**WILTSHIRE CRICKET.**

**WILT COUNTY CRICKET.**

Wiltshire played Kent 2nd XI, at Town Mall on Wednesday evening. The match, when the home team won easily. Kent made 163 and 264, and Wilt 139 and 164. The Wiltshire double-figure scores were—C. C. H. Davenport 36, F. H. Humphry 24, E. J. Kendle 18, G. E. H. Avenue 17, Newman 15, Sellick 14, H. Taunton 13 and 12, F. W. Stacombe 10.

**Return Match at Chippenham.**

This match commenced at Hardenhuish Park on Monday, and the weather being most delightful, there was a good attendance, among the spectators being Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Ashley D. Keble, the Hon. Lady Keble, Captain Alfrey, the Hon. Mrs. Alfrey, Mr. John T. Gidney, Mrs. Mackay, Captain Gwiltin, and Mr. W. A. Tockney.

The Kent captain won the toss, and sent in Captain Barrell and Collins to face the bowling of Fairbrother and Mitchell. At 31 the latter was displaced by Mitchell, and with the score at 28, Collins was next taken in the end by Murray Shirreff. K. Barlow, who came next, was missed at the wicket when he had made 5. Cricket for a while was uneventful, but afterwards it became more brisk, and the first 50 was the result of forty minutes' play. Laverton gave way to H. Taunton, who played stoutly, but was eventually dismissed with a splendid catch by Fairbrother, who fell backwards in taking the ball. Captain Barrell, who was second out at 71, played capitally. Troughton joined Barrell, and Fairbrother took the place of Mitchell at 80. Newman unsuccessfully appealed against Barrell for obstructing the wicket. When the game had been in progress thirty minutes, the century appeared on the board. When Troughton had made 18 he was neatly caught at mid-off. At 103 there was another chance in the bowling of Sellick, going on for Newman. Troughton again had a narrow escape of being caught. A few minutes before luncheon Miller relieved Sellick, but the interval came without a separation and the score at 125, Barrell being 38, and his partner, Troughton, 52. On resuming play, Barrell had again the good fortune to escape being caught. Barrell, when he had made 55, ought to have been taken in the slip. With the score at 135, Troughton sent the ball in the direction of Shirreff, who made no mistake. Taft, who followed, was smartly taken behind the wicket by Fraser. Barrell soon after was defeated by Newman, the fifth wicket falling for 174. When Morfee joined Hoole, runs were run on a lively pace. Frequent changes took place in the bowling, but it was not until the score had reached 206 that Morfee, whose previous ball was dropped, was caught by Shirreff. The partnership produced 122 runs in seventy minutes. Morfee's score of 122 included six sixes and sixteen 4's. Hoole continued to bat splendidly, and when he was caught in the field by Humphrys the score stood at 302. His 50 was obtained in an hour and a half. Mitchell did not trouble the score, and at twenty minutes to five, with Roberts and Preston together, the innings was declared closed. Kent's total of 431 for the loss of eight wickets was completed in exactly four hours.

Wilt began batting at five o'clock, and made a disappointing display against skilful bowling. The innings was opened by C. E. Andry and Sellick, and at 34 the latter was taken behind the wicket. Andry was in his happiest vein, and during the fifteen minutes the partnership lasted, he scored 30 runs. Newman, who came next, with the score at 61 gave an easy catch to Hoole at square leg. With three runs added Andry was bowled, his 42 being the result of attractive batting. Laverton, who has always been unfortunate on the Chippenham ground, had a repetition of previous experiences by failing to score. Captain Humphrys had a short stay, and five wickets were down for 73, when the young local cricketer of great promise, E. Pinfield, joined Shirreff, his reception at the wicket being encouraging. He opened with a leg hit to the boundary, but he soon lost his partner, who was bowled by Preston. A. M. Miller followed, and both he and Pinfield were taken in a similar manner in the slip by Troughton or Hickmott. The remaining two wickets produced only two runs, and the innings, which only lasted an hour and twenty-five minutes, closed for 161.

**TUESDAY'S PLAY.**

The home county, 330 behind, entered upon its second innings at five minutes past eleven on Tuesday morning. The order of going in was the same as on the first day. The feature of the play both days was the remarkably fine bowling of Preston; on Monday he was credited with six wickets, but on Tuesday he took the whole of the first nine wickets, and was robbed of the honour of taking the whole by Fairbrother returning a ball to Hickmott. The extraordinary break which his balls had from the off surprised the batsmen, and cricketers who are good sportsmen heartily applauded Preston on his performance.

C. E. Andry and Sellick opened the innings, and the former sent a ball off Morfee over the heads of slips to the boundary. With three runs added to his score, he was missed at mid-off. Sellick was equally fortunate, being dropped by backward point when he had made 6. Andry had his off stump dislodged, the first wicket falling for 29. Newman partnered Sellick, and at 32 Taft relieved Morfee, the fast bowler. When he had reached the unlucky figure, 15, Sellick was defeated. Captain Humphrys was the next comer, and the 50 was telegraphed, the runs being obtained in as many minutes. Only a single run was added when Preston stepped off Humphrys' balls. Laverton filled the vacancy, and repeated his performance of last year on the same ground by making a duck each day. He is a skilful batsman with an attractive style, and every year has a good record; but, call it "false," "had luck," or what you like, his visits to the Hardenhuish Park have not been a success. Murray Shirreff joined Newman, and the pair added 15 runs, when the latter was clean bowled. R. Pinfield's local admirers hoped he would distinguish himself, but their hopes were not realized. For the first ball he received, the wicket-keeper made an unsuccessful appeal, but with the next ball Preston claimed him as the fifth of his victims. The popular captain, by splendid hitting, assisted in adding 36 to the score in fifteen minutes, his contribution being 23. Mitchell came in, but with the second ball he was dismissed without scoring, eight wickets down for 108. Only three runs were added when Murray Shirreff was caught by Taft at mid-off. Fraser, the last man, who kept wicket so admirably for Wiltshire on the first day, joined Fairbrother, and they made a capital stand. Fraser, after the surprise of Troughton, who displaced Hickmott, sending down three wickets in his first over, got into a merry mood, which similarly affected his partner, and in twenty minutes they knocked up 54 runs. Hickmott, accepting a return from Fairbrother, brought the innings to a close at one o'clock. Score—
