Durham's Moderate Score on a Soft Wicket.

On the Rovers' ground of Grimsby to-day Lincolnshire met Durham in the Minor Counties' Championship. Durham won the toss and commenced batting. A good breeze blew across the ground and the pitch, although drying, was still very soft after the heavy rain. W. Curry to left handers and Hendren started batting against the bowling of Riley and Day. With only 8 runs up Day brought off a smart catch in the slips in dismissing Hendren. Harrison, who followed, hit well, putting Day over the ropes for 6. Curry had not scored when 36 appeared on the board, and Broughton relieved Day, after 35 minutes. When Harrison had made 18 he skied the ball dangerously near extra cover, but Thompson could not get at the ball. E. Hallam relieved Broughton, so that the latter could change places with Riley. In his first over after changing ends Broughton got Harrison off after a vigorous innings. Curry got his first two after 40 minutes, having dismissed the new man, but Broughton for 4, and with 45 on the board Curry was caught in the slips, having made 2 in 50 minutes. T. Kinch, who followed, was bowled first ball by Broughton, and four wickets were down for 45. E. B. Proud, the old international footballer, brought up 50 after just over an hour's play. Adamson was shaping confidently. Riley was put on vice Hallam.

Broughton ploughed the wicket up badly when bowling, and much squid was in evidence. The cricket was very slow at this time, but after 23 runs had been added for the wicket Millington caught Adamson finely on the boundary from a straight drive. After an hour and a half's cricket 70 runs were up. The sixth wicket fell at 75, and F. W. B. Johnson, whose first appearance it was in county cricket, made 4 and was then smartly stumped by Johnson with the score at 77 for 7. R. Healey put a ball firmly up to mid-off with the score at 80. T. Coulson was also guilty of a similar faux stroke to mid-on with the score at 86. Morris cut Riley beautifully for 4, bringing up 50. Smith brought 100 up after seeing Broughton a difficult caught and bowled chance after just under two hours.

After lunch only one run was added to the score. Hallam bowling Smith off his legs in his first over. There was a shower during lunch time, but then the weather cleared.

W. E. Thompson and Day commenced batting for Lincolnshire at 2.30 against the bowling of Morris and Hendren, the latter being a brother of the Middlesex cricketer.

Day cut him beautifully for 2. Thompson survived an appeal for 15, and Day put Hendren to leg for ten, and brought 10 up. With the score at 22 Day was caught in the slips.

Thompson hit Hendren to leg twice for 3, and brought 20 up. Broughton cut an appeal out at 23. Turner was bowled at the same total.

W. A. Trevesister got Morris through the slips for 4, but was dismissed with a ball to left by Smith at mid-off, and four wickets were down in half an hour for 28 runs. W. A. Trevesister hit Hendren to leg for 4, but succumbed to an appeal for 15, by Hendren. Riley brought 50 up with a four to the on off Hendren after 50 minutes' play. Just after he was bowled middle stump by Hendren, and six wickets were down for 52.

Hallam twice got Hendren to the boundary for 4, and brought 80 up, and in the following over off the same bowler again drove him to the boundary.

CRICKET IN SCOTLAND.

Competition cricket has never flourished in Scotland, though the Public Schools Championship is a notable exception. One of the finest matches ever seen in this competition was decided at Musselburgh on Friday and Saturday, when Loretto gained a brilliant victory over Fettes by six wickets. Fettes' strong batting was expected to carry them through, despite their lack of bowling talent, but Loretto triumphed, thanks almost wholly to the efforts of two members of the eleven, W. S. Smeeth in the field and G. L. Hunting at the wicket. Smeeth, who secured eleven wickets for 135, is a bowler of the Rhodes type, and, as he is only a youngster, ought to improve a lot. Hunting, with innings of 144 and 87, both not-out, showed magnificent batting and leathered the weak Fettes bowling all over the field. He received a tremendous ovation at the close. If he goes up to Oxford or Cambridge he ought to secure his blue as few finer schoolboy batsmen have ever been produced in Scotland.

Why does not the Grange play a match against a picked side from the Public Schools? The game would be most interesting and popular, and the senior club would have to put in all they know to win.

Stirling County accomplished a smart piece of business when they took advantage of the dispute between Perthshire and Forfarshire to fix up the big County for Stirling on the occasion of the Perth mid-summer holiday. Special trains were run to convey the Perth holiday crowd, and in consequence the Stirling ground held more spectators than it has done for many a day. In the field, notwithstanding that they had a specially strengthened side, they made a sorry show, and were dismissed on a splendid wicket for the paltry total of 59. Bessy, the Perth professional, who has played a game for Leicester this season, secured 8 wickets for 22. Perthshire proved that runs could easily be made by rattling up a score of 265. What a pity they do not meet Forfarshire! Is there time yet?

The Grange suffered a heavy defeat at the hands of Carlton, one of the strongest sides in the country. Seldom—at least, during modern times—have they been dismissed for such a small score as 51, but Carlton were only getting a little of their own back and Grange have still the best of the reckoning over recent years. G. W. Jupp, a Somerset man, was the chief factor in their collapse, as he took six wickets in ten overs for 18 runs.

The Watsonians, better known in the football world, are making cricket history this season. Up to the present they are undefeated, though last week they experienced two narrow escapes. The side includes A. W. Angus and J. Pearson, the international three-quarters. Like the Watsonians, Glasgow Academicals, another famous football combination, are doing rather well since they returned to first-class club cricket. They were a pretty good side about twenty years ago.

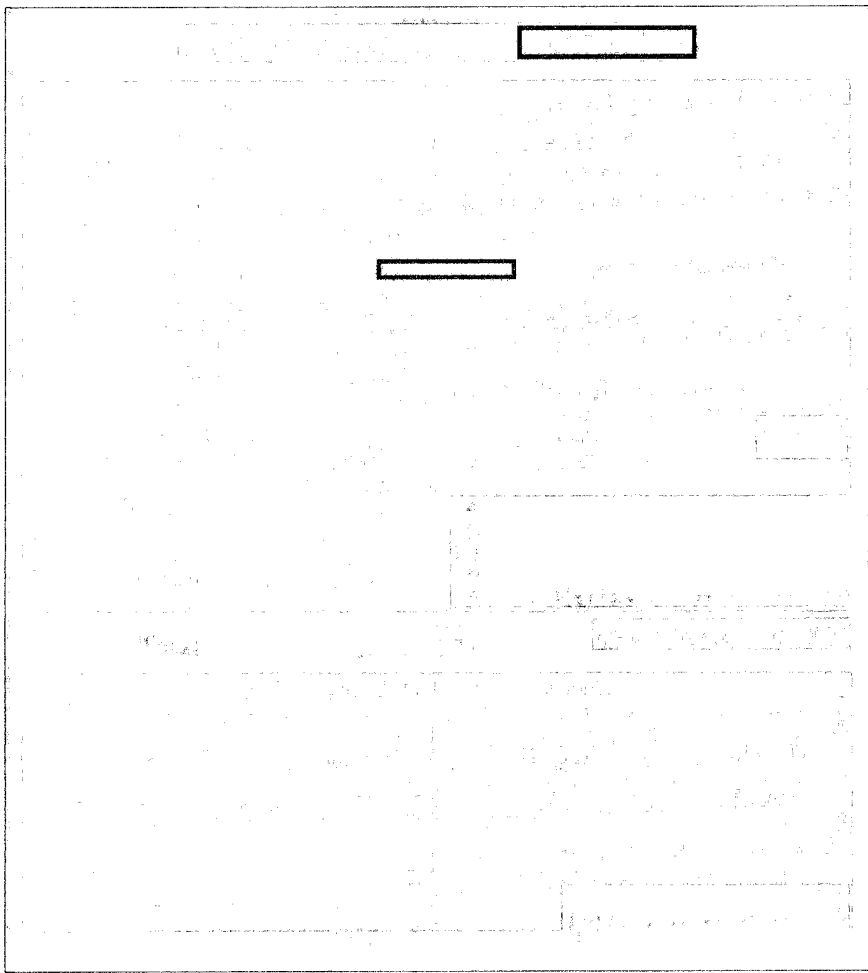
