FINE PLAY IN THE SURREY II. v. DEVONSHIRE MATCH.

Some capital cricket was witnessed on the Horley Cricket Ground on Wednesday and Thursday, when Surrey II. met Devonshire in the Minor Counties' Championship competition. An excellent wicket had been prepared, and Mr. E. Dewhurst, the hon. secretary of the Horley Cricket Club, was on the ground each day and was unremittent in his exertions to promote the comfort of the visiting teams. The weather was beautifully fine, and a fair number of spectators watched the interesting play, but the attendance was by no means so large as could have been desired.

Devonshire had the good fortune to win the toss, and Major L. Garratt and E. C. Hall made a splendid first wicket stand, and were not parted until Major Garratt had scored a vigorous 43. He was missed in the slip by Blackledge with his score at 21. Hall played splendid cricket. The partnership between E. Knight and Davis was a lively one, as in 41 minutes no less than 39 runs were put on, of which Davis contributed 25. The total eventually reached exactly 200. The Surrey team included C. W. F. Tufnell, E. F. Campbell, and D. G. Wigan, a trio of Etchings who made their debut for the county. Surrey made an indifferent start, losing C. W. F. Tufnell and Myers with only 23 runs on the board. Abel, however, batted splendidly and was not disposed of until he had scored 115 by means of brilliant all-round cricket. He was deservedly applauded on returning to the pavilion. At the close of play Surrey had lost six wickets for 200 runs.

Bright and attractive cricket was witnessed on the resumption on Thursday morning, and mainly owing to splendid play on the part of Wigan, Surrey passed their opponents' score by 24 runs. On the visitors going in to bat a second time they would have fared badly but for the splendid form displayed by E. C. Hall, who by scoring 26 runs was again the top scorer of his side. His display was quite the outstanding feature of the innings. Platt with six wickets for 22 runs, was the most successful bowler on the Surrey side. In the time that remained for play Dwyer scored 24 for the loss of four wickets and thus won on the first innings. Appended is the full score and analysis -

WESTERNERS LOSE FOURTH ON FIRST INNINGS.

Altogether the Devon innings realized 207, which left Surrey 100 runs to go, and the home county at the close of play had scored 118 for four wickets, both Campbell and Gilhpie giving excellent displays. PROGRAMME OF THE 1912 TOURS.

To the Editor of CRICKET.

SIR,—I suppose the M.C.C. Secretary or someone is already busy drawing up the programme of the tour of each of our visiting teams for next year. But I hope it is not too late to adjure him, through your columns, to be guided in his task by the excellent example of elder days. The 1884 Australian programme furnishes the best model he could have, though of course alterations would be necessary. That programme contained three games against England (as next year's is arranged to do), two each against the Gents., the Players, the North and the South, and one against the M.C.C.—twelve in all. With a return against the M.C.C. thrown in, and one fixture with each of the first-class counties and Universities, this would total only 31 in all, or 34 including the Tests between the two visiting teams, and presumably each list will contain not less than 35 or 36 items.

Why should some of the Counties (selected apparently at random) play the Colonials twice? If one game with Kent be thought sufficient, why on earth should it not be so with Essex or Gloucester? (In the days of the Graces it was different, of course.) The proposed extra matches would surely be of more interest than mere county games, except to the county specially concerned; and their gates might be pooled for the general benefit, as at present in the case of Tests and Test Trials.

The double programme to be arranged for next year increases the difficulty of adopting this suggestion, but, I submit, in a slight degree only. It needs but the "will" to open the "way."

THE INDIAN TEAM.

SIR,—When the question of a visit of an Indian team to England was considered some years ago, it was decided to include a few Ceylonese and three of them were in fact selected. It was a time when Indian Cricket was considerably stronger than now, for men like Mistri, Meherhomji, Baloo, Kanga, Pai, SessaChari, Shafkat Husain, JayaRam and Bulsara were in their prime, and men like Ali Hasan, Razzak, A. H. Mehta and D. D. Kanga, some of the finest cricketers produced by India, were available. It is a great pity that Ceylonese cricketers were not included, for there is no doubt that D. L. de Saram, F. de Saram, E. R. de Saram and C. Horan would have strengthened the combination quite a hundred per cent. The batting of the team, which has proved the weak spot so far, would have been much stronger, for the de Saram brothers are reputed to share with Mistri the honor of being the finest left-handed batsmen in the East. In C. Horan would have been found a left-hand bowler as good as Baloo, with all the advantages of youth.
