WILTSHIRE CRICKET.
(Continued from Page 8.)

This second-class championship match was commenced at Frowley yesterday, on a good batemen's wicket. Wiltshire made one or two changes from the team that was severely beaten at Chippenham, and the visitors brought a very strong team. The play before lunch was remarkable and absolutely unaccountable, no less than 13 wickets going down for 50 runs. This, too, on a plumb batting wicket, which was true and fast. In the absence of A. M. Miller, the home side was led by C. S. Awdry, who, winning the toss, naturally took first knock. The first over produced seven runs from Phillips, but in the next over Awdry was bowled in playing late. One later Newman had his wickets disturbed, and with the score at 9 Tannton had to retire. With only two added, Shirreff was all at sea to a ball from Williams, and was bowled—four for 11. Sellick, who had scored most of these, was then partnered by Pinfield, and the best partnership of the innings followed, although it only produced 24. Pinfield got several balls away in nice style and he was unlucky enough to be bowled from a ball that scraped his pad, after making 12. Overton stayed a few minutes, and then Sellick was given out, caught wide on the leg side behind the wicket—a decision he did not appreciate. His 18 were very acceptable. The last few men failed altogether, and with Luce not having arrived, the innings finished with the dismissal of the batsman for 47 runs only. The two Smarts—Tom and Jack—and F. W. Stancomb were on the ground, and it is difficult to understand why one of them was not included in Luce's absence.

When Monmouth went in, Awdry kept wicket. A sensational start was made, Newman bowling Shirreff out with the first ball he gave him with only one run on the board. Farebrother got Maltby lbw, and bowled two others in quick succession, four wickets being down for only 10 runs. Farebrother at this point had three wickets for two runs. Then Diver hit well, making several boundaries, and with Hadden put on 48 runs, taking the score beyond the Wiltshire total. Hadden passed the half century, and Monmouth secured a lead of 63 runs. When Wiltshire went in again Awdry batted well, contributing a splendid 42. The next highest scorer was Pinfield, who again showed promising form, and ran up 31, which included no less than seven fours. Several of the others made useful contributions, and the total of 181 was reached, leaving Monmouth 119 to win. They entered upon the task just after 3.30, and Silverlock and Maltby contributed 47 for the first partnership. When play ceased for the day, the visitors required 44 to win, with 9 wickets in hand.
