Cambs. v. Herts.

CAMBS. WIN POINTS ON FIRST INNINGS.

GOOD ALL-ROUND BATTING.

Last year Cambs. went through the season without gaining a point in the Championship, but they have already done better this year, taking three points from Hertfordshire on Saturday. This performance is all the more creditable, as Herts. are a very fine batting side and have twice beaten Cambs. and taken points from North on the first innings. From the time Cambs. won the toss they always had a certain hold on the game, which increased as time went on, but it is highly probable that but for the splendid manner in which Tebbutt persevered with his bowling and worked his changes Cambs. would not have led on the first innings.

Cambs. played L. J. Reid, M. Gray and O. W. Boccock for C. Figg, B. W. Pigg and H. Todd. Herts. were considered to be practically at full strength. The outstanding performance of the match—played at St. Albans—was the grand display of the old-Christ's man, L. J. Reid. Last year he had a most unfortunate season, being particularly low in the averages, but he was in quite his best form when he scored 132 without giving a chance. It was an even better innings than his two hundred odd against the same county at Fenner's two seasons ago, for when he went in he had to play very careful cricket, the County having the best four of their best bowlers for 94. O. W. Boccock backed Reid up very finely for a start, and played a prominent part in turning the fortunes of the visitors.

At their second venture Cambridgeshire were given an excellent start by Collier and Whybro, and after that things always went well. They might have stood a chance of winning had they declared earlier, but remembering the batting strength of Herts., Tebbutt was wise to make sure of a failure last season, but he found his true form on Saturday, when he gave a fine display, scoring 62. Now that he has got off the mark more good work may be expected of him. Tebbutt, Hunt, and Boccock all played finely, whilst the others got out in forcing the game. Of the home team, C. H. Titchmarsh was the most successful, scoring 89 and 74.

FIRST DAY'S PLAY.

Mr. Tebbutt sent in Collier and Whybro to open the innings. Coleman started the attack from the pavilion end, Collier getting his first ball to leg for four, whilst Whybro snatched him for four. Burton took the other end, and it was during the over that a little misunderstanding occurred over a run. Collier had not properly recovered when he received a good one from Burton. He played forward and was beaten, leaving with the score at 11. With Ling in both batsmen played very steadily. However, ten runs had only been added when the second wicket fell. Whybro getting out in the same manner as Collier, only against the other bowler. Tebbutt turned the first ball he received to leg, and ran four. Shortly afterwards, in one over from Burton, each batsman took a four. Things now looked rather better as the batsmen were apparently getting set, but with 37 up Ling was caught by the wicket-keeper standing back to Coleman. Reid joined Tebbutt, who scored two fours behind the wicket of Coleman in one over. Changing ends, he got Burton away to the leg boundary and sent up the half-century after 45 minutes' play. Reid having scored a two, he turned Coleman to leg for four. Twenty-seven had been added, when Tebbutt, who had played a fine innings, and looked well away for a good score, was bowled by a beauty from Coleman. Hunt came in, and snickered Burton to the cinder track, whilst a few overs later he drove Burton to the off boundary and ran four from a similar stroke. The Albert captain snickered Coleman to the boundary, and the score was gradually mounting towards the century. At 38 Sheffield relieved Burton, and in his second over Hunt got underneath one of his deliveries and was caught by cover-point. Boccock, who came in, got Coleman through the slips to the boundary, whilst in the next over from that end he got three to leg and sent up the hundred in an hour and 35 minutes, half of the wickets having been lost to obtain this. At 100 Burton made Coleman's place, but Reid hit him to leg for four, whilst from the other end Boccock lifted Sheffield to the leg boundary. Lunch was taken with the score at 124 for 5.

Resuming, Sheffield continued to bowl from the country end, but Coleman returned to the attack at the other end. Hunt came at a brisker pace than before. Reid hitting Sheffield to the leg boundary, and Boccock scoring a two and a three in one over from Coleman, but they soon settled down and played the same careful cricket as in the morning. Boccock then played Coleman in a rather risky manner in front of second slip, but he made amends by driving the next delivery beautifully to the off. At 154 Marsh took the ball from Sheffield, but Reid scored a four and three in one over, and Reid reached his 50 after an hour and 35 minutes' play, but at 170 Burton returned to the pavilion end and broke up the partnership, which had added 79 runs. Boccock played good, sound cricket, without giving an actual chance. With Gray in Sheffield was immediately put out to bowl again. Reid next cut Burton for four, and then drove him to the off and snickered him, each time for four. Reid was now hitting cut, and Gray, who was playing a good game, followed suit, and hit Coleman, who had just resumed, for a four and a two. Reid, who sent up the 100 before lunch, now had the satisfaction of causing the 200 to be hoisted in under three hours. Gray contributed eight, but was then stumped by the old Clars man of Burton. Waits played a rather bad stroke through the legs when only one, and was dropped in the country shortly afterwards, the sun being against the fielder. Bowling changes were now frequent. Reid reached his hundred after batting just over

two and a half hours. After that he obviously tired, the sun being particularly hot, but continued to play his customary sound cricket. The wicket having added 70, Waits left, his share being 34. Rose who started with a five for an overthrow, had the distinction of hoisting the 300. Reid was then bowled for a magnificent 132, which had occupied him three hours and 20 minutes, and he had assisted to carry the score from 91 to 321. Splendid as have been his services to the County, they were quite eclipsed by yesterday's performance. He went in when things were certainly not looking very rosy, and scored his runs by really first-class cricket, and without giving anything approaching a chance. He hit fourteen, and seven 3's. Afterwards Sheffield took two wickets in one over, and the innings closed just before half-past four for 322.

Anderson and Bonsey opened the Herts. innings against the bowling of Coulson and Rose. With 21 up Anderson was bowled by Rose. Then despite numerous bowling changes, the score gradually increased, until the hundred went up inside the hour, and with only one wicket down. Bonsey, who had had some luck early on, having just previously reached his 50. Both batsmen were hitting out, and were punishing all the bowlers. When 32 Titchmarsh survived a very confident appeal for leg before. At length Bonsey was beaten in attempting to drive Coulson. While he enjoyed some luck early on, he gave a fine display of fine cricket, scoring his runs in 70 minutes, and hitting thirteen 4's and four 3's. Twenty-seven runs later Dumbleton was bowled for six, Titchmarsh having in the meantime reached his half-century. Cuthbertson failed to score, as did W. H. Marsh. Rose bowling these two with the two last balls of the over. Rose also bowled out leg before, and when stumps were drawn Herts. had lost six wickets for 177 runs.

SECOND DAY.

Herts. resumed their first innings at 11.5 on Saturday with Titchmarsh (63) and Sanders (0), Coulson and Rose sharing the attack. The sun was even hotter than on the previous day, but fortunately there was again a nice breeze. Titchmarsh took matters quietly, but Sanders at once drove with some force, and quickly obtained a boundary from each bowler. He had a narrow shave from being stumped when, and when 24 he skied one round to leg, and was promptly captured by Whybro. In the next over from the same end Coulson got in one of his very best deliveries, which just caught the top of the stumps, and disposed of Titchmarsh, who had been batting for just over two hours. He enjoyed some luck overnight, but played very well. Coleman early in the country, and Whybro made a fine start to capture him, but was not quite successful. Tebbutt went on, and clean bowled Golding, and with Coulson being given Sheffield the innings closed for 256, giving Cambs. a lead of 67. Coulson came out with the first analysis of five for 76, bowling much better in the morning than overnight. Rose took four for 73, the other wicket being secured by Tebbutt.

Whybro and Collier again opened the Cambs. innings, Sheffield and Burton sharing the attack. Collier did most of the scoring, but it was not long before he had a couple of narrow shaves. Whybro drives Burton, and ran four. At 26 Coleman replaced Sheffield at the pavilion end, whilst at 27 Marsh went on for Burton, and Collier showed his appreciation by scoring a four and two 2's in his first over; he also snickered Coleman for four, and sent up the 50 after 38 minutes' play. The Camden crack then got Coleman beautifully to leg, and ran five. The first wicket had produced 52 when Whybro was again caught by Dumbleton at cover-point, having played a very fine innings. Burton went on for Coleman, this time bowling with the wind. In his second over Collier drove him to the on and ran five, whilst Ling took a four next stroke. A double change of bowling was tried, but it did not prevent Collier from reaching his 50, after being at the wicket just an hour. Lunch was taken with the score at 98 for one. On the resumption Ling was caught at point, without having added anything to his score. Tebbutt came in, and sent up the 100, and then ran five from a leg stroke. With 123 telegraphed Collier was beaten by a good length ball from Burton. He played excellent cricket for an hour and a half, his 82 including two 5's and two 4's; he gave no direct chance, although he played one or two risky strokes. Reid was bowled by Burton's first ball, but Hunt snickered the "hat-trick" by taking a four from the next delivery. He and Tebbutt were evidently out for plunder, for they were running for everything, and keeping the scorers busy. They secured 13 in one over from Sheffield. In the following over from the same end Marsh went on himself, but runs were added in twenty minutes. Coleman had some trouble with his right foot, and at this period of the game he retired. Ling fielding for him, Bonsey went on to bowl at the pavilion end, Tebbutt, in attempting to cut his third delivery, got underneath it, and was caught by the wicket-keeper for 47. The wicket added 59. With Boccock in runs continued to come at a rapid pace. Hunt, however, was getting on of the bowling, and he reached 50 in three-quarters of an hour. He was then well caught at cover-point, having played the right game, and given a much more finished display than on the previous day. Rose had five deliveries, from which he scored two 4's, a two and a four, and was out next stroke, well caught from a skier by Ling, fielding as usual. Waits and Boccock then took up the running. The former was caught in the country at 262 for a dozen, and with Boccock out for a vigorous 37, at four o'clock Tebbutt declared the innings closed, leaving the home county with 349 to get to win in two hours and ten minutes.

It was necessary for Herts. to get the runs, and it was pretty obvious that Cambs. would not have to waste time if they were to get the wickets. They started in a very sensational manner, Coulson bowling Bonsey with his third ball, but Dumbleton and Titchmarsh then made a stand, and at 31 Tebbutt went on for Rose. With 50 up Tebbutt almost caught and bowled Titchmarsh. Hunt went on at the other end. Scoring was very slow, and Rose was given another trial, vice the captain.

The batsmen were getting set despite many changes, an hour's play, however, only yielding 78 runs. The century went up after an hour and a quarter's play. Two runs later the partnership was broken up by Tebbutt catching Dumbleton off his own bowling for 42. With Titchmarsh out the game came to a conclusion early in order to enable the visitors time to catch their train, the match thus being left drawn. Full score and bowling analysis:—

Although they were unable to take the maximum amount of points from Herts., Cambs. did remarkably well to secure the three points for a win on the first innings. Herts., who, it will be remembered, tried conclusions in the Southern Division last year, are probably the strongest batting side in the Eastern Division, and even if Cambs. had been in a position to be able to declare at lunch, which of course, they were not, it is doubtful if they would have been able to get that Herts. side out by 6.30, or at any rate they would not have had any time to spare. Therefore, it may be said that the result was eminently satisfactory. It is a long while since I saw the County team so really enthusiastic, and even when they realised that they had no chance of winning the fielding and bowling continued to be really first class. In fact, the match reminded me of that rare life in the old county yet. That display of real honest enthusiasm for which we have waited so long, at last came.

Of course, there is no getting away from the fact that the winning of the toss was the keynote of the situation, yet apart from that, there was more life in the side than one has experienced for a long time. That fine cricketer, L. J. Reid, was chiefly responsible for the big Cambs. score in the first innings. His 132 was not his biggest innings for Cambs., but it was probably his best, as far the greater part of the time he was playing more for his side than for himself. He went in when four wickets were down for 64. Too much praise cannot be accorded to O. W. Boccock for his splendid play. Very little is known of Boccock's capabilities in Cambridgeshire, as people frequently ask why he has been picked. To those I would say "You should have seen him at St. Albans, as many of us have seen him before." He doesn't get large scores, and the subsequent natural popularity, but he always plays with his head, and more often than not gets into double figures. He played the game on Friday when he kept his end up during the time Reid was scoring, whilst on Saturday when runs were required, he hit out, and scored 37 as quickly as he was slow over his 32 the previous day.

Collier was getting "down in the dumps" as he was called, but he came unstruck on Saturday, when he gave us 62 of his best. May he go on from strength to strength. After he and Whybro (a very promising young player and a fine fielder) had given a good start, the batting only once failed, when Reid was unable to score, and the result was that the match only leaves behind it happy memories—memories that should do much for county cricket in the future. We have recovered from a bad start, and with the team we now have there should be no turning back.

HERTS COUNTY CRICKET WEEK.

HERTS v. CAMBRIDGESHIRE.

The Cricket Week at Clarence Park, St. Albans, was brought to a conclusion on Friday and Saturday by a Minor Counties' Championship match, Herts v. Cambs, when, although the game was virtually drawn, the visitors were the winners on the first innings. For this result Herts had to thank the poor support they accorded in the field to excellent bowling, an unfortunate accident to Coleman, and some brilliant batting in the Cambridgeshire first innings by L. J. Reid, who, a few years ago, was skipper of the Aldenham School XI. Compared with the team which defeated Norfolk so easily earlier in the week, Herts had two changes, G. G. Dumbelton and E. H. Cuthbertson replacing W. Bentley and H. M. Lemonie. On a perfect wicket, Cambs batted first, and three wickets fell cheaply enough, but upon Reid and H. C. Tebbutt becoming associated, a stand was made. Accompanied by a series of hitters, Reid played a steady and stylish innings, selecting with rare judgment the balls to hit. Marsh juggled with his bowlers for a long time, and Shelford eventually went on to dismiss Reid with 132 standing to his credit, and quickly finished off the innings, the excellent total of 322 having been compiled. The Herts bowlers trundled with good judgment and dogged perseverance, but much of their good work was nullified by atrocious fielding. It must be stated, however, that Reid gave only one possible chance (in the slips); his hits included fourteen 4's and seven 3's. Upon Herts going in to bat, the first wicket (J. O. Anderson's) fell at 21, but such a stand did the Rev. F. R. Bonsey and C. H. Titchmarsh make that a hundred runs had been added before another wicket was taken. After a careful start, the rate of scoring became remarkable, Bonsey's long reach enabling him to go out to loose balls and send them to the boundary with great force, and the score rose by leaps and bounds until, with 137 on the books, the rev. gentleman was clean bowled when opening his shoulders to a ball from Coulson. Of the 137 runs compiled in an hour and ten minutes he had been responsible for 82. Of this number, 56 were composed of hits for 4, and 21 of hits for 3. After Bonsey's departure, however, a rot set in. Titchmarsh found no one to keep him company, and at the drawing of stumps for the day six wickets were down for 177, the Harpenden crack being not out 63, and H. F. Sanders not out 0. Before lunch on Saturday, Titchmarsh, Sanders, and Coulson offered some resistance to the bowling, and 88 were added before the innings closed. In the Cambridgeshire second innings Herts were weakened by a mishap in the field to Coleman, and Cambridgeshire, assisted by more poor fielding, totalled 281 for the loss of nine wickets, at which point they declared. Bearing the brunt of the bowling, Burton came out with a good analysis. With a draw in sight, Herts went in again, and compiled 153 for the loss of three wickets, Titchmarsh giving another meritorious display. His innings of 74 included a number of beautiful strokes to leg. During the week the total runs scored was 2,876, which speaks well for the quality of the wickets.

For the home side, there were 2 fours and 2 fours respectively in Titchmarsh's two innings of 89 and 74. Bonsey's 82 contained 13 fours.
