SURREY WON BY 4 WICKETS

Club Cricket.

One of the finest feats accomplished this season thus far has come from the bat of young D. J. Knight of Malvern. Playing against H. K. Foster's XI., the School amassed 548, Knight contributing 211 in brilliant style. Readers will remember his successful appearance at the Oval last summer, when it was felt that, barring accidents, he would walk into the Surrey XI. a couple of seasons or so hence. In the two-day match referred to 1198 runs were scored for twenty-four wickets—in all probability a school record, at least as far as England is concerned.

On June 3rd for Streatham v. Beckenham, Norman Miller added another century to his long list of successes. His 114 was a lovely innings, the batsman showing confidence and brilliance in his execution. He drove, cut, and glanced with equal precision and skill.
