DEVON v. BERKSHIRE

DEVONIANS LEAD ON THE FIRST DOINGS.

Devon commenced their 5th week in the Essex County Championship at the County Ground, Exeter, yesterday, in brilliant weather. Berkshire played the same side as that which defeated Cornwall at Truro on Thursday, and Devon played Aston for the first time this season. On a perfect wicket the visitors batted first, and G. M. Bennett and Sheworth made a fine beginning for them, both playing forcing cricket. The wicket was carried to 22 before the amateur played on from Wrotham. Four wickets fell quickly, the side being out for 28 runs. After lunch the Berkshire batsmen started fairly briskly, and the innings closed for 112 runs. Devon's start was not a very auspicious one, for as J. F. Shalley maintained a delivery from Lockhart and was promptly stopped by Todd. Major Gerrard faced the ball better, but F. H. Carroll and W. F. Hart made a very fine stand for the third wicket. The pair added 101 before Hart was again bowled by Lockhart. Carroll continued to play superb cricket, looking with perfect ease and freedom all round the wicket. His long strokes were beautifully timed, and he drove with tremendous power. He reached his century with a boundary of 100, and ten runs later he was caught at square leg for a brilliant 120. His innings totalled 120 runs with his departure, and that of Bennett, who was run out when E. Light and Davies were the only two who afterwards made anything of a show, and the innings was closed for 253. Bennett held the runners at the start of the second innings, for Bennett was clearly taken behind the wicket with Aston's second delivery. When the score stood at 28 Bennett was taken by the wicket-keeper after he had made 53, and when stump was driven for the day the score stood at 26 for two wickets. Score—

WROTHAMWORTHMAN DEFEATED.

Wrothamworthman, having by Lockhart and Bisher brought about Devon's downfall at Truro, have secured their second innings, which they had carried to 25 for the loss of two wickets on Friday, and clearly by vigorous hitting on Sheworth's part, whom 100 included in boundary hits, the wicket, unusually speedily 22, leaving Devon 22 to get to win. The object of obtaining the run was more than slight. At 12 Bennett was sent back, and soon 20 was telegraphed Carroll was dismissed, as was Hart immediately after. Carroll and Bennett had the total to 50, but then the latter was nearly stopped, a run which held Light without any addition. Only five runs had been added when Carroll fell a victim to one of Lockhart's deliveries, and Shalley followed him in the position a run later. Christies and Woodford helped the procession along, but Davies and Aston made some ground with a show, which showed in a splendid manner, however, for the United Services got, just in front of a delivery from Lockhart, thus bringing the game to an end with 111 runs scored, and leaving Berkshire victorious by 141. BERKS' TRIUMPH.

A CLEVER PERFORMANCE.

Three victories in their first three away engagements is an excellent start for Berkshire, and reminds one of their triumphal progress last season. Twelve months ago Berkshire lost their first fixture, but won all their other engagements and so secured the Minor Counties' Championship for the Southern Counties. The royal county is even stronger this year (despite the absence of Capt. L. P. Collins), for it has the services of J. B. Lockhart, the Cambridge University "googly" bowler, and on the true wickets which prevail his puzzling bowling has proved invaluable.

A FINE ACHIEVEMENT.

The victory of Berkshire over Devon at Exeter was the most meritorious thing the Royal county has done so far this season. Berkshire were on Friday dismissed for 172, their smallest score this season, and were led on the first innings by no fewer than 80 runs. To win after this by 141 runs is a magnificent achievement. Two Berkshire wickets fell before the deficit of 80 was wiped off, but happily Shoosmith was again in form and put together his second century for the county this season, hitting up 155. As he scored 125 against Bucks, his value to his side is already indicated, and following on his triumphs for Reading it is not too much to say that this has been his most successful season locally. Shoosmith's success is all the more praiseworthy because with the exception of A. P. Strange, who reached his fifty, he found no one to stay with him. The Berkshire total eventually reached 332, so that they were 232 ahead.

BOWLING SUCCESSES.

This was exactly the total of Devon's first innings, and the question was whether the home county would fail to do as well as in their first venture or would go one better. Happily for Berkshire, Belcher and Lockhart were in splendid form. The former was as "dead on" that he clean bowled four batsmen, having another caught, while Lockhart's googlies were very difficult to time. He had three batsmen stumped by Todd, one was caught and another lb.w., so that between them Belcher and Lockhart dismissed Devon for the small score of 111. There was a stand for the last wicket, or the score would have been much smaller. With five bowlers like Belcher, Lockhart, Hawksworth, Woodburn and Shoosmith, Berkshire are well off. Lockhart took 11 wickets in the match for 178—a "googly" bowler must not mind being hit—while Belcher had 8 for 32. Up to and including the Devon match, Lockhart has taken 18 wickets, Belcher 15 and Hawksworth 16.

After being 80 runs behind on the first innings against Devon at Exeter, Berkshire made a splendid recovery and won on Saturday afternoon by 141 runs. The chief factors in Berkshire's success were Shoosmith's fine score of 155 and the clever bowling of Belcher and Lockhart. Full score and analysis:—

MINOR COUNTIES CRICKET CHAMPIONSHIP.

BERKSHIRE'S BRILLIANT RECOVERY AGAINST DEVON.

Playing at Exeter on Friday and Saturday, Berkshire fairly excelled themselves by the wonderful manner in which they pulled the game round, when everything pointed to a comfortable victory for the home team. Berkshire's first innings realised 172 runs, Shoosmith being top scorer with 39. Thanks to a century effort by Carroll, Devon were able to make 252, thus gaining a lead of 80 runs on the first innings. Berkshire's second venture saw Shoosmith at his very best, and he was not dismissed until he had compiled a splendidly played 155. H. Brougham and A. Strange weighed in with half-century efforts, and a total of 132 resulted. Devon were thus set to get 252, exactly the total they obtained in the first innings. This they signally failed to do, for with G. Belcher and J. Lockhart at the top of their form the home team were tumbled out for 111 runs, leaving Berkshire comfortable victors by 141 runs. HIS week Arthur Fielder is accorded his benefit, and all followers of the game trust that it will provide an adequate recognition of all the good work that great player has performed for his county.

Fielder, as presumably most people are aware, is a Kent man by the strongest tie, having been born at Plaxtol just over thirty-three years ago. He appeared in one match for Kent in 1900, and again in 1902, but it was not until 1903 that he was given a good trial. Then he did so well, and created so good an impression by his willingness to undertake hard work and his ability to stand it that he was chosen to accompany the M.C.C.'s team to Australia at the end of the season. In sixteen

matches for Kent that year he obtained seventy wickets at a cost of 18.41 runs each, thereby giving promise of future greater excellence which was destined to be fulfilled.

Like Richardson, the greatest fast bowler of modern times, Fielder is a most willing worker. This is apparent from the fact that during the seasons of 1906 and 1907 alone he took as many as 358 wickets for less than 18 runs and a-quarter apiece. During the last two or three seasons the wickets have frequently been unsuited to his bowling, and he has been handicapped by leg injuries, but, these things notwithstanding, he credited himself with 286 victims during 1908, 1909 and 1910 at an average cost of less than twenty runs. These figures speak eloquently for his stamina and skill, but they convey little concerning his pluck and willingness, which have always been outstanding features of his cricket.

Fielder's name is associated with two of the most prominent

feats recorded in cricket history, in one owing to his bowling and in the other on account of his skill as a run-getter. At Lord's five years ago, when the Gentlemen and the Players met in their Centenary match, Fielder obtained all the ten wickets in the first innings of the former for 90 runs—a performance which is still unparalleled in the history of the match, which dates back to 1806. On the Stourbridge ground in 1909 the Kent fast bowler, whilst playing against Worcestershire, made his only three-figure score for his county in the shape of an innings of 112 not out. Woolley, at the other end, made 185 and together the pair put on as many as 235 for the last wicket—a partnership which still ranks as the largest of its kind in a match of note.
