr. H. K. Foster and his talented comrades have experienced a season of remarkable inconsistency, their contradiction of form confounding their friends and their critics alike. At their best, they have proved themselves capable of defeating the strongest sides in the country, but, on the other hand, when things have gone awry with the team, they have been spiritless and seemingly beyond hope of redemption. Ere one had barely recovered, however, from the shock of some abject defeat, they have as suddenly bounded to the front again in brilliant style. They gave early promise of great things by defeating Yorkshire, Kent, and Middlesex, and these magnificent victories prepared everyone for more of the same character. The batting has not been quite so reliable as last season, when their wins exceeded their losses, for this season finds them with as many defeat-speaking of county championship engagements—as victories. With H. K. Foster showing to best advantage with the bat than for a long time past, there has been no one on the side to compensate for his decline, and, in spite of occasional good work by M. K., the famous brotherhood have not dominated the play to anything like the extent they have done heretofore. The bowling has been no better nor no worse than expected, although G. H. Simpson-Hayward has occasionally done marvellously well with his lob. W. B. Burns, too, has rendered most valuable assistance in this department. In spite of their lapses and shortcomings at different periods of the season, they have proved themselves one of the most attractive elevens in the country, and to their helpers and friends it must be matter of some concern that the club has not been more warmly supported on the County Ground at Worcester. Their victories have been gained against Yorkshire (twice), Kent, Middlesex, Somerset, Gloucestershire, Warwickshire, and Lancashire. Against these have to be set the defeats inflicted by Lancashire, Surrey (twice), Middlesex, Kent, Hampshire (twice), and Sussex. Drawn games were played with Warwickshire, Sussex, Somerset, and Gloucestershire. In addition to these county championship encounters, Worcestershire were beaten by the Australians and Oxford University, and a drawn game was also played with Staffordshire.

BATTING.

In the averages given below the figures refer to County Championship matches only, and here it will be found that Arnold heads the list with the fine average of 40.62. Next in order comes Pearson, with 30.69. Both have exceeded 1,000 runs for the season, a distinction missed by W. B. Burns and Bowley. Arnold has improved upon last season's record by four points, and Pearson by five, the latter being one of the most improving batsmen playing. But in reviewing the batting as a whole, the decline of H. K. Foster has been most pronounced, and it is quite remarkable that he has not once reached a three-figure innings. One would have to go back a long way to find the old Oxonian with such a poor record, but it has to be placed to his credit that he has led the side with the same ability and abounding enthusiasm as in the past, and has, upon occasions, got splendid work from the men under his command in times of stress. His latest achievement against Surrey goes to show that he has not yet lost all his cunning of fence or power of hitting. W. B. Burns, who for some time was under a cloud, came into his own in mid-season, and has scarcely looked back since. Arnold has once reached 200, and has played another three-figure innings. Bowley twice exceeded 100, and W. B. Burns and Pearson have both done the same upon one occasion. Cuffe, scarcely maintained his form of last season with the bat, and Bowley made no advance. M. K. Foster has been rather inconsistent, his moderate scores being disappointing after showing so much promise. He is young yet, however, and is bound to improve. There has been no discovery of importance amongst the few new men tried, although both W. H. Taylor and G. L. Crowe have given valuable assistance at times. The other figures speak for themselves.

Hayward, whose 48 wickets for 19.27 each is a captain performance. Cuffe has again rendered his side signal service in this department, and is certainly one of the most useful men on the side. Burns did a sensational performance against Kent at Taunton, and Arnold and Pearson have bowled with varying success. W. B. Burns has been of estimable service now and again, and must feel well satisfied with his season's work after starting so poorly. The achievements of the others call for no comment. Bade and Gaukroger have divided the honours of wicket-keeping, both having done things with the gloves.
