Gore Court "opened the ball" on Wednesday with a day match with the Royal Engineers (Chatham), this fixture having been revived after a lapse of many years. The Engineers had just concluded a match with the Band of Brothers, but five of the men who had played well against the B.B. were in the team that visited Sittingbourne, so that the visitors were not so weak as might be imagined. The Engineers went in first, and were all put out for the poor score of 84. This failure on a batsman's wicket was inexplicable. Still, the Gore Court men bowled and fielded well. Roberts took four wickets for only five runs, S. W. Burley had three for 33, and H. R. Jordan three for 38. Colonel Biggs, the veteran of the visiting team, was top-scorer with 27. When Gore Court went in runs came freely. A splendid batting performance was put up by R. F. de Winton and R. P. Shaw. These two cricketers, with 97 and 95 respectively, were unlucky in not reaching the century. While they were in these batsmen had complete mastery of the attack, and they played beautiful cricket. Both were loudly applauded on their retirement. J. Whibley played very nicely for 33, and L. S. Watson scored 22. When the fourth wicket fell at 286, the remaining batsmen went in for hitting, but then the attack assumed the upper hand, and in the end the big total of 310 was reached. This is Gore Court's highest aggregate for some years. There was just a chance of getting the Engineers out again, and this was accomplished on the stroke of time, the Sappers making 132, which left Gore Court victorious by an innings and 94 runs. In the second innings of the Engineers L. Boves bowled successfully, taking five wickets for 15 runs, while Burley had three for 19.

The social attractions included a fresco concert on Monday and Wednesday evenings, when the ground was illuminated. On Monday "The Strollers" quartette and concert party gave an excellent programme, and "The Rustics' Costume Comedy Party" provided the entertainment on Wednesday evening. On this occasion the weather conditions were ideal, there was a large attendance, and the concert was much enjoyed.

The blank day on Thursday was filled in by Mr. Gillespie, of the United Services (Sheerness), bringing over a team which included the Rev. L. Hammond and F. M. Atkins, of Little Hermitage. A full day's cricket saw Gore Court again victorious, for after getting rid of the visitors for 102—a smart piece of work—Gore Court replied with 253. The chief feature of the innings was a fine score of 86 by L. S. Watson.

It was marred by two chances, but, all the same, it was unlucky that, for the second time within a few days, Watson should be so near the "century," and yet miss it. Perhaps the Milton batsman will oblige against Belmont to-day. Mr. Gillespie's team went in again, and at the close of play had lost five wickets for 86. In the first innings of the visitors H. R. Jordan took five wickets for 31, S. W. Burley three for 35, and Roberts three for 16.

Yesterday (Friday) the fixture was Gore Court v. East Kent Yeomanry; and the week will conclude to-day (Saturday) with the return match with Belmont. Lord Harris, who is in such good form just now, will be playing for Belmont. This should be a good wind-up to a successful festival.

J. R. Tylden, the Milsted cricketer, whilst playing the other day, had the misfortune to fall and displace a cartilage of the knee, which will keep him out of the cricket field for some time. This is very unfortunate, for it prevented the old Rugby and Oxford cricketer from playing for the M.C.C., of which club he has become a member.

Two famous Kent amateurs have been getting themselves fit by the time they step into the county eleven. D. W. Carr, playing for Stanmore Park against Oxford University Authentics, secured five wickets for a very few runs; and in another match he dismissed six of the Evelyons for the Oxford U.A. J. R. Mason on Saturday scored another century for Blackheath; making 128 against Streatham.

A. P. Day, of the Kent XI, is playing for the Gentlemen against the Players, in the match that is in progress at the Oval. K. L. Hutchings was unable to play.

Kent's two victories over Somerset and Gloucester once more place them at the head of the championship table, but whether they will finish up in that position is a very open question. Warwickshire are running them very close. The Midlands' two remaining fixtures are with Leicestershire and Northants, and at the time of writing they have much the better of the game with Leicestershire, which commenced on Saturday. Providing they win their two remaining fixtures, Warwickshire will finish up with a percentage of 74. Kent's percentage at present is 74.78; with three matches to play, viz., Surrey, Yorkshire and Essex, all formidable teams, and providing they win all three they conclude with a percentage of 77. In the event of losing one; however, they drop to 73.84. From the above figures it will be seen that Warwickshire have a good chance of becoming champions for the first time.

The appeal opened by the Field newspaper for the sum of £5,000 to help carry on the work of the training ship Mercury, and thereby enable Mr. C. B. Fry to visit Australia as captain of the M.C.C. team, has met with a very cool response by the cricket loving public of England. Last week the public subscribed £45 14s., and this included £25 from Mr. C. E. Green. With the sum of twenty guineas added by the proprietors of the Field, a total of £66 14s. only was reached. The selection of Mr. P. F. Warner as captain is said to be a very popular one with the players who have accepted the invitations to visit Australia.

THE MOTE v. OXFORD HARLEQUINS.

The Mote brought their season to a close on Saturday, when the two-day match with the Oxford Harlequins terminated in a draw.
