COUNTY CRICKET AT WINNINGTON.

CHESHIRE v. LINCOLNSHIRE.

VISITORS' FINE FIELDING.

The return match between Cheshire and Lincolnshire was commenced at Winnington, Northwich, on Wednesday, under ideal conditions. The beautiful ground with its spacious pavilion and artistic background of trees presented a picture worthy of an artist's brush on Wednesday morning as the players took up their positions on the greenward. Groundsman Bob Deaton, with the assistance of Mr. Montgomery, had spent a great deal of time in getting the ground into the best possible condition for playing purposes, and having regard to the dry season they are to be complimented upon the result of their efforts. However, there was not that attendence of spectators which one would have expected, and the fact cannot be impressed too strongly upon enthusiasts and supporters of the summer pastime that Winnington might be a good one when the fixtures are arranged for another season. One cannot attempt to explain why there should have been such a sparse attendance on Wednesday, which is the traditional holiday in the district, but it might be suggested to those in authority that if spectators were better provided for in the matter of being able to obtain refreshments, apart from liquids, there would be a greater inducement to people to attend.

It was intimated prior to the match that Cheshire would be without the services of Mason, who was indisposed, and at the eleventh hour a substitute had to be looked up. The worthy secretary (Mr. H. P. Rigby) afterwards stepped into the breach.

Cheshire had great hopes of avenging the heavy defeat inflicted by Lincolnshire a few weeks ago, and Capt. L. Hales won the toss, the Cheshire men had first knock. W. E. Jones and Montgomery led the attack, Day and J. N. Worman. The Winnington pro soon got to work, but his partner was never as his case, and at eight Worman disturbed his stumps. L. N. Jones joined Montgomery, but the latter did practically all the scoring, hitting both bowlers to the boundary. At 25 he was smartly caught behind the wicket by Rose, whose keeping was very keen throughout. Montgomery had played nice cricket for his score of 18, and his early dismissal was disastrous for Cheshire. In the next over Jones placed a ball from Day in the slips and essayed a foolish run, with the inevitable result. The Lincolnshire fielding must be candidly admitted to be superb, and it must have been heart-breaking to the batsmen that so many cleverly bowled were saved time after time. Runs came a little more freely when C. P. Woods and Smoker joined partnership, the pro hitting out in his usual vigorous style. Woods, however, gave a simple catch in the long field, which Cole took advantage of. At this stage the score board read 4-40-0. When Smoker was caught by Nevill ten runs later the outlook for Cheshire appeared anything but rosy, and it was left to A. S. Turner and the Rev. J. M. Swift to reverse the position. Batting steadily they gradually increased the score, and at 62 the Lincolnshire skipper took a double change in the attack. Riley and Broughton displacing Day and Worman. Soon afterwards Turner lifted a ball from Broughton into the adjoining bowling green, thus scoring the first six of the day. It was not until 91 was reached that the partnership was broken, Turner was judged a good delivery by Riley. Towards the luncheon interval the scoring was more rapid than at any period of the morning, Swift and Hales frequently finding the boundary. For the last over prior to the adjournment Bavin, the job bowler, was put on, and his tricky deliveries required some watching. The luncheon rest was 125 for six.

After lunch Day was again given charge of the ball, and of his first delivery the Cheshire captain, who had compiled 32, was neatly caught at point by Nevill. The remainder of the side failed to do anything of note. Swift's was the last wicket down, Day cleverly taking a hop return from the batsman. Swift had played pretty cricket for his contribution of 41, which constituted the best batting performance of the day. The total for the innings was 150.

It was 3.15 when W. E. Thompson and E. F. Long commenced batting for Lincolnshire, Smoker and L. N. Jones taking charge of the bowling. Thompson drove Smoker's first delivery for four, and then both batsmen began to hit out freely, until at 26 Montgomery was put on in place of Jones. Thompson had compiled 28 when Smoker found the way to his wicket. The partnership of 35 minutes duration had yielded 48 runs. Broughton batted well, and assisted Long to advance the total to 75, when the last-named batsmen failed at a tricky delivery from Smoker, who was bowling a good length, and consistently. The third wicket put on 42 runs, mainly through the steady batting of Broughton, who at one time gave promise of repeating the performance he made against Staffordshire. After scoring 18, Rose fell a victim to Smoker, and a run later Broughton was given out lbw by Umpire Myers. His score of 43 was the second best batting achievement of the day. The Cheshire fielding hardly came up to the Lincolnshire standard, and at times appeared rather lifeless, but of course the heat was not conducive to any great amount of bodily exertion. The fifth wicket fell at

140, Rigby capturing Riley at square leg. The sixth wicket saw the Cheshire total passed, but at 183 Smoker clean bowled Nevill, who was responsible for 35. The next three wickets only put on 13 runs, but Wells, Cole and Bavin made a determined stand, and when time was called Lincolnshire were 216 for nine.

Smoker was bowling as well at the finish as when he started, although he had sent down 33 overs, during the last six of which only 18 runs were scored. At the other end Jones, Montgomery and the Rev. J. M. Swift shared the attack.

CHESHIRE'S IMPROVEMENT (Thursday).

When the match was resumed to-day the sun again shone from a cloudless sky, but it rays were tempered by a delightful breeze which made the match pleasant for players and spectators alike. The wickets were pitched at 11 o'clock, and Lincolnshire commenced with 216 for nine wickets down. N. W. Wells, Cole, and A. Bavin resumed their innings, and were successful in putting on 43 runs, so that Lincolnshire had an advantage of 90 runs on the first innings. Cheshire opened their second innings somewhat disastrously, the first wicket falling at 17. W. E. Jones being clean bowled by Broughton for two. Montgomery and L. N. Jones improved matters considerably, both batting vigorously. Jones, particularly, played long a job bats so leg wonderfully, making boundary after boundary whilst he also made some very powerful drives to the off. Smoker was making a surk to square leg, when he was caught by Bavin. About this progress having put on 37 runs. About this progress was not continued, for without the total being altered Jones was caught by Rose off Riley's bowling, the telegraph board reading 74-54-5. H. P. Rigby took the vacant crease with the Rev. J. M. Swift as partner, but with the total at 84 Rigby was caught by Rose for 14, and two runs later the fifth wicket fell, the Rev. J. M. Swift only contributing 5. C. P. Woods (13) and A. S. Turner were at the wicket when the teams adjourned for lunch, the Cheshire total being 115 for the loss of five wickets.

As is so frequently the case, lunch did not have the effect of aiding the batsmen, who were called upon to do duty immediately. Turner had only knocked two boundaries and a single, when his legs were disturbed by Riley. Woods was joined by Smoker, and both batsmen hit out vigorously, the score rising rapidly. Woods opened his shoulders, and on one occasion had very hard lines in not earning a six, driving a ball high between the pavilion rails. He had made forty-four, which included seven fours, when he was very cleverly caught by Thompson in the slips, the fielder having to reach out for the ball with one hand as it was going away from him and being practically uncaught by the umpire. The score board now read 175-74-4. With L. Hales and Smoker batting the spectators saw some interesting cricket. Hales hit with rare vigour, and had the honour of making the only six of the side, driving a ball into the shrubberies. He had made 35, and the total had been brought to 226 for the loss of eight wickets, when he sent a ball out to Day, who hugged it tenderly. Smoker, who had been joined by R. P. Rigby, was batting stylishly, hitting all round the wicket. He had made the highest score of his side when he was caught by Wells. Cole, having contributed 61, and the board reading 229. R. P. Rigby was joined by J. D. Tipping, but with the first ball down the former was smartly caught by Rose for nine. Thus the Cheshire total was 266, which, together with the first innings, gave them a lead of 119.

Requiring 180 to win Thompson and Long opened the Lincolnshire second innings exactly at four o'clock. The telegraph board read 34-1-17 when Long returned to the pavilion, having been run out. Broughton next had his middle stump displaced by Smoker when he had only made five, and with the total at 10, Rose took up the wicket, but the total had only been increased by nine when he, too, was bowled by Smoker for six. Smoker was indeed fairly giving the batsmen "smoke," being most deadly in his bowling. At 67-4-2 he scattered Nevill's wickets in great style. Ten runs later Thompson was cleverly caught by Tipping off L. N. Jones' bowling for 34, whilst at 81 Smoker removed Day's wicket three or four yards down the pitch. Things were looking healthy for Cheshire, but time was creeping insidiously on. At 89 the seventh wicket fell, Bowman being run out for three. Riley and Worman were together and they gave a most surprising exhibition, bringing the total up to 144 when time expired. Riley had 32 to his credit, not out, and Worman 25 not out. It was an exciting finish to a good day's cricket. Detailed scores:

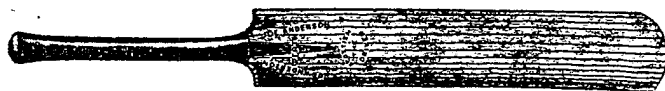
