**COUNTY CRICKET.**

**CARMARTHENSHIRE HOPELESSLY BEATEN.**

**NORMAN RICHES IN A SCORING MOOD.**

The return match between Carmarthenshire and Glamorganshire, which was commenced at Llanelly on Monday, revealed once again the impotency of the home team. Unfortunately they are placed at a great disadvantage in the minor counties competition owing to the fact that they cannot command the services of a single professional bowler, whereas their opponents are able to rely upon two or three, which usually means that the battle is half won for them. The match was favoured with ideal weather, and thanks to the efforts of Lohmann and Simpson, the wicket was in excellent condition—in fact, it has rarely, if ever, been better. Despite this fact Carmarthenshire, who took first knock, could only score 68 runs in their initial innings. Two only of the homesters got into double figures, viz. Capt. Hughes-Morgan and Ned Roberts, the former scoring 26 and the latter 11. Hacker and Creber had matters practically their own way. The former, who bowled at a uniform pace and an excellent length throughout, captured seven wickets for 55 runs, while Creber took three wickets for 30 runs.

From a spectator's point of view the Glamorganshire innings was far more attractive. Their opponents had been disposed of in an hour's time, so that they were able to commence responding at one o'clock. N. V. Riches and Preece were the first batsmen, and it soon became evident that the Carmarthenshire score would be exceeded in very little time. Before being dismissed Preece, who some seasons ago played for Llanelly scored 25 runs, and his place was filled by Bancroft. Runs were coming at a brisk pace, and the Swanseaite soon knocked up 28 runs, after which he was clean bowled by J. Bevan. H. Thomas then partnered the Glamorganshire skipper, and for a while the new comer contented himself with allowing his partner to score. Riches took full advantage of his opportunities, and Thomas subsequently seconded his efforts well. When his score stood at 150 Riches was well caught by D. H. Davies off J. Davies. His total included no less than 27 fours, and he well merited all the applause he got, for he had played excellent cricket throughout the two and three-quarter hours he was at the wicket. Thomas, before receiving his quietus from G. Bowen, had scored 62 runs, which included four 4's. Maxwell and E. E. Hill, who were the only two other Glamorganshire players to get to the wicket, also gave their opponents some leather hunting. Maxwell, who carried his bat out, scored 53 runs which included one six and seven four's. When the Glamorganshire total reached 372 runs for six wickets, their innings was declared closed. No fewer than seven bowlers were tried by Carmarthenshire, and all were unceremoniously hit about.

Carmarthenshire, who went in a second time, showed up to better advantage, thanks chiefly to the stand made by Ike Evans and B. Percy Rees, who, after Capt. Hughes-Morgan had been bowled first ball by Hacker, scored freely, and thus inspired those who followed with more confidence. Ike Evans, who is perhaps the most stylish batsman in Carmarthenshire, scored 22 runs before being caught out by Hill off Hacker, who was badly knocked about by him and Percy Rees in this innings. Rees scored 40 runs in all, which included eight boundaries for four's. Creber in this innings, was less expensive than in the first venture. In his first ten overs he had no less than six "maidens." When the sixth wicket for 118 runs fell, time for drawing stumps arrived, but it was arranged to play the game out that night if possible, in order to avoid visiting Stradey again on Tuesday. Contrary to expectations however J. Davies who was the next man in commenced punishing the bowlers rather unmercifully. He hit Creber to the boundary for sixes twice in succession, and also hit two four's. This rather upset Glamorganshire's calculations, and when the Carmarthenshire total stood at 144 for seven wickets, an adjournment was made.

Ten minutes' play on Tuesday sufficed to dispose of the remaining wickets. With the second ball sent down by Creber Edgar Evans found his wickets disturbed, and D. H. Davies and Bowen, who followed, fared very little better. Carmarthenshire were all out for 157, Glamorganshire thus winning by an innings and 147 runs. Scores:—

**FINE INNINGS BY N. V. RICHES.**

Carmarthenshire, who were crushingly beaten by Glamorganshire a week ago, again sustained a heavy defeat in the return match, which was commenced on Monday at Llanelly. The homesters, who opened their innings in brilliant weather, made a very feeble stand, only two of their number getting into double figures. Creber and Hacker, who shared the bowling for Glamorganshire, were able to capture wickets in the first innings at their own sweet will almost. Carmarthenshire were all disposed of in the first innings for 68 runs, of which 26 were contributed by Captain D. Hughes-Morgan. Hacker took seven wickets for 55 runs, while Creber captured 3 for 30.

Glamorganshire had no difficulty in exceeding their opponents' first innings total before the second wicket fell. The outstanding feature of the game was the batting of N. V. Riches, who in two and three-quarter hours contributed 150 runs, which included 27 boundary hits. Six of the Glamorganshire batsmen faced the bowling of seven Carmarthenshire men, and they all got well into double figures. Next to the Glamorganshire skipper, H. Thomas with 62 runs to his credit was the highest scorer, Maxwell, who carried out his bat when his score stood at 53, being the third highest scorer. When Glamorganshire's score stood at 372 for four wickets they declared, and Carmarthen then opened their second innings. They now fared somewhat better. Special mention should be made of the batting of Percy Rees, who scored 40 runs, which included eight boundaries. When the time for making an adjournment arrived there were six wickets down for 118 runs, and after a short consultation it was decided if possible to play the game out, in order to avoid playing on Tuesday. J. Davies, who went in seventh wicket down, however, made some great hits, making two sixes in succession off Creber, and hitting two fours. Owing to the unexpected turn of events the idea of playing the game out on Monday night was abandoned, and when an adjournment was made Carmarthenshire's score for their second innings stood at 144 for seven wickets.

Only a few minutes' play on Tuesday was necessary to finish off the match, Carmarthen being disposed of in their second innings for 157. Glamorgan thus won by an innings and 147 runs. Creber took five wickets for 68 runs, and Hacker three for 65. Complete scores:—
