HERTFORDSHIRE MEET LINCOLNSHIRE

ON THE HITCHIN GROUND.

LOW SCORING ON A FAST WICKET. Unusually rapid progress was made with the return encounter between Hertfordshire and Laincolnshire, begun on the ground of the Hitchim Cricket Club on Thursday. The wicket was very fast, and as true as it could be made, only one ball rising more than shoulder high all day; yet twenty-three wickets fell for an aggregate of 343 runs—an average of rather less than 15 a wicket. The cricket was, in consequence, somewhar disappointing to spectators who had looked to see rapid scoring and big hitting. It was, however, at no time uninteresting.
