

**Staple Hill Wednesday v. Trowbridge Wednesday.**  
**An Extraordinary Game.**

Christian writes: The cricket match between Staple Hill Wednesday and Trowbridge Wednesday at Staple Park this week was the queerest match I have seen for many a day. Staple Hill claimed the match, but as a matter of fact neither team won. When Trowbridge's eighth man was said to be stumped the Town needed eight runs to win. The umpire doing duty for Trowbridge was not very decisive concerning his decision regarding Hurley, and the result was a wrangle. This gentleman (the umpire) told me he was not very conversant with the rules of the game, and he only went out to umpire because the Town had found a difficulty in getting anyone else. In both innings some queer decisions had been given, and this question of Hurley's wicket brought the climax to a game that had not been satisfactory to either side. The Trowbridge captain called his team together and decided not to go on with the game. Matters were made all the worse by an old gentleman, 70 years of age, coming up to the pavilion and soundly abusing the Trowbridge team. Only three men in the Staple Hill eleven got double figures, and their total of 66 was got on a very slow wicket; in fact 50 runs at Staple Park on Wednesday were worth 100 on a good wicket and field. Smart took 9 wickets at a cost of 37 runs. Trowbridge made a rocky start, four good wickets, including England, Madment, Popham, and Smart, being down for a total of 7 runs. Ford, who got half-a-dozen, was at the wickets for a quarter of an hour before he scored. Taylor, who got the only six of the match for one hit, compiled 15, and he was top scorer for Trowbridge. In the Staple Hill team was A. Humphries, of St. George, the hardest hitter in East Bristol, and Godwin, a fast bowler from the Frenchay club, near Bristol. In the former game at Trowbridge the Town team won easily.

**TROWBRIDGE CRICKET NOTES.**

Results to date: Won 5, lost 5, drawn 4.  
It was three o'clock when a strong Trowbridge side emerged from the mysteries of the guards' van at Warminster on Saturday, and a late start portended a draw.

Warminster gained choice of innings and started well with Clark and McMinnies on a slow but easy wicket.

Clark batted well, and had made 16 out of 28 when he was bowled. T. G. Matthews came next, and mistakes in the field enabled the batsmen to put on 44 runs for the second wicket. Matthews was missed in the slips from a simple chance, and McMinnies put the ball up on several occasions, and showed a tendency to feel for the dangerous off balls. McMinnies left at 72 with 24 to his credit, and Saunderson was bowled two runs later. Coates hit well, and after losing Matthews at 98 was mainly responsible for the 38 runs put on for the fifth wicket.

Matthews played a very good innings, after being missed before he got going. Some of his square cuts were very good. Indeed the only two bad strokes were the one by which he gave the chance mentioned, and the one by which he got out, being a "dolly" catch to mid on. His 40 included four 4's.

Coates hit clean and hard, and collected 33 before being bowled.

C. B. Matthews and Godfrey put on 24 by vigorous though lucky cricket, and with the score at 102 for six wickets the Warminster captain sportingly applied the closure.

Watts bowled very well for some time, but none of the other bowlers looked to be troublesome to the batsmen.

With eighty minutes to get the runs Trowbridge started out to see what they could do, and for some time looked like getting them. Popham and Nicholson opened the innings, and the former soon got to work, making the first twenty himself almost before his partner had sampled the bowling. At 39 Popham had the misfortune to be bowled by a ball which pitched in a heel mark about a couple of feet outside the off stump, which turned at right angles and removed the off ball whilst the batsman did not attempt to play it. Popham's 25 were made chiefly by beautifully timed hits on the leg side.

Jack Smart joined Nicholson, and the score was taken along at a great pace. Someone on the other side remarked that Nicholson could not hit, but he soon had reason to alter his opinion. After being missed in the long field, the Trowbridge crack played delightfully free cricket, hooking, cutting and driving in his best form, whilst Smart afforded him capital assistance.

At 96 Smart was bowled for a well played 18, and then a series of disasters befel the visitors. Mackie was brilliantly caught at "silly" cover point, Watts bowled, and then Nicholson, who had just completed his 50, was adjudged run out, although he looked to be past the wickets from the pavilion; and the batsman thought so too.

Nicholson had hit six 4's in his capital innings, and showed a fine sporting spirit in going for the runs as he did.

With five wickets down for 102, and insufficient time in which to hit off the runs, the Trowbridge skipper abandoned the attack and fell back upon his defences. After 10 runs had been added stumps were drawn five minutes before the time arranged the result being an even draw.

It was a sporting game throughout, and an interesting match from the spectators' point of view.

Langdon took two wickets for six runs, but the other bowlers were rather severely punished.

To-day (Saturday) Trowbridge go to Bradford, but will not be strongly represented. Nicholson will be playing for the county. Tom Smart is on the team list, whilst Popham, Pinniger, and one or two others will be away.

**TROWBRIDGE CRICKET CLUB.**

**A Review of the Season's Work.**  
**Batting and Bowling Averages.**

The season just ended, although furnishing some enjoyable cricket, has not been attended with the success which has been experienced in recent years. The weather, too, has been most unpropitious, and the really ideal cricket days have been exceedingly few.

Of the 22 fixtures arranged three were abandoned without a ball being bowled, whilst at least two others were completely spoilt by rain. The results read: Six wins, six losses, and seven drawn games. This compares unfavourably with last year's results when 11 wins were recorded against four losses and six draws; and in the three years previous to that eight games were won each season.

The abandoned games were with Bath Association, Swindon, and Melksham, and it was exceedingly unfortunate that the two first-named matches were home fixtures, the Bath match having been allotted to Tom Smart for a benefit, and the Swindon fixture set aside for the same object, and not a ball bowled in either.

In comparing this table with that of last year one finds that Trowbridge made fewer runs and allowed their opponents to make many more. Last year the Trowbridge average per wicket was 16.0 and their opponents' 12.7. This year it is 14.65 against 10.46, so that there is a decrease by the home side against an increase by opponents. But the decrease on the Trowbridge side is not nearly so considerable as the increase on the side of opponents—a circumstance which points to deterioration in bowling rather than a great falling off in batting. This is amply illustrated in the bowling analyses.

The batting, however, has not been satisfactory by any means. Last year Trowbridge made over 200 five times, and over 300 once, and opponents only made over 200 once. This year Trowbridge has not made more than 167, and their opponents have made over 200 five times, and over 300 once. There have been no real collapses, the lowest aggregate being 68, and the next for a completed innings being 93, so that there has been consistent mediocrity in batting without anything approaching brilliance.

In viewing individual performances, S. E. Nicholson deservedly stands at the head of the table of batting averages. He has not been so successful as in the two former seasons, making 101 runs less than last year in the same number of innings, but he has done yeoman service, and has no not out innings to help him. His average of over 53 for the county speaks for his ability, and it is in these matches when he is seen at his very best.

Tom Smart comes second, but his appearances have been all too few. His unfortunate accident deprived both Trowbridge and the county of his valuable services, and it is hoped that he will feel no effects of the trouble next year. His meritorious innings of 88, not out, at Swindon when most of the others had failed, will not soon be forgotten. His misfortune, too, in getting blank days for both the games chosen for his benefit put the finishing touches to an unfortunate season for him.

The sturdy captain, F. W. Stancomb, is third, and he has come to the rescue of his side on many occasions besides handling the team with his accustomed ability and geniality.

Marshall has also done well, being not out six times out of 12 innings. He saved the game against Warminster when hope was almost dead, and played two not out innings against Chippenham. Last year he was not out five times out of 12, so that it looks as if he deserves promotion in the order of going in.

Popham has fallen from first place to sixth, and has played but few times; but Mackie has improved on last year, but is still below his 1907 standard. Jack Smart has not fulfilled expectations, and Pinniger, Ford, and Duke have all figures much below their true worth.

In the bowling figures is reflected the chief cause of the failure to win matches. Last year Tom Smart and Mackie took 147 wickets between them for 8½ runs each, but this year both these bowlers are sadly short of this record. F. J. Watts, from the K Battery of Artillery, is deservedly at the top, and has bowled

consistently well ever since he came into the team in the middle of the season. His 26 wickets have cost him less than ten runs apiece, and he has not been favoured with the best of luck. He is a bowler with plenty of pluck and perseverance, who keeps at his work without deterioration of length or direction, and Trowbridge will be fortunate if he is able to assist next season. Jack Smart has also bowled well, and his "googlies" ought to assist him in developing into a really dangerous bowler when he can be a little more certain of getting a length to combine with the subtle break.

The club has been fortunate in again being served by so energetic and capable a secretary as Mr. Cattle, who has been ever on the alert for enhancing the welfare of the club. Many new members have been enrolled, and the new bowls section has been a great success, and bids fair to continue to be so.
