## Cricket.

### BEDS. v. SUFFOLK.

Bedfordshire auspiciously re-opened their Championship campaign on Wednesday and Thursday, with a nine wicket victory over Suffolk, the "dark horse" of the competition. Bedfordshire had only to beat Cambs. on Saturday to complete the round of all the counties they meet. The foundation of the magnificent win was laid firm and broad early on Wednesday afternoon, when Apthorp and Morcom, both of whom have developed remarkably as batsmen during the past two years, defied all changes while 78 were added, and the total was carried to 203. Apthorp's best hits were six 4's, and Morcom's eight 4's. Just before this, the popular skipper, by a capital 30, hit in his usual cheery manner, had brought about a recovery from a somewhat indifferent opening, while Holdstock had been batting with his old, sweet reserve, but occasionally getting in a pretty shot to the boundary. Each of the succeeding men added their quota, and just before tea time the venture closed for the handsome total of 323. Graham was still unbeaten. To his fine effort must be awarded premier place. Beginning rather shakily, a couple of nice boundaries brought him confidence, and afterwards he batted brilliantly, his crisp cutting being especially admired. Suffolk helded splendidly.

Suffolk spent the last hour of the day in scoring 15 and losing two valuable wickets. Resuming, Mustard was caught by Morcom off Grierson's first ball of the day, and Bennett fell to Grierson at 37. Raynor and Randell now made a brief stand, but wickets began to fall again regularly at 78, and the whole side were dismissed just before lunch for 113. Graham's fine bowling feat contributing largely to their rapid exit.

When, in their second venture, Suffolk had lost four good men and trus for 30 runs, an early termination seemed certain. But in cricket, one should never prophesy. Notwithstanding their success, it was inevitable that the home team should begin to feel the effects of a day's fielding in the glaring heat. For the next wicket, Watson and Bennett added 48 runs. Caution was writ large over all their tactics. Morcom and Grierson bowled well, but without luck. Occasionally, the batsmen opened their shoulders and steered a ball through an alert field to the boundary. At 70 Orr relieved Morcom, and at 78 broke up the partnership.

However, subsequent batsmen profited by a stand which had further taken the snap out of the attack, and it was not until Peel and Graham had had a turn, that Morcom, who had come back again, removed Mustard's leg stump. Then came another long stand, which placed in great peril Bedfordshire's chance of victory. For over an hour Lang and Raynor treated all the bowling alike, scoring freely all round the wicket. It was getting late in the afternoon, and time now began to figure as a factor to be reckoned with. 200 was sent up at 5.10, the arrears thus being all but wiped off, and only another hour's play possible. But three minutes later a clever low catch by Grierson at mid-off closed Lang's share of the proceedings. Soon arrears disappeared, and Titchmarsh looked likely to keep Raynor company for an indefinite period when another fine catch by Grierson, who had a long sprint to get to the ball, finished the new-comer's career at 229. The last wicket also brought its problem, which was solved just in time by a smart run out by a sub. for Holdstock, who had hurt himself in a fine attempt to bring off what would have been a magnificent catch off Orr's bowling. One could not help admiring the magnificent uphill fight Suffolk had made to retrieve their fortunes.

Rogers and Grierson were sent in to knock off the 33 wanted for victory, and they had

half an hour in which to do it. But half that time sufficed, although Rogers lost his wicket in the attempt to force the pace, and at six o'clock Bedfordshire had won their fifth consecutive victory of the season.

## County Cricket.

### Bedfordshire v. Suffolk.

#### Sound Batting by the Home County.

#### Nine Wickets' Victory.

The first meeting between Bedfordshire and Suffolk took place in Wardown Park, Luton, on Wednesday and Thursday. Bedfordshire had a strong side on duty, while the visitors were also fully represented. The attendance was not up to the average for holiday matches at Luton, the excessive heat no doubt keeping many away. A very good wicket had been prepared by Holdstock, the Luton pro., and everything pointed to a close game.

The splendid score made by the home county on Wednesday put them in a winning position, but with the wicket playing well it was indeed a surprise to see the sorry show Suffolk made in their first innings. Their second venture was a much better effort, their batting for the most part being of a high order. Especially was this the case with Raynor, who showed great ability as a batsman, and had he not been smartly run out by Wharmby might have made it awkward for Bedfordshire. The 33 runs required for victory were soon obtained, although Rogers lost his wicket in attempting to "slog." The Bedfordians are to be congratulated on their nine wickets' victory, and the five points thus gained will help them to keep at the head of the Minor Counties Competition.

#### WEDNESDAY'S PLAY.

The County skipper won the spin of the coin, and sent in B. L. Peel and Holdstock to the bowling of Penfold and K. Raynor. The pair played steadily for some time until at length the amateur was well taken in the slips by Titchmarsh (1 for 30). Rogers filled the vacancy, but after making five singles he was snapped up by Lang (2 for 39). Meanwhile Holdstock was playing a nice innings, and with Wharmby in the score rose to 66, before the last named took his departure, being badly run out. Holdstock contributed 43 to Bedfordshire's total in 1 1/2 hours, and Orr's 30 was another valuable effort. A grand stand was made by Apthorp and Morcom, and at the end of an hour and a quarter, when the former had totalled 50, he was loudly applauded. Four runs later, however, he was caught by Penfold (6 for 203). Graham made his first appearance in county cricket and opened with a couple of 4's, two singles, and four 3's. Morcom was also doing well, but playing very carefully. At 242 Morcom reached his half century, having taken nearly an hour and thirty-five minutes to complete the task, and he met with applause. Half a dozen runs later he was smartly run out, and his score of 59 included eight 4's, one 3, and three 2's. Leventhorpe followed, but never appeared at home, while Graham continued to hit hard. At 275 Leventhorpe was clean bowled for 11. Mander came next; he is a Lutonian who came into the county team for the first time, and at once got off the mark with a couple of singles to leg, which was followed by two 3's. At 286 an adjournment was made for tea.

Runs still continued to come, but not so freely as could be wished, the fielding being for the most part keen. Mander sent up the 300 with a high drive, and just afterwards Graham was applauded on reaching his 50. At 316 Mustard went on with his short break bowling, and with his fifth ball he got Mander caught at cover point. Grierson opened with a tremendous hit to the boundary, the next ball went for two, and the following one dislodged his leg stump. Graham had played delightful cricket for his 56, without giving a chance. The innings terminated at 5.30, the side having been batting 4 1/2 hours.

Watson and Wood opened the Suffolk venture to the deliveries of Morcom and Grierson. Wood was missed in the slips off Morcom's first ball. Both the bowlers were no-balled, and after the latter had been pulled up Watson was splendidly caught off him at extra slip by Graham. Runs came slowly and appeared just as difficult to get as when Beds. were batting. With but 10 runs on the board Rogers smartly took Wood at first slip. Two good batsmen were thus disposed of very cheaply. It was evident that the visiting batsmen had a difficulty in dealing with the bowling, for of Grierson's six overs four were maidens. A double change was effected, Wharmby and Orr going on for an over each, after which Grierson and Morcom resumed until time was called.

#### YESTERDAY'S PLAY.

With two wickets down for 15 Suffolk continued their innings yesterday, the over-night not outs. Randell and Mustard, facing the bowling of Morcom and Grierson. Without any addition to the score Mustard was caught by Morcom, off Grierson's first ball. Bennett defied the bowling for a time, but he too fell a victim to a catch, the county captain taking him at mid-off (4 for 37). Raynor and Randell made a stand, and took the total to 69. Lang proved fairly troublesome, but he was taken in Graham's first over. Titchmarsh, after making a couple of 2's, was snapped up by Orr, making the second victim to the Old Modernian out of seven balls delivered. Penfold and Trudgett did not give much trouble, but Waters played pluckily, and hit two 4's and a 2, and was undefeated at the close. Randell's innings was a very good one, but he lacked support. Out of his total of 41 he hit two 4's, three 3's, and four 2's. The innings yielded 113, a very poor total, considering the excellence of the pitch, but the bowling was at all times deadly.

Being tremendously in arrears, the visitors opened their second innings with Trudgett and Waters, just before lunch. The latter was soon taken in the slips, and with the score at 20 Randell was smartly run out. Watson batted excellently and tried hard to stem the tide of defeat, but with Trudgett stumped and Wood clean bowled the position seemed hopeless. Four wickets were down for 30, and then Bennett joined Watson. At 65 a double bowling change was tried, Orr and Peel displacing Grierson and Morcom. This had the effect of making a separation, for Bennett got in front of a straight one from Orr at 76, the batsman having put up a brave defence and scored 26 by good defence, the latter lashing out at a perfectly deuce, the latter lashing out at a perfectly straight ball, and thus brought about his own downfall. Mustard and Raynor next made a stand, and at 105 Graham took the ball from Peel, but this had not the effect of securing wickets, so Grierson was put on again, displacing the Old Modernian, and Morcom went on vice Orr. In Morcom's first over he displaced Mustard's leg ball. The partnership had proved a good one, as 40 runs had been added (7 for 126). Lang was the incomer, and he and Raynor made some very useful strokes. The latter sent up 150 with a 3 near the on boundary. At 166 Orr went on again, vice Morcom, and a few runs later Raynor passed his half century.

Following the tea interval runs continued to come, and although Morcom was put on again and Wharmby went at the other end it had not the desired effect—for Bedfordshire! At last patience was rewarded, for Lang was nicely caught at mid-off by Grierson, off Morcom's bowling. The partnership had realised 82 runs, and amongst Lang's strokes were eight 4's (8 for 208). Titchmarsh was the next man in, and a couple of runs later the visitors saved the innings' defeat. After making 11 runs he was well caught at long off by Grierson (9 for 229). Raynor had just reached 70 when he was smartly run out in endeavouring a short run. His had been a hard-fought innings, and his effort was well cheered.

Left with 33 to get to win and half an hour to play the task set Bedfordshire was not a great one. Grierson and Rogers opened their

account to the bowling of Penfold and Trudgett, and the pro. hit seven off the first over. The players seemed in a hurry to get the game and Rogers was both caught and stumped after he had made 13 (1 for 25). Leventhorpe filled the vacancy, and just before six o'clock the winning hit was obtained. Full score and analysis:—

SUFFOLK WELL BEATEN.

CAMBRIDGE OUTPLAYED.

Beginning on Thursday morning, Suffolk was presented with a very difficult task and one which at any time they never really gave any promise of accomplishing. It will be remembered that the Bedfordshire team had the day previously compiled the extremely creditable total of 323, and Suffolk at the close of play had only scored 15 runs with two wickets down. Not a single run had been added to the over-ought score when Mustard was caught off Grierson. Wickets fell at regular intervals. Towards the close of the innings, Graham, who had batted so well for the home team, took the ball and in just two overs, at a cost of only three runs, secured three wickets. Grierson also did well with the ball, capturing three wickets for only 18 runs. The innings realised only 113—210 less than Bedfordshire. Suffolk were sent to the wickets after 1 1/2 hours and succeeded in running up a total of 222. The wickets fell regularly and no brilliant performance was witnessed. Raynor's was the last man to fall, he being run out after a well-acted run. Bedfordshire were thus set to win. This they did in about half-an-hour with ten minutes to spare and a loss of only one wicket. Beds thus won by nine wickets, making their percentage to date 80.

**SUFFOLK v. BEDFORDSHIRE.**

The dulness of the cricket, combined with the exceptional heat, make it difficult to wax enthusiastic over Wednesday's play in the Suffolk and Bedfordshire match at Luton. The pitch in Wardown Park has this season proved a veritable paradise for batsmen, but the Bedfordshire batsmen seemed to be completely overawed by the knowledge of their unbeaten record; their display on a perfect pitch was unenterprising, and almost boring. They took an hour and forty minutes to score 100 runs, and altogether they were batting four hours and three-quarters for their total of 323. In spite of the weakening of their attack by the absence of P. W. Cobbold and J. F. Ireland, Suffolk did well up to lunch, when they had dismissed four batsmen for 112. The dismissal of Hoare (the captain) 13 runs later placed them in a distinctly favourable position, but Morcom and Aphorpe defied the bowling for an hour and a quarter, and put on 76. Morcom saw 45 more added before he was run out through a bad misunderstanding. The Suffolk captain managed the bowling at his command with considerable ability, and the attack was never collapsed, the rate of run-getting being nearly always slow; excellent fielding contributed materially to this; but there was one expensive mistake made by Titchmarsh dropping a hot catch in the slips from Morcom when he had made only 11.

F. P. Wood opened the Suffolk innings with A. K. Watson, and was missed in the slips first ball; the mistake was not a costly one, as he followed his colleague to the pavilion with only 10 on the board. W. Randall shaped very confidently in his first county game, and against remarkably good bowling played out time with D. Mustard. Suffolk scored even more slowly than their opponents, for forty minutes' batting realized only 15 runs. Score—

**SUFFOLK v. BEDFORDSHIRE.**

At Wardown Park, Luton, on Thursday, Suffolk sustained their second severe defeat, their week Bedfordshire winning by nine wickets ten minutes before time. The reverse was attributable to a peculiarly weak batting display in the first innings which resulted in Suffolk having to follow on, 210 in arrears. The one redeeming feature of the innings was the polished display of W. Randall, who, going in over-night with one wicket that for four runs, was still out at 12. Randall was batting an hour and three-quarters for his 43, and he was the most successful debut in county cricket. He batted with quiet confidence, and played faultless if slow cricket. No one else was at home with the bowling, and the morning cricket was even duller than Wednesday's, two hours and forty minutes producing less than a hundred runs.

Following on, Suffolk sent in Trudgett and Waters to tide over the luncheon interval, and matters continued to go badly. On the resumption Randall was badly run out after scoring a single, and four wickets were down for 30. Watson, Bennett, and Mustard improved the prospect by sprightly cricket, but it was when Raynor and Lang came together that the best cricket of the day was seen. Lang was missed before scoring, and profiting by this and two later escapes he assisted Raynor to carry the score from 126 to 208 before being caught at mid-off from a bad stroke; he played attractive forcing cricket for his 46, which included eight 4's and four 3's. His display was surpassed by that of Raynor, who made a valiant effort to save the side from defeat. The arrears were wiped off with two wickets in hand, and with fifty minutes to go, and there seemed hopes that Suffolk would after all avert the loss of five points. Titchmarsh, however, soon paid the penalty for attempting to accelerate the rate of scoring, and Raynor brought the innings to an abrupt close by running himself out. It was an unfortunate ending to a brilliant display. His 70 was compiled by splendid all-round hitting, and he gave not the semblance of a chance until after reaching 50, when Holdstock dropped a difficult catch in the slips. In his stay of nearly two hours he saw 156 added, and his seven 4's and five 3's.

With sportsmanship which was generally commented on Suffolk came out immediately, and left Bedfordshire half an hour to get 33. The task was accomplished for the loss of one wicket. Score—

Club Cricket.

In last Saturday's Yorkshire Council match at King's Cross between Skipton and King's Cross, the visitors lost their ninth wicket at 66 and defeat seemed almost certain. But the situation was saved in fine style by F. Cartman and H. Geldart, who remained together for an hour and three-quarters and put on 92. On the same afternoon, at Knypersley, in a North Staffordshire League match, G. Fenwick (65) and H. Ellerton (33 not out) added 89 for the last wicket of Leek v. Knypersley. The total of the innings was 224.

Playing for Royal Navy against Royal Artillery at Mt. Wise, Devonport, on 21st August, Lieut. Harrison and Assist.-Paymaster Condé-Williams scored 200 for the first wicket in 56 minutes, the share of the former, who was first to leave, being 152. Condé-Williams eventually made 103 in one hour 50 minutes. The Navy declared with a score of 391 for five wickets, made in less than two hours five minutes. The Artillery were subsequently dismissed for 171. Thus between 2.30 and 6.30, 562 runs were scored, an example of very brisk cricket. Another instance of fast scoring occurred in last Saturday's match between Stalybridge and Rochdale, Buckley making 105 not out in 39 minutes for the former.

C. Brown, the Kinnersley trainer, playing for the Worcester Hunt team against the North Hereford Hunt team on Aug. 21, made 52 and secured eight wickets, catching the two remaining men at slip. On Aug. 24, playing for Shrawley v. Worcester Lansdowne, he carried his bat through the innings of 185 for 103, made in ninety minutes.

In aid of University College Hospital and the Great Northern Central Hospital a charity match will be played at Tufnell Park ground on Thursday, Sept. 14, between a South of England XI. and a North London XV. The South of England XI. will be selected from the following:—P. A. Perrin, C. P. McGahey, G. L. Hebden, Hearne (J. T.), Hearne (J. W.), Trott, Murrell, Mignon, Freeman, Tremlin, Hayes, Huish, Reeves, Mead (W.), Young and Hendren.

Would-be match winners should take a leaf out of the book of Gunner Greest, of H.M.S. *Bacchante*, who pulled a game out of the fire in fine style at Gibraltar on August 18th. He was playing against H.M.S. *Duke of Edinburgh*, and when he went in, tenth man, 40 runs were wanted for victory. Instead of being down-hearted, he hit four 6's, two 4's and a single off consecutive balls, and before he was bowled for 35, by the tenth ball he received, had the pleasure of knowing that his side had won by one run. A handy man!

An instance of all ten wickets in an innings comes to hand from Lewes, where, on Thursday of last week, H. Nevill was the successful bowler on behalf of Herons Ghyll against Lewes Priory. His analysis was ten for 62 in a total of 141. Of the first five Priory batsmen three were stumped and the other two caught by H. Finney. This is by no means the first occasion on which a Herons Ghyll bowler's feat has been recorded in this journal, for in Vol. VII., p. 66—for April 19th, 1888—it was told how the club dismissed Nutley for 4 and 6 and won by an innings and 94 runs. In the first innings Walter Humphreys took eight wickets without being scored from and in the second Walter Quaife did the hat-trick.

Mr. G. A. Faulkner, who has been making a lot of runs and taking many wickets since his arrival in England, turned out for Woodbrook against Old Harrovians at Bray on the first two days of the week. He took four wickets and scored 107 and 82 not out.

Mr. Michael Falcon, of Harrow, Cambridge and Norfolk fame, had one of his most successful days as a bowler at East Dereham on August 24th. He was playing for M.C.C. and Ground against Mid-Norfolk and took seven wickets for three runs, the local side being all out for 11. The highest score from the bat was 4. Exactly seventy years ago, to the very month, the visit of the M.C.C. to Dereham had resulted in similar history being made. Norfolk on that occasion being the side to go down for 11. Old William Lillywhite obtained nine of the wickets, and the highest innings played for the side was, then as now, only 4. Thus does history repeat itself.

A HUNDRED YEARS AGO.

The return Cricket-match between the one arm and one leg pensioners of Greenwich Hospital, for 1,000 guineas, was finally decided at Montpelier Gardens on Monday last, in favour of the one-arm players, by 40 runs. The match was extremely well contested. The first and second innings were played on the 8th and 15th inst., and was postponed for the third day in consequence of the wet weather being so much to the disadvantage of the one-legged side, who several times lost or broke their timbers, which disaster befel three of them on Monday last.

In the second innings Hartley and John Tyldesley put on 125 for the second wicket in 80 minutes, and Lancashire's success, provided the weather permitted, was always assured.
